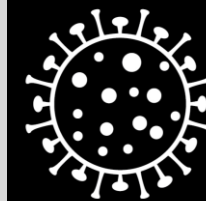

Case numbers remain very high. The number of people in hospital and ICU, and the number of admissions per day, increased very quickly to unprecedented levels. The numbers in hospital have now started to fall. The number of deaths per day is increasing.

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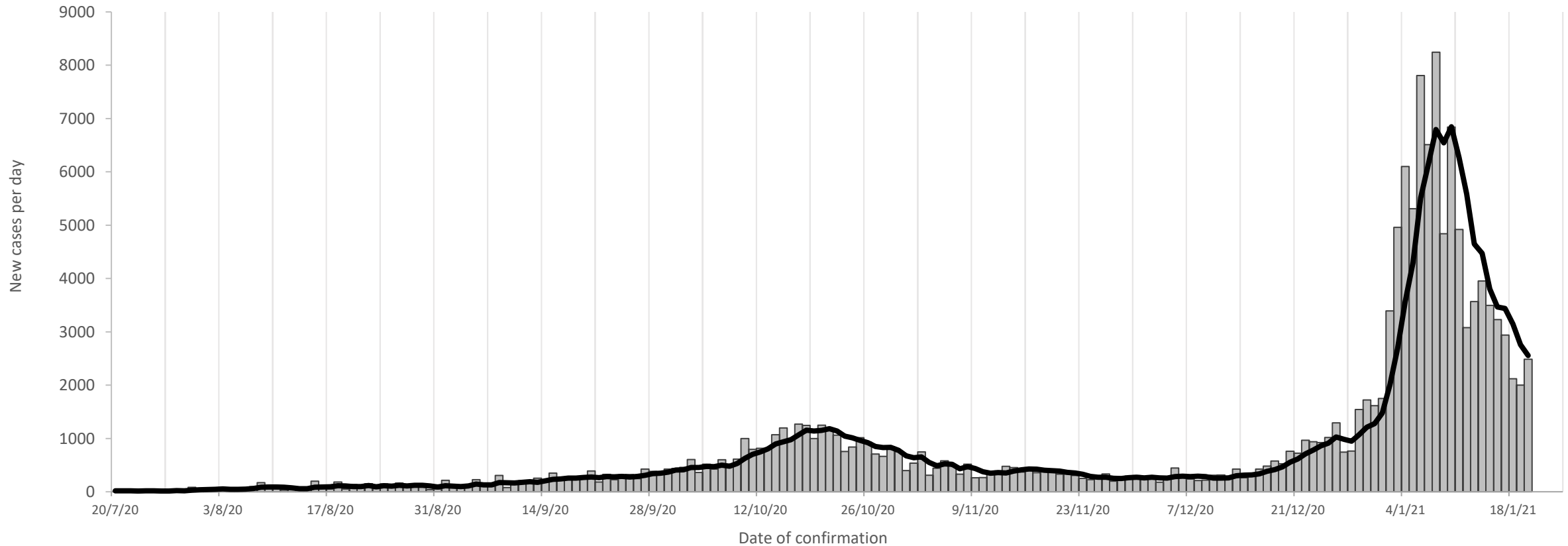

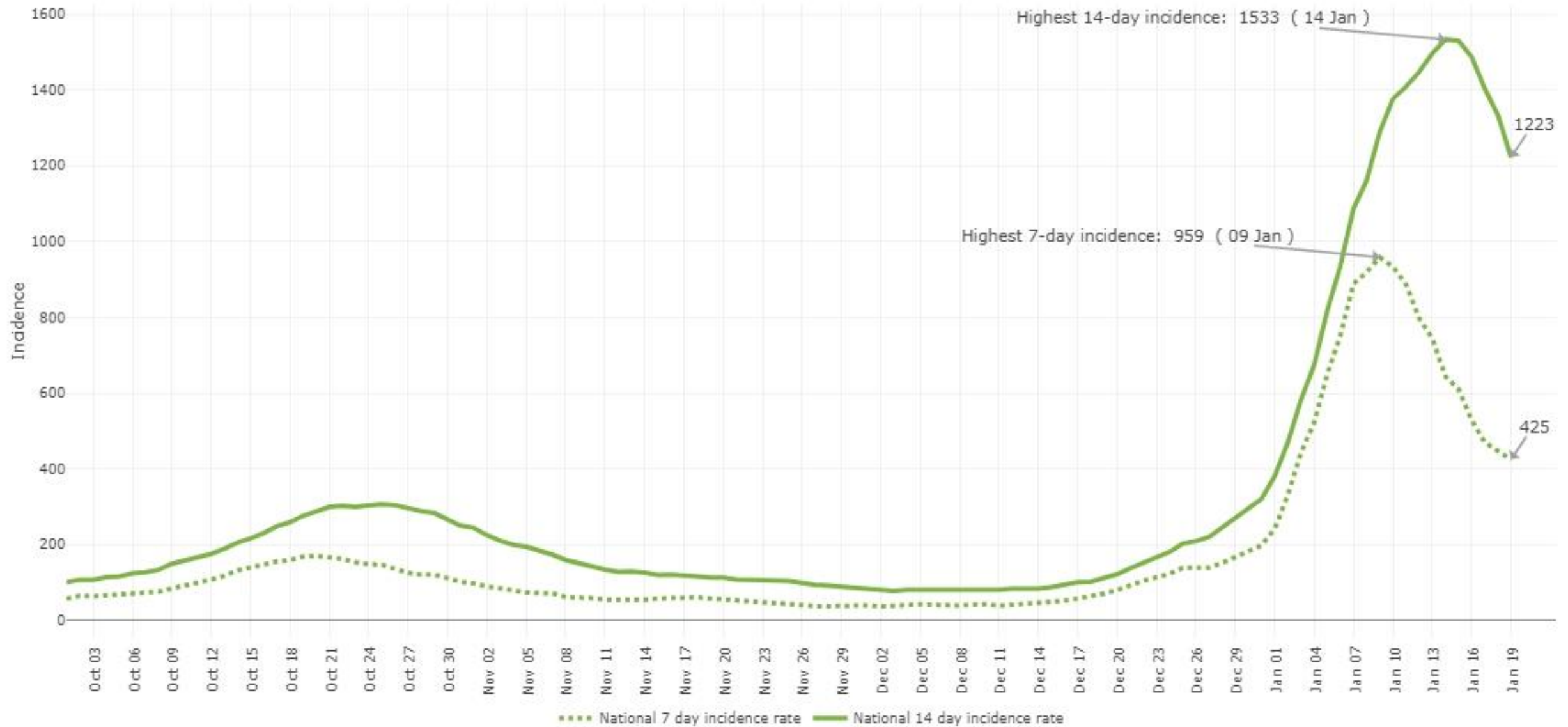

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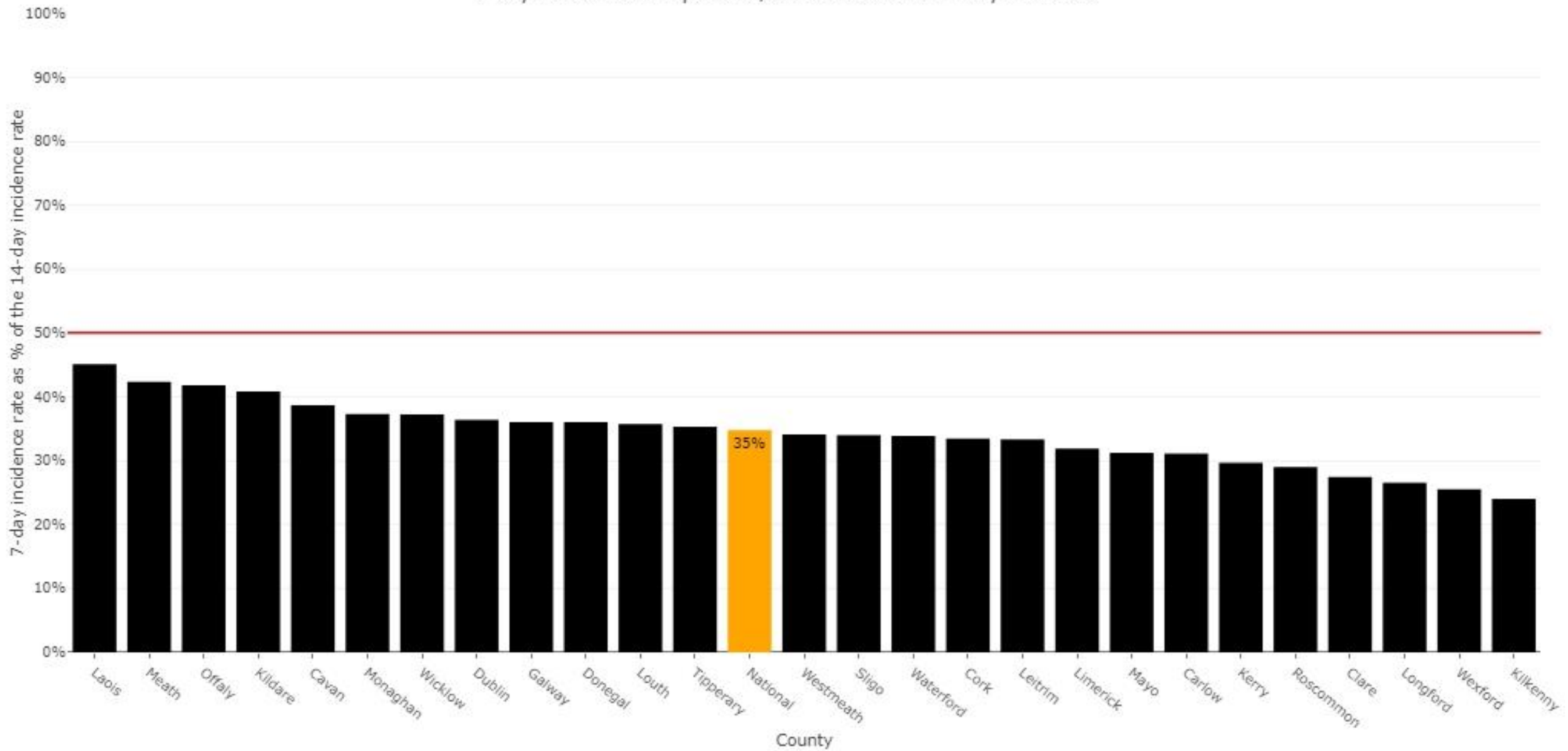

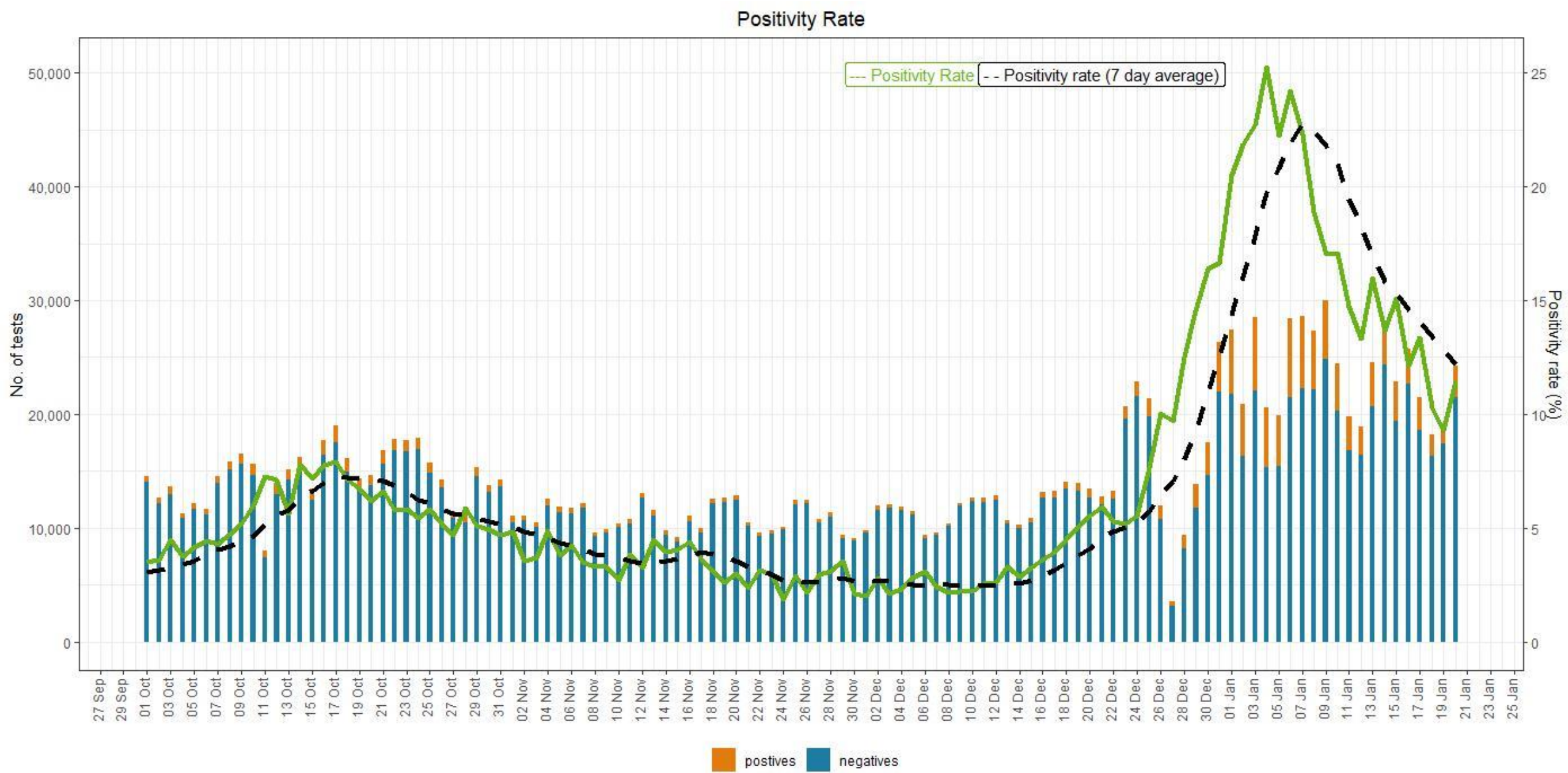
National 7 and 14 day Incidence rates

Recent trend in positivity rate



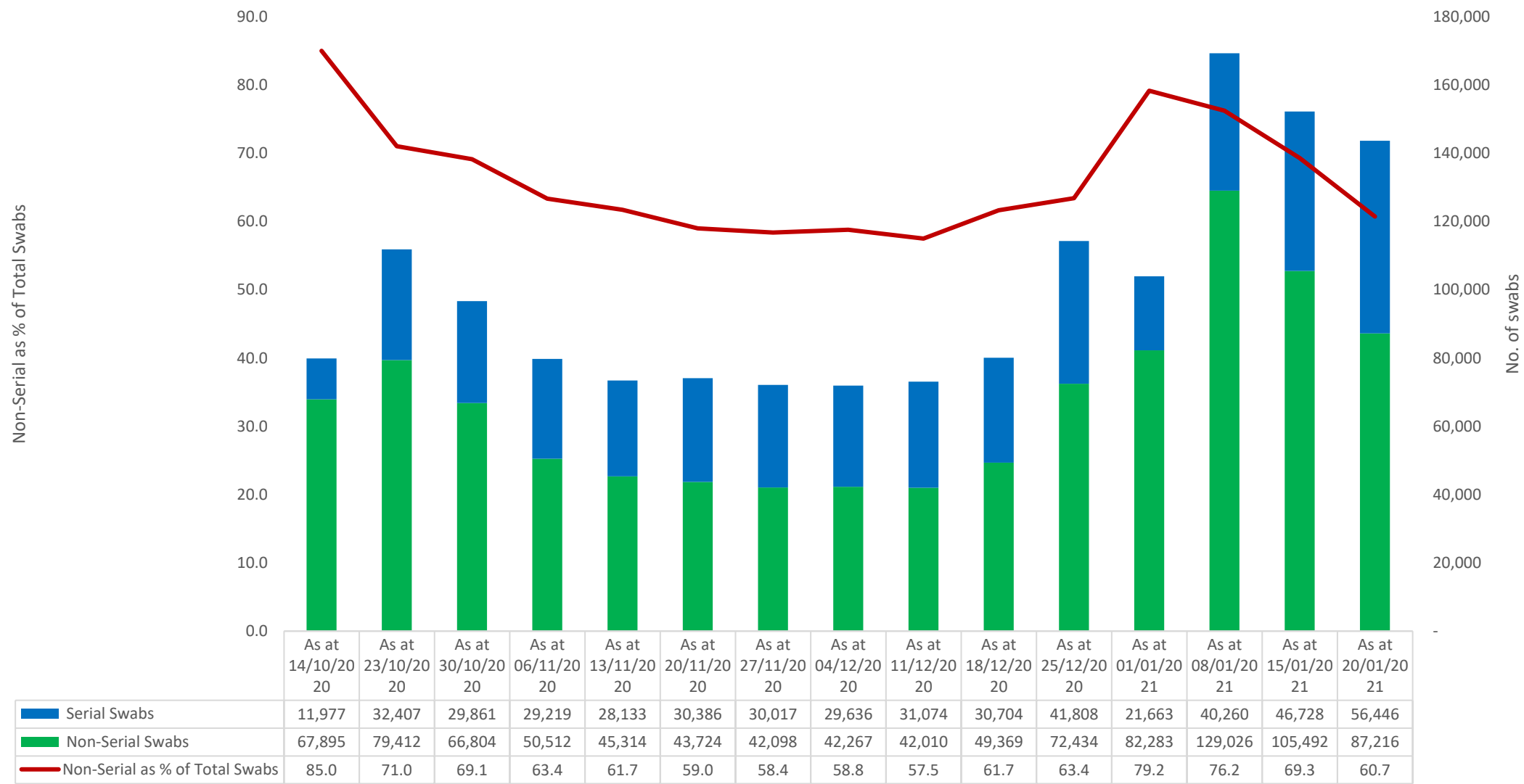

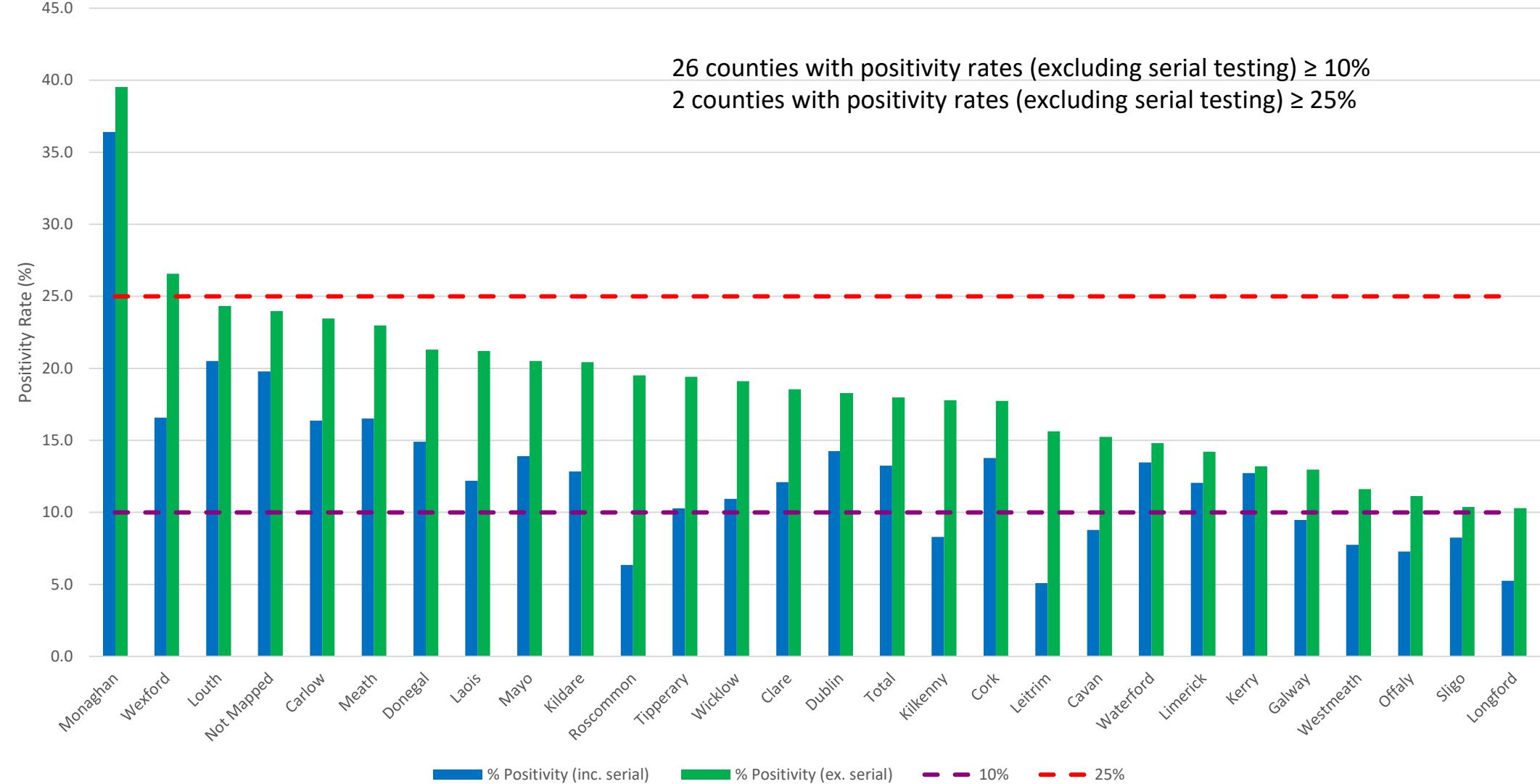
No. of Non-Serial and Serial Swabs in Past 7 Days and Non-Serial as a % of Total Swabs

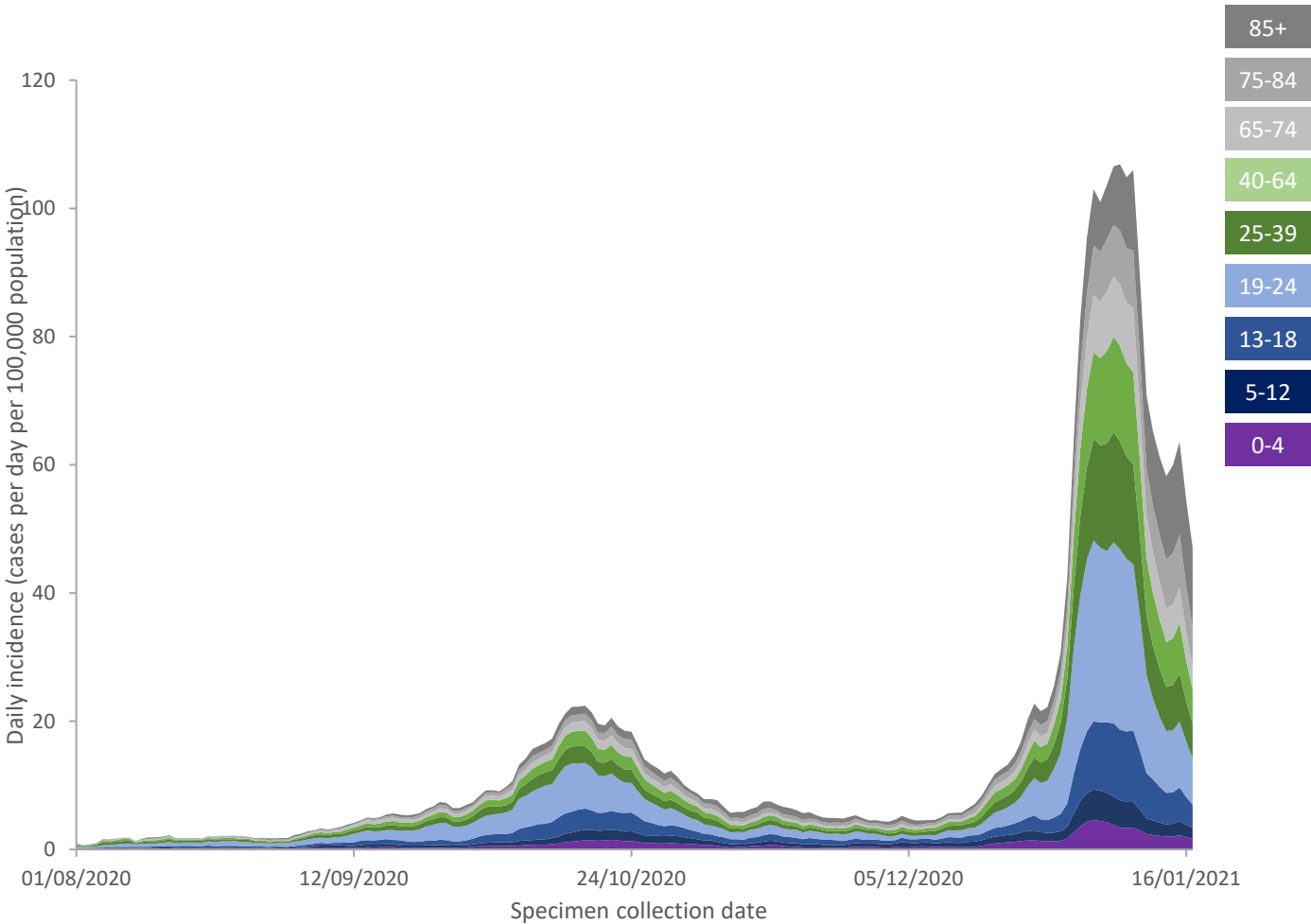

Incidence across different age groups (excluding HCW and LTRC)

Incidence is very high across all age groups in all age groups, with a very concerning level of disease in those aged 65 and older, and an exceptionally high incidence in those aged 85 and older. A number of cases in those aged 65 and older will be linked in the coming days to outbreaks in LTRC.



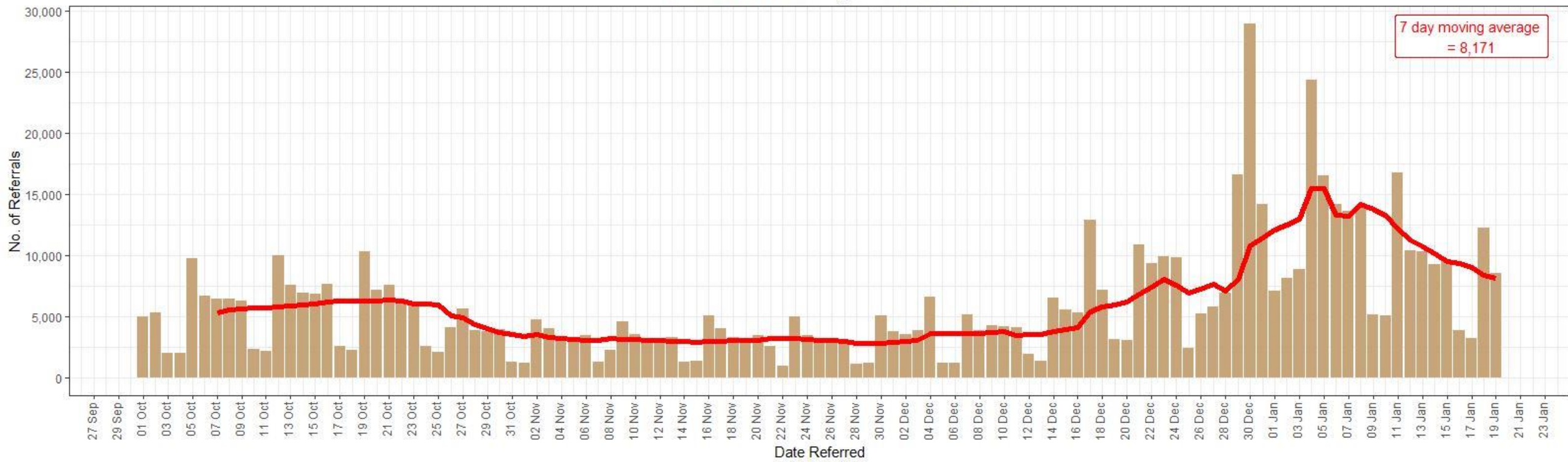

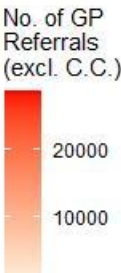

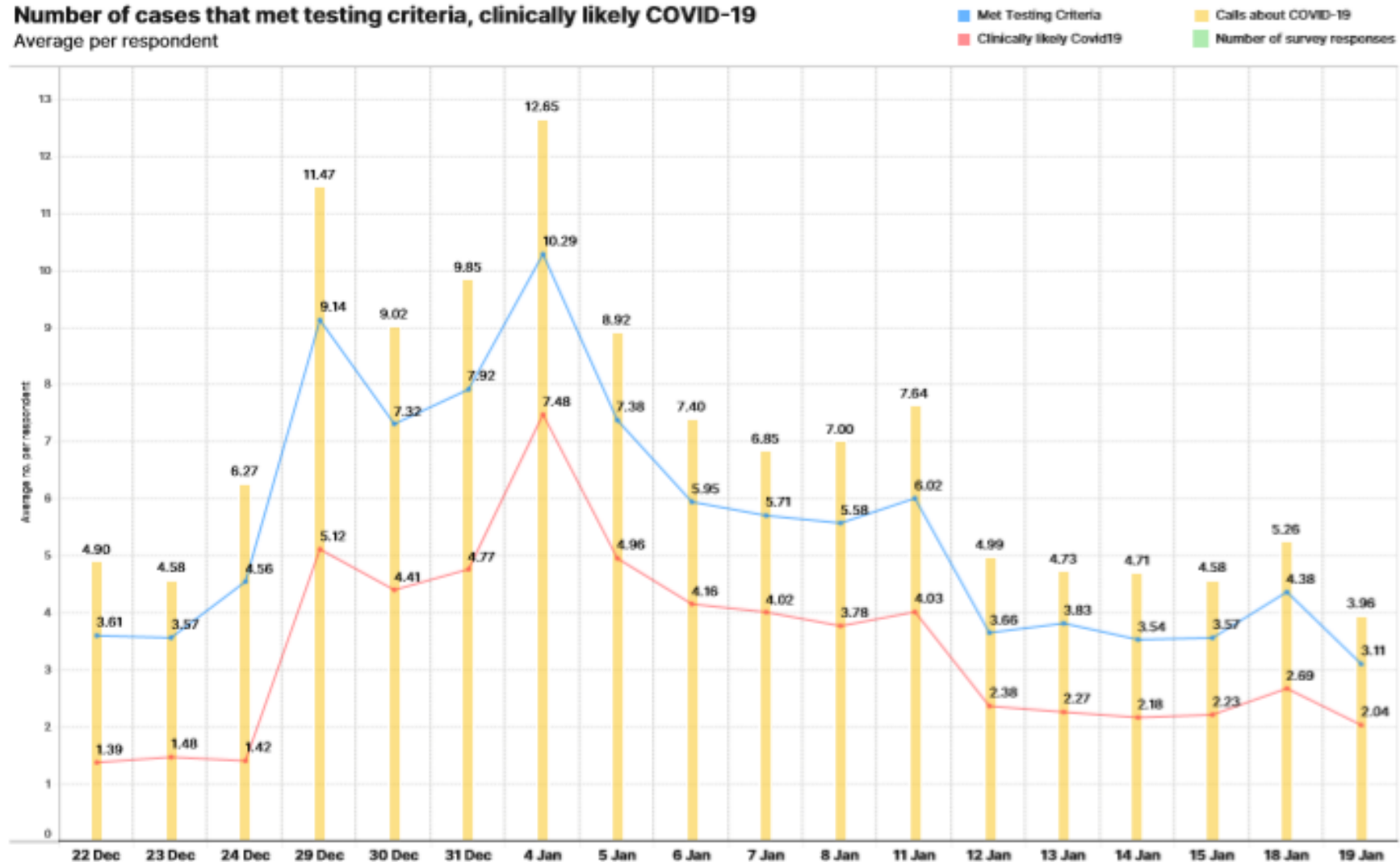

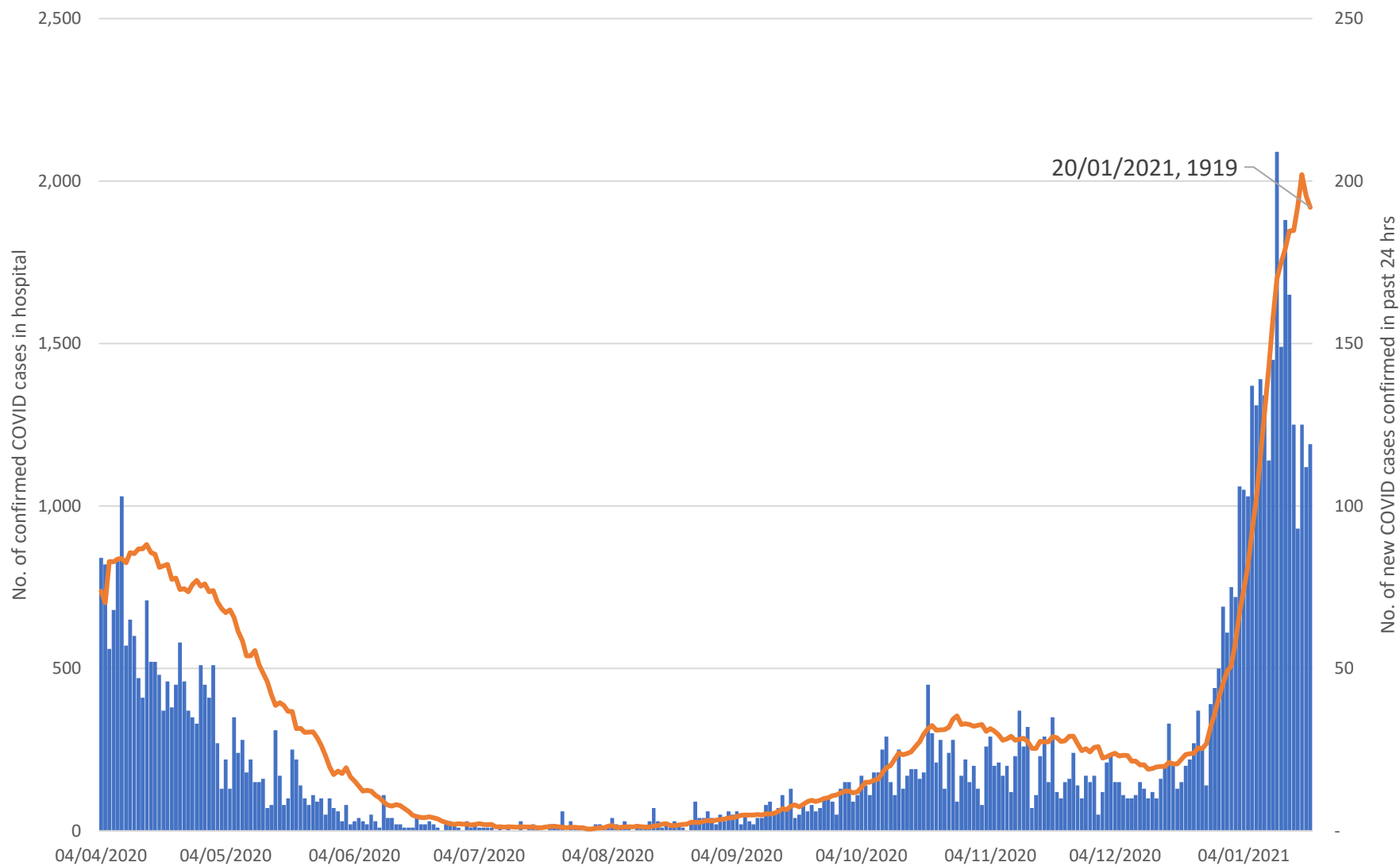

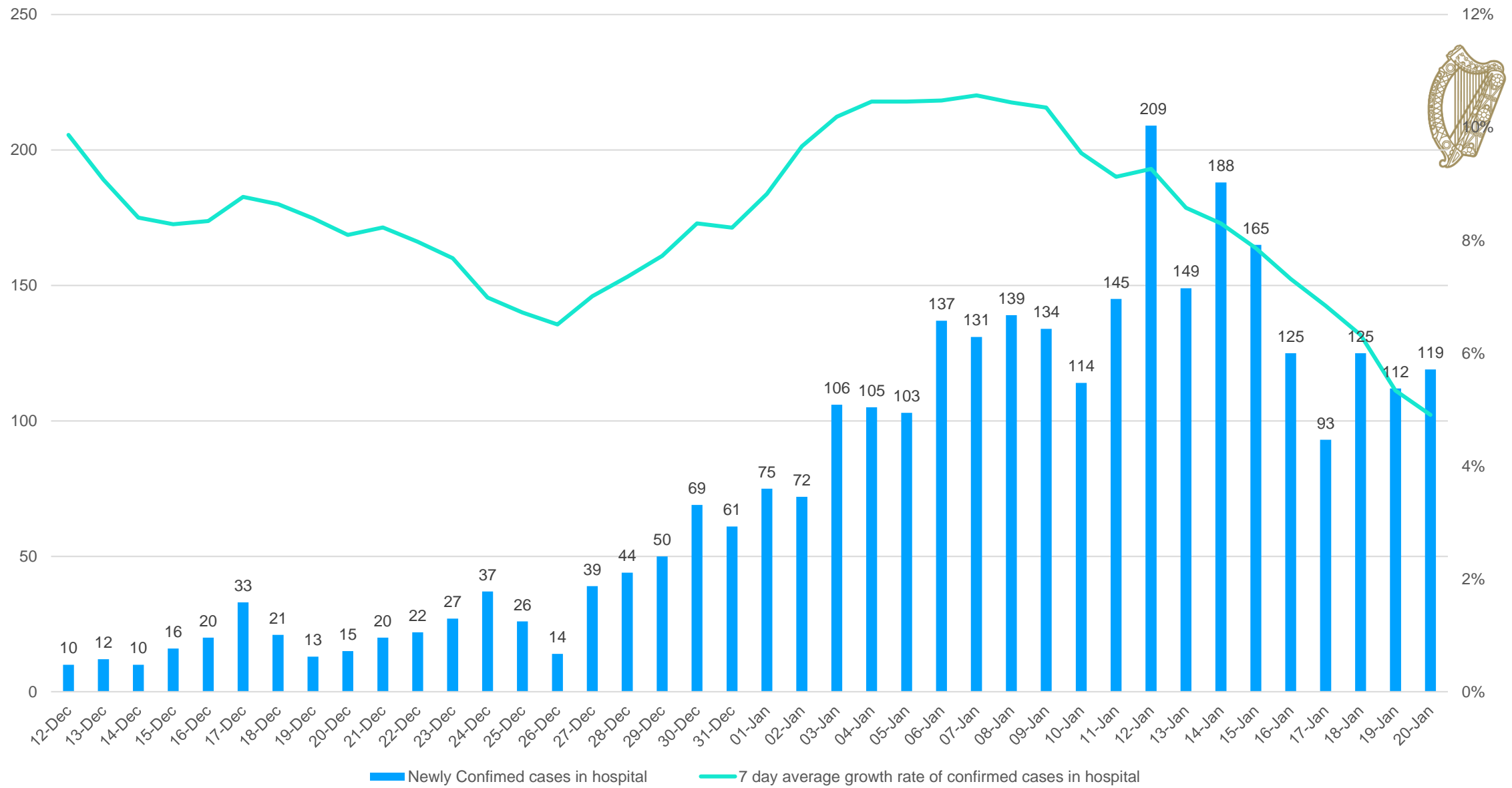

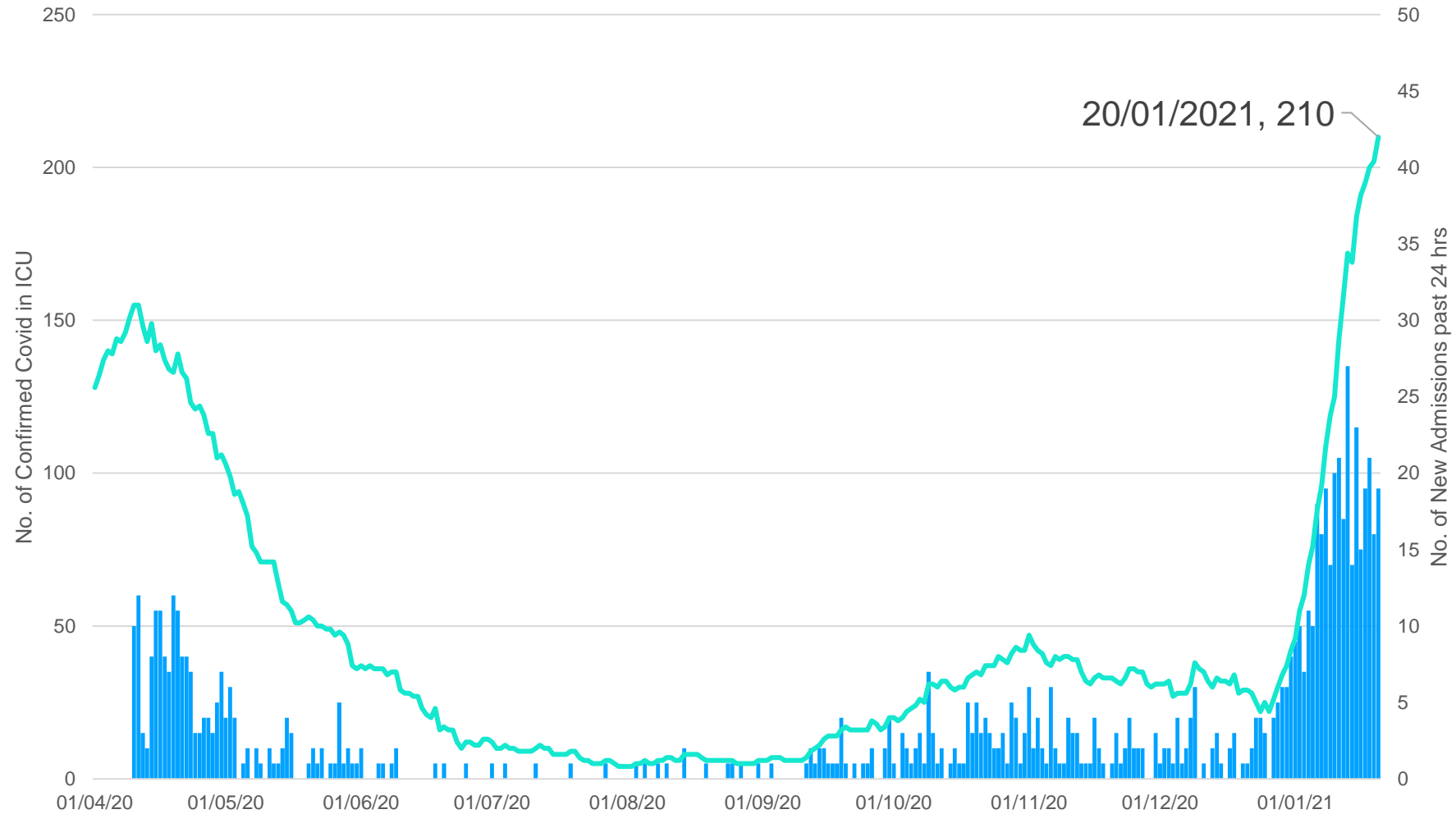
Total No. of Confirmed Covid Cases in Hospital at 8AM & No. of New Confirmed Covid Cases in Past 24 hrs



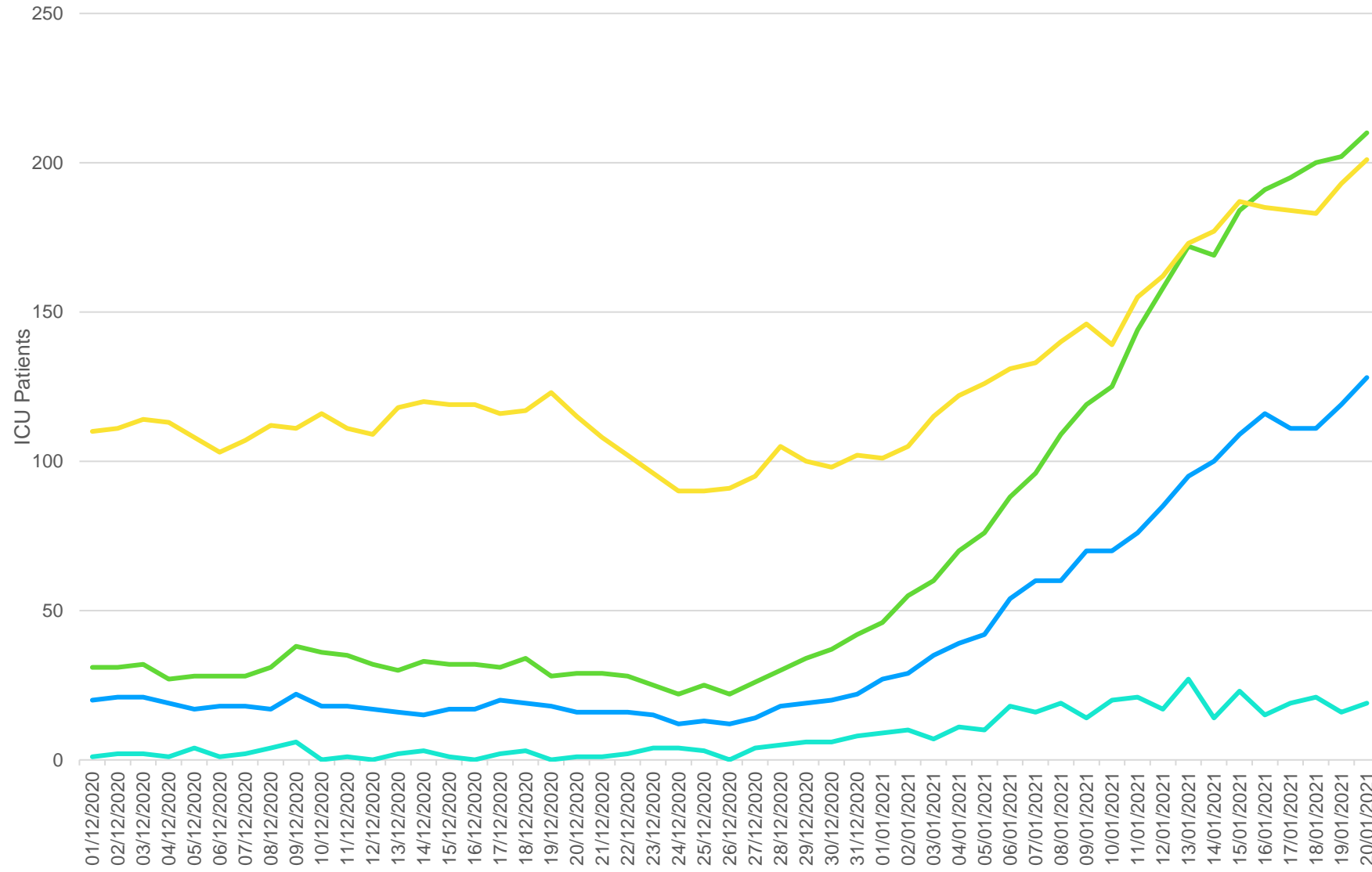
No. of newly confirmed cases in hospital and growth rate

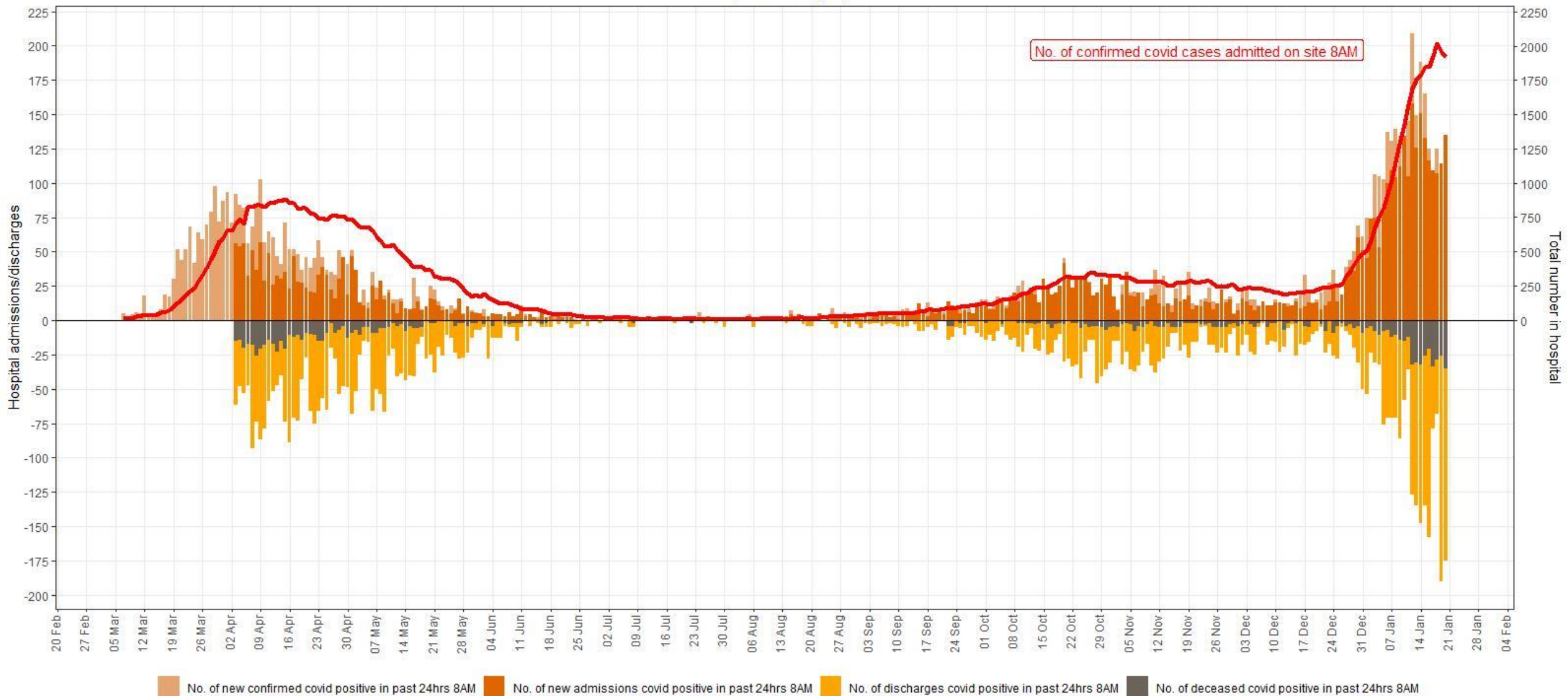


Total Ventilated in ICU, Total Covid in ICU, Covid Ventilated & New Covid Admissions

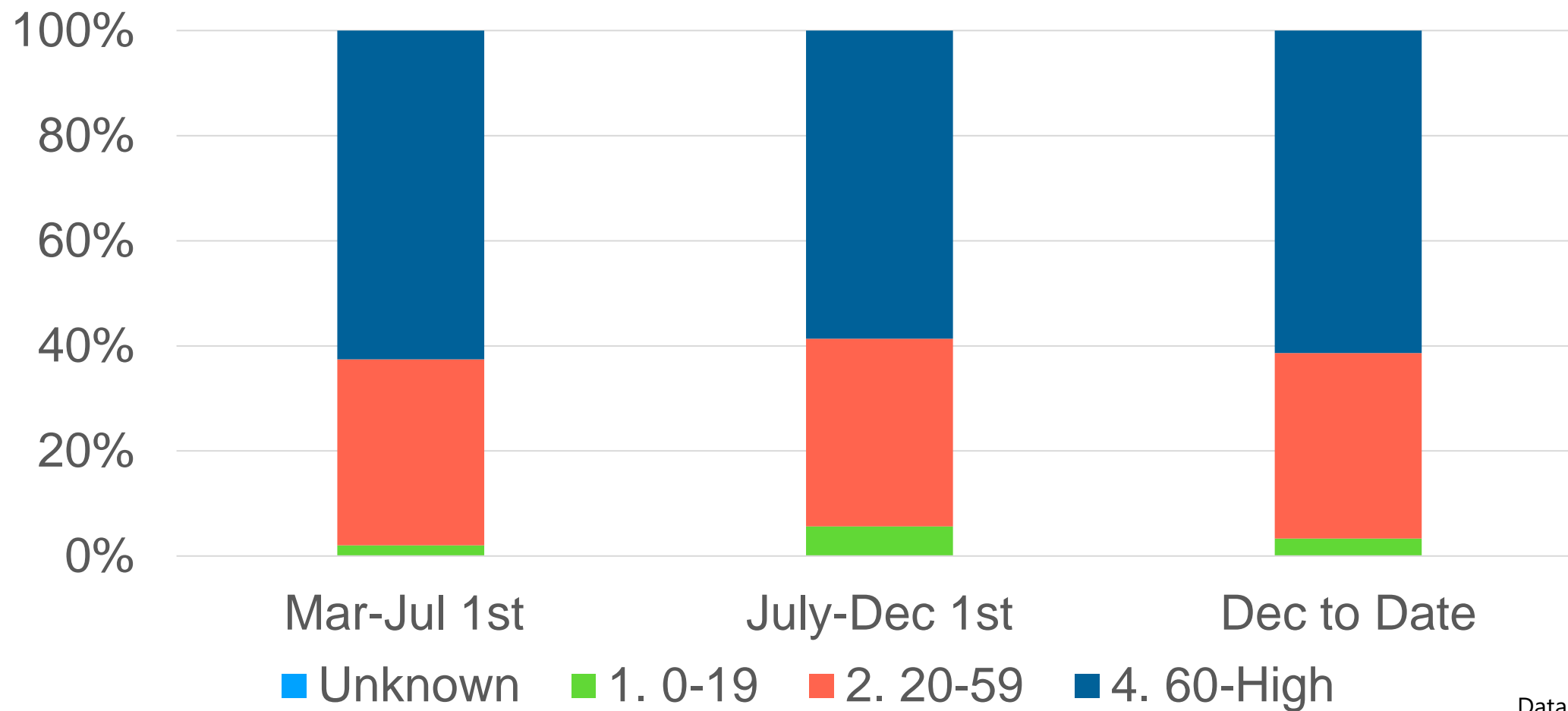

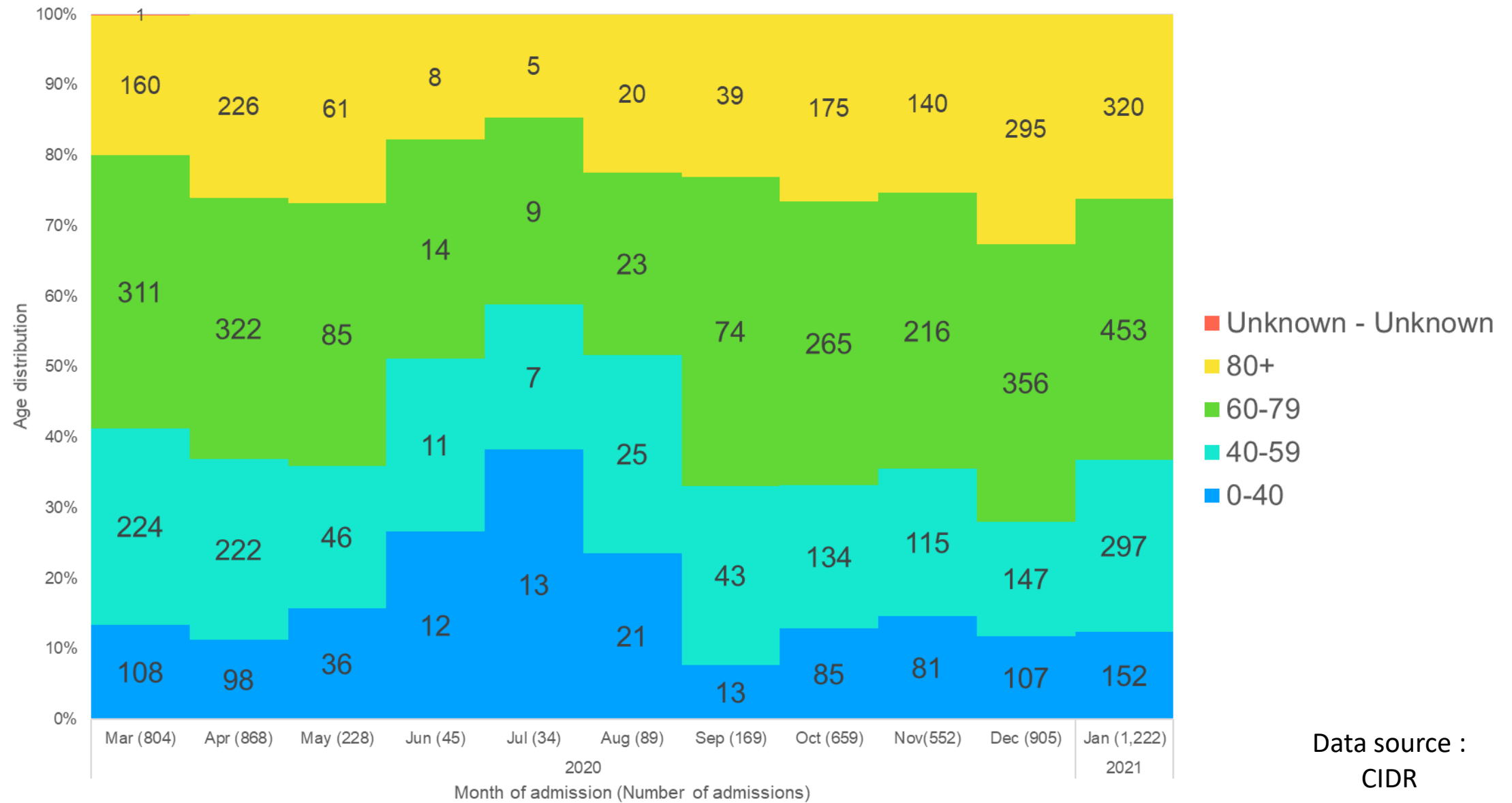


Hospitalised by Age group

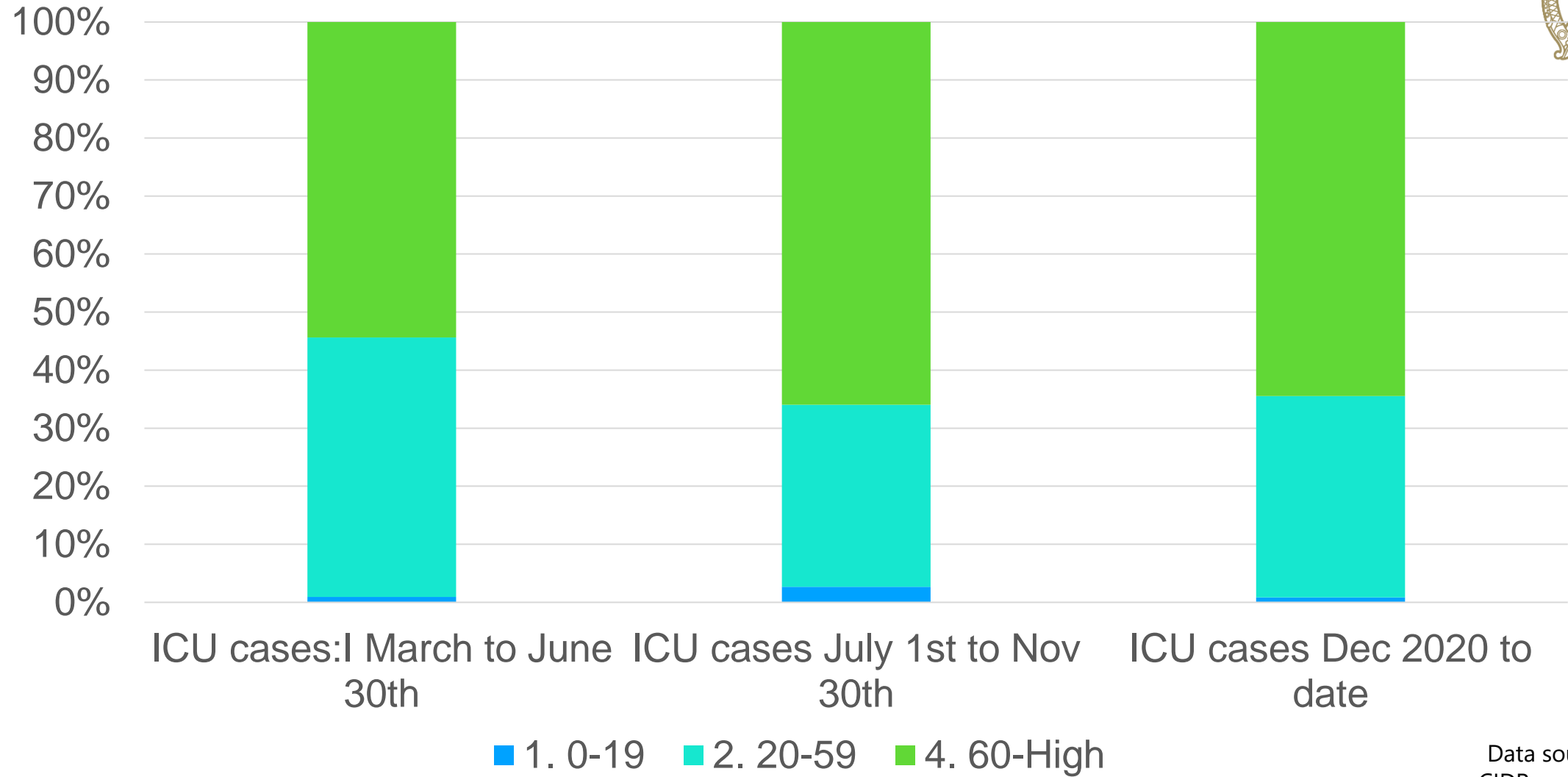

Age distribution of Hospital admissions

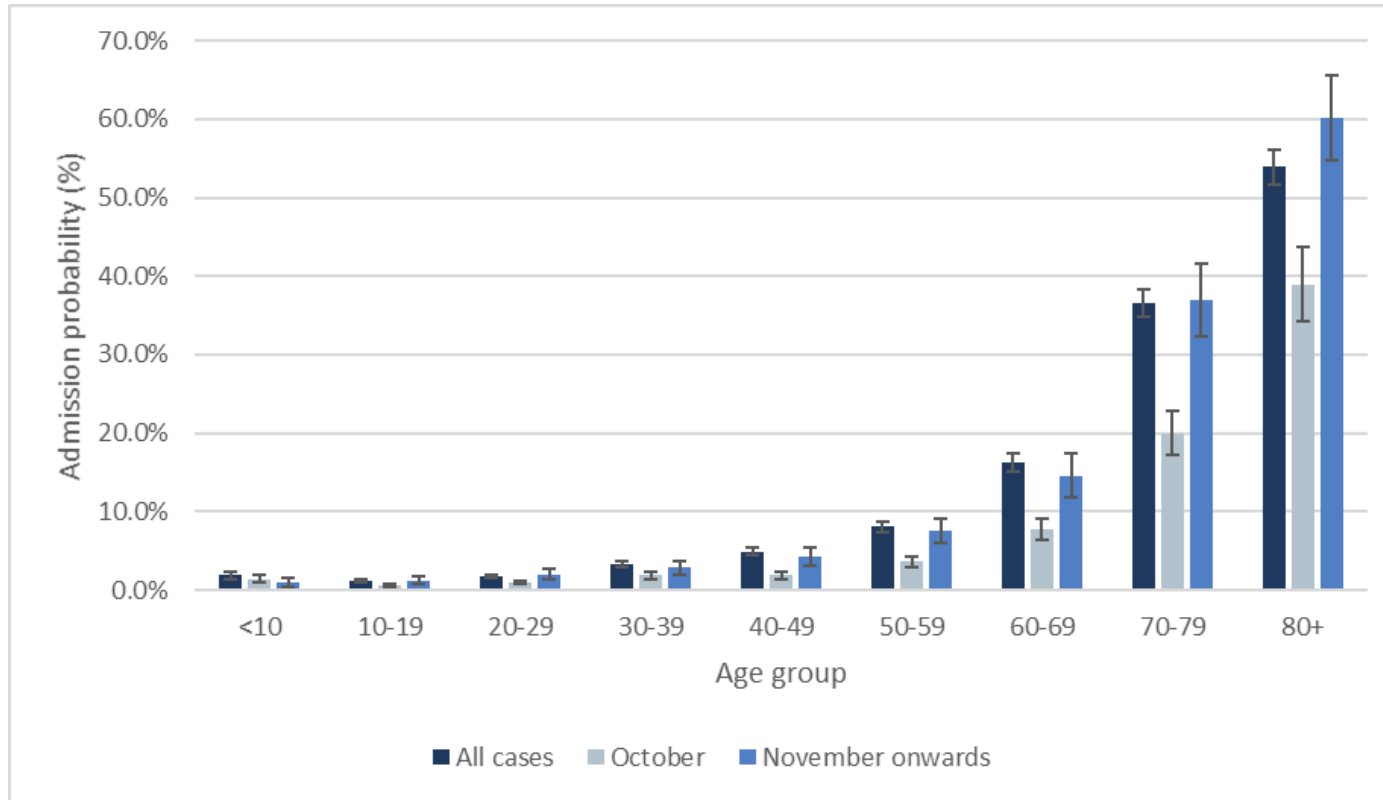


ICU case Age % by wave

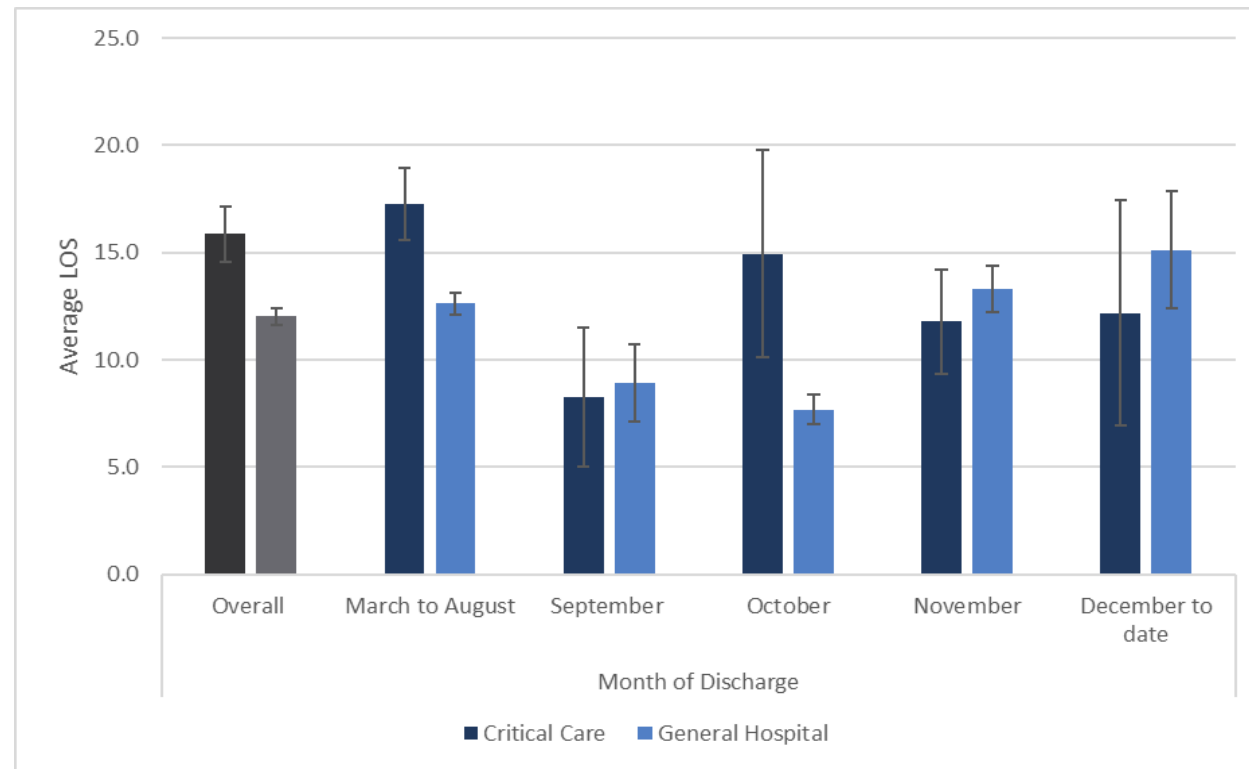

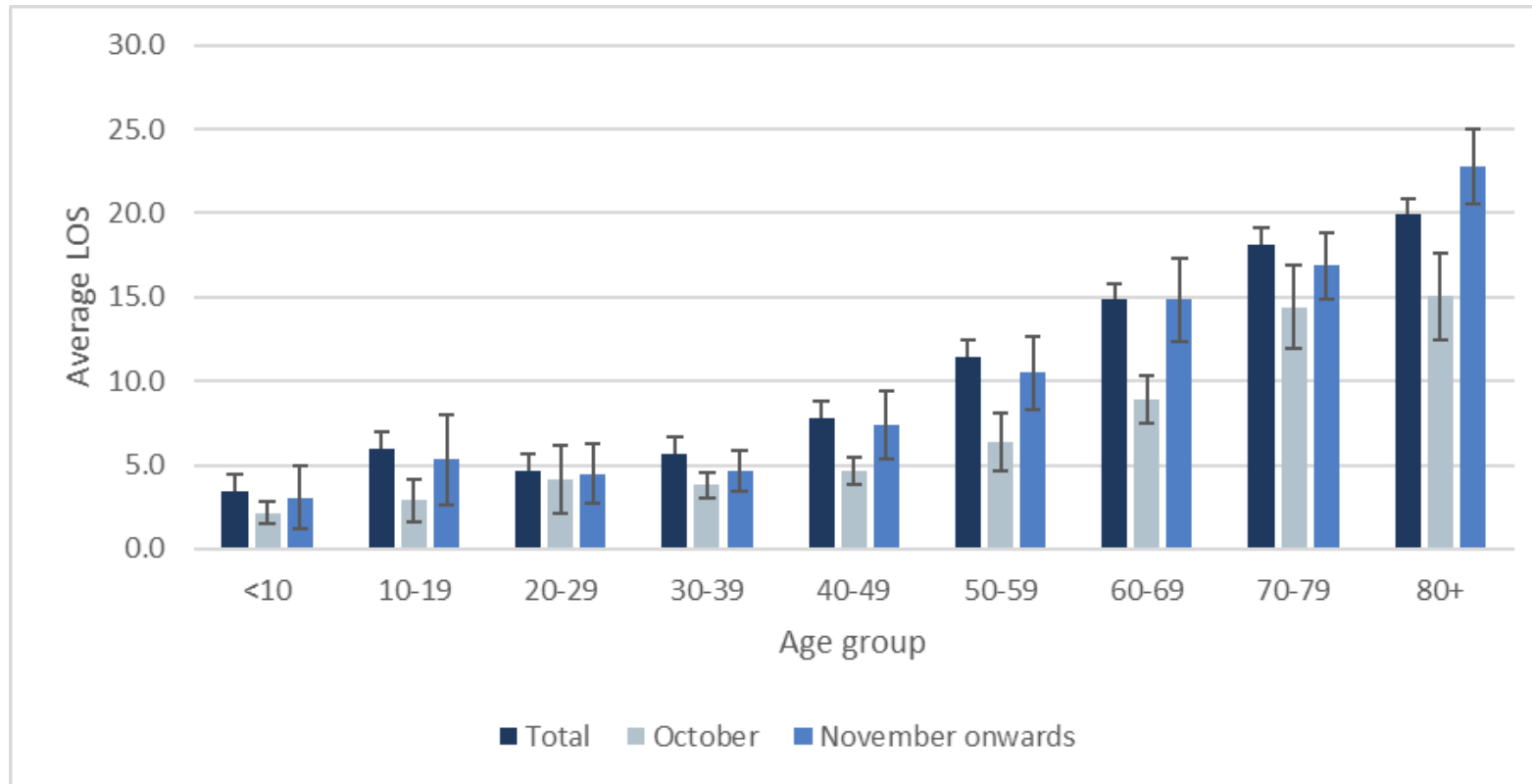

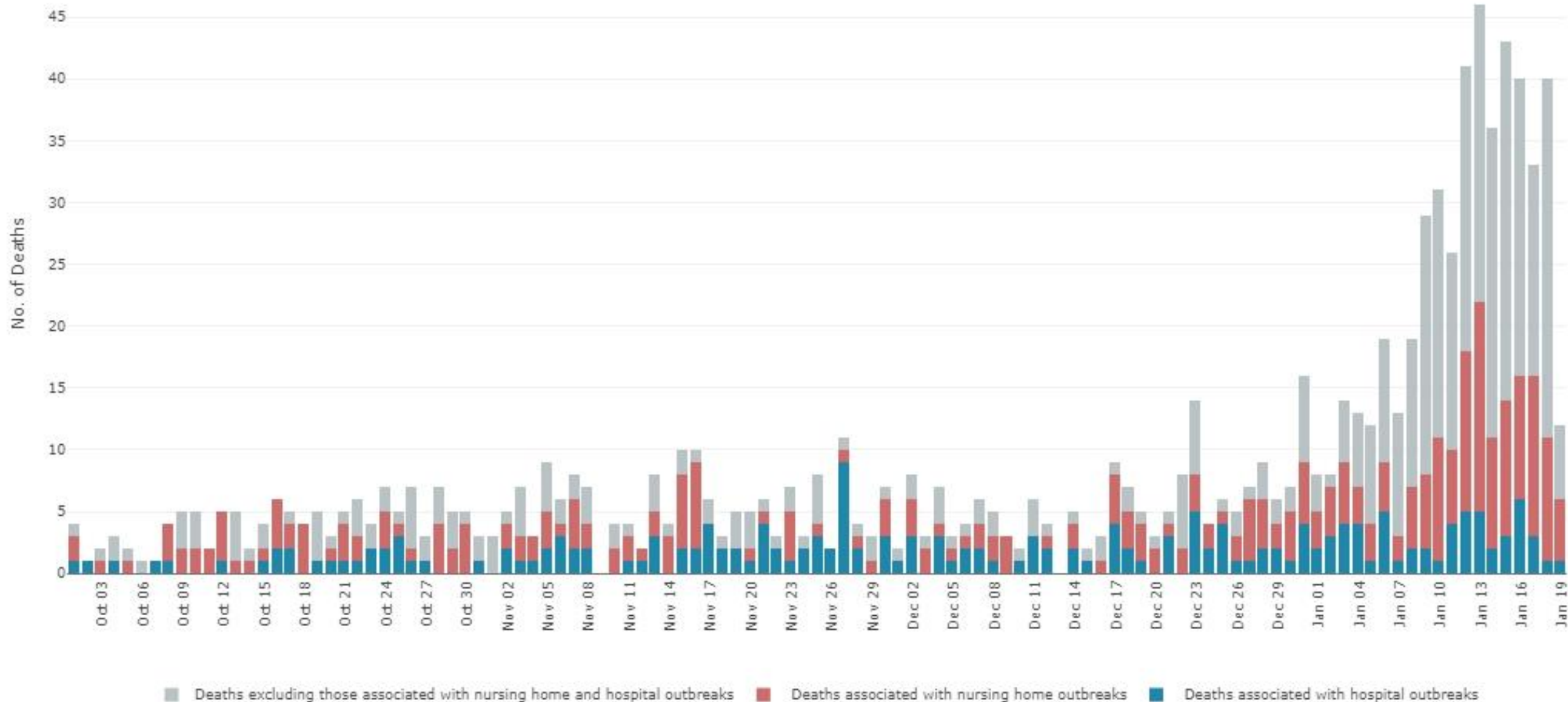

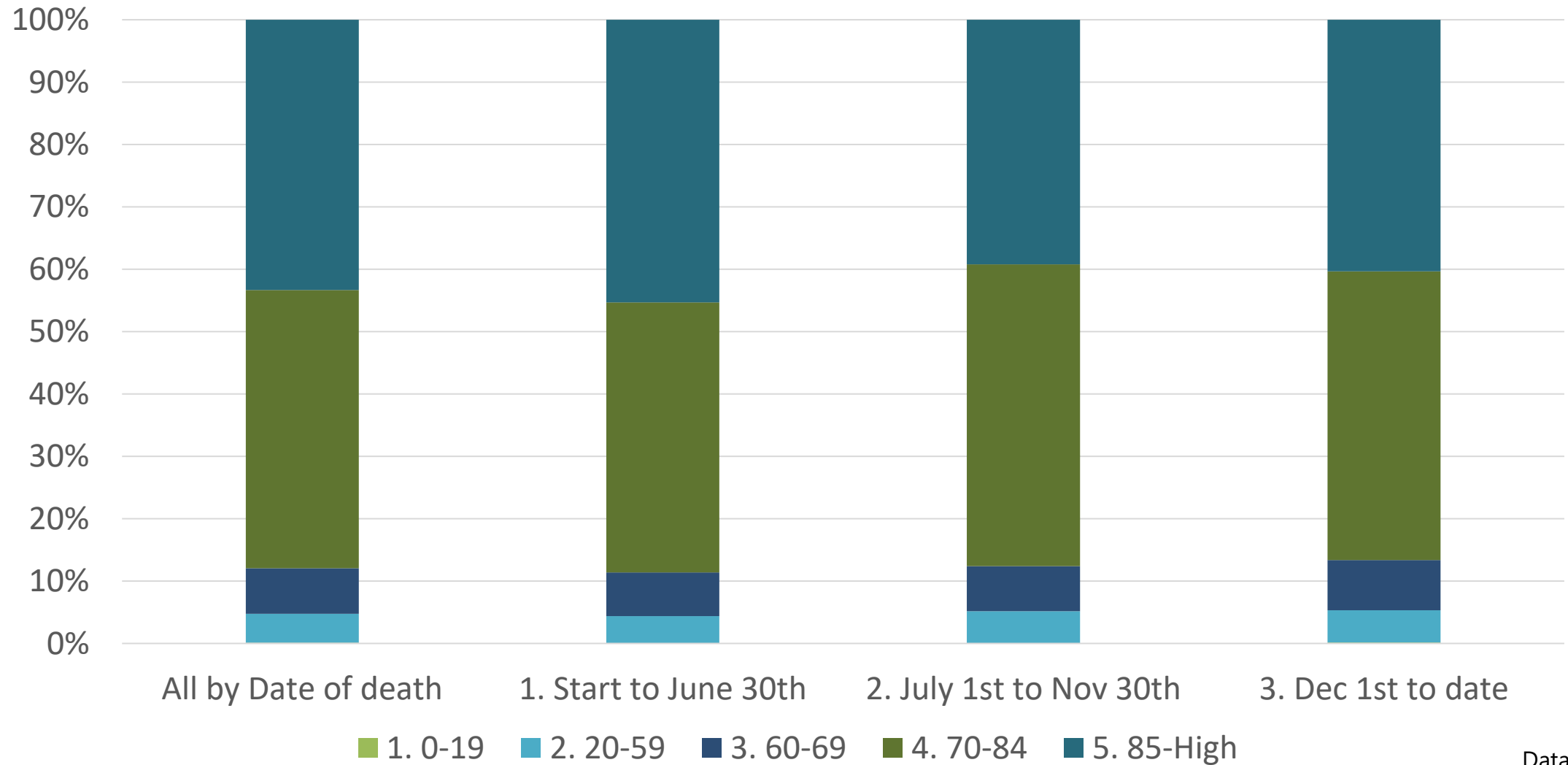

Key points

- The volume and size of nursing home outbreaks continues to be of concern
 - Both new and several ongoing outbreaks
 - One NH outbreak – 100 cases
 - Considerable mortality – 281 deaths since August 1st
- Steep rise in the number of residential institutions recently – 140 open outbreaks – 527 linked cases
- Large number of acute hospital outbreaks continue to occur – 37 in week 2
- Eleven new food production/processing outbreaks – one with 53 linked cases
- Increase in outbreaks in vulnerable groups
 - 7 DPC outbreaks
 - 17 Irish Traveller outbreaks between weeks 2 and 3 to date
- 23 CCF outbreaks this week – largest 10 cases, mix of staff and children

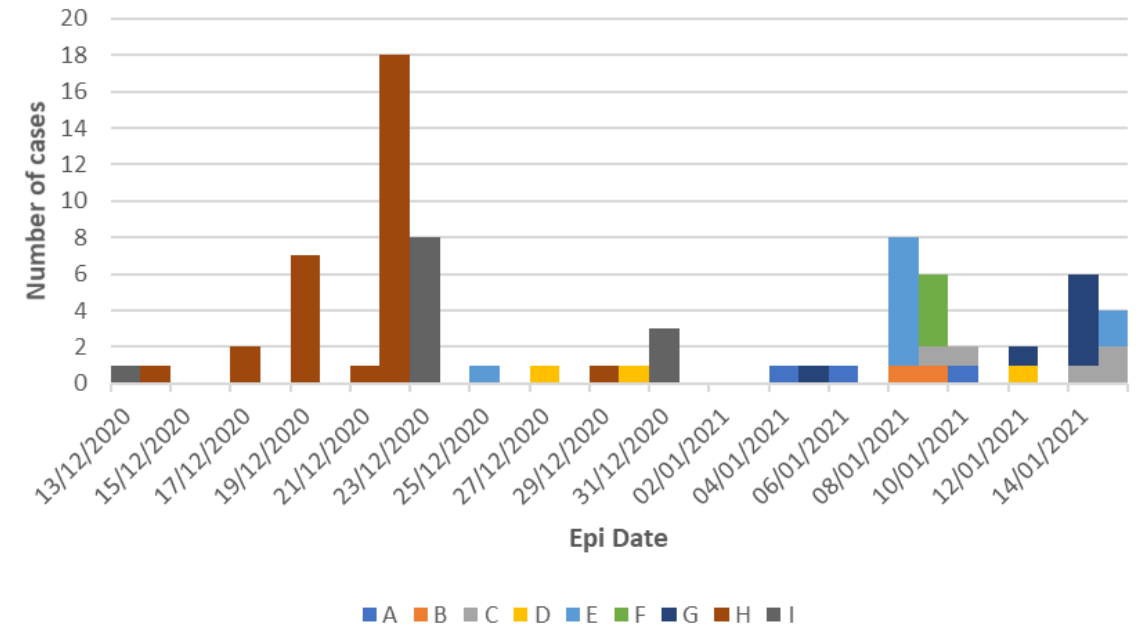
Inclusion criteria

Cases linked to outbreaks reported as affecting Irish Travellers OR whose ethnicity is reported as Irish Traveller, December 13th 2020 to midnight January 17th 2021

- 427 confirmed cases
- Includes 74 in Dublin (17%) and 67 in Galway (16%)
- 46% (198/427) male
- Median age 27 years
- 2.8% hospitalised, no ICU admissions and one death
- Among 26 outbreaks, 3 had >15 linked cases
- **Fourteen new outbreaks in week 2, with 25 cases between them**
- **Three new outbreaks already in week 3, 2021**

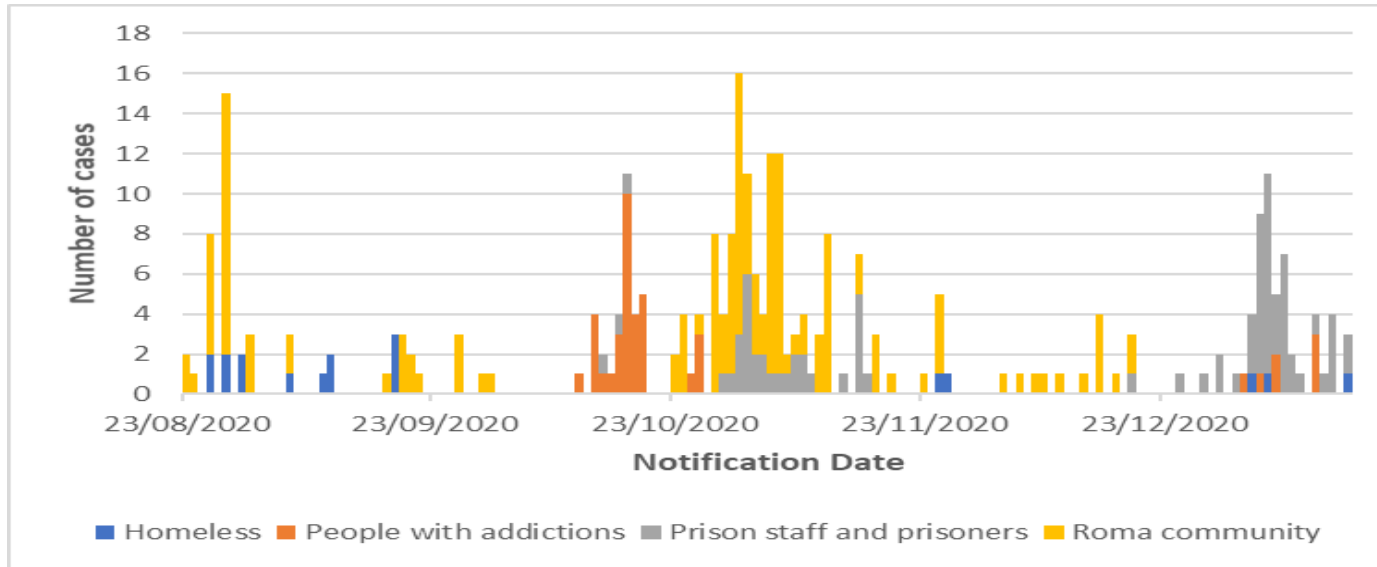

- To date, total of 457 confirmed cases linked to 48 notified outbreaks in DPCs
- There were four new outbreaks since last report – 53 linked cases
- Nine DPC outbreaks notified since July 1st remain 'open'
- 76 confirmed cases linked to the nine 'open' outbreaks
- Among the 76 cases, there are two hospitalisations and no ICU admissions or deaths

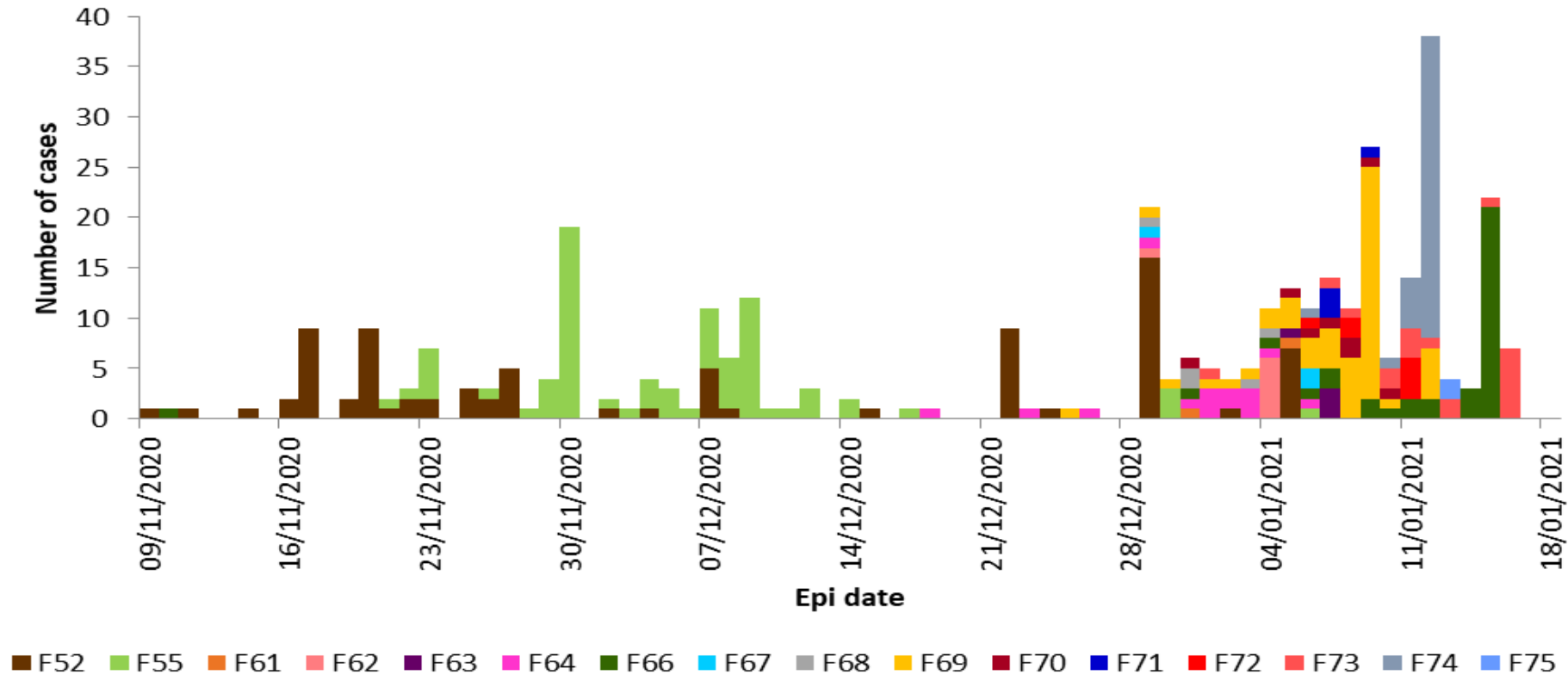

- Overall, 170 cases linked to outbreaks in this sector have an epi date within the last 14 days; and 36 within the last 7 days



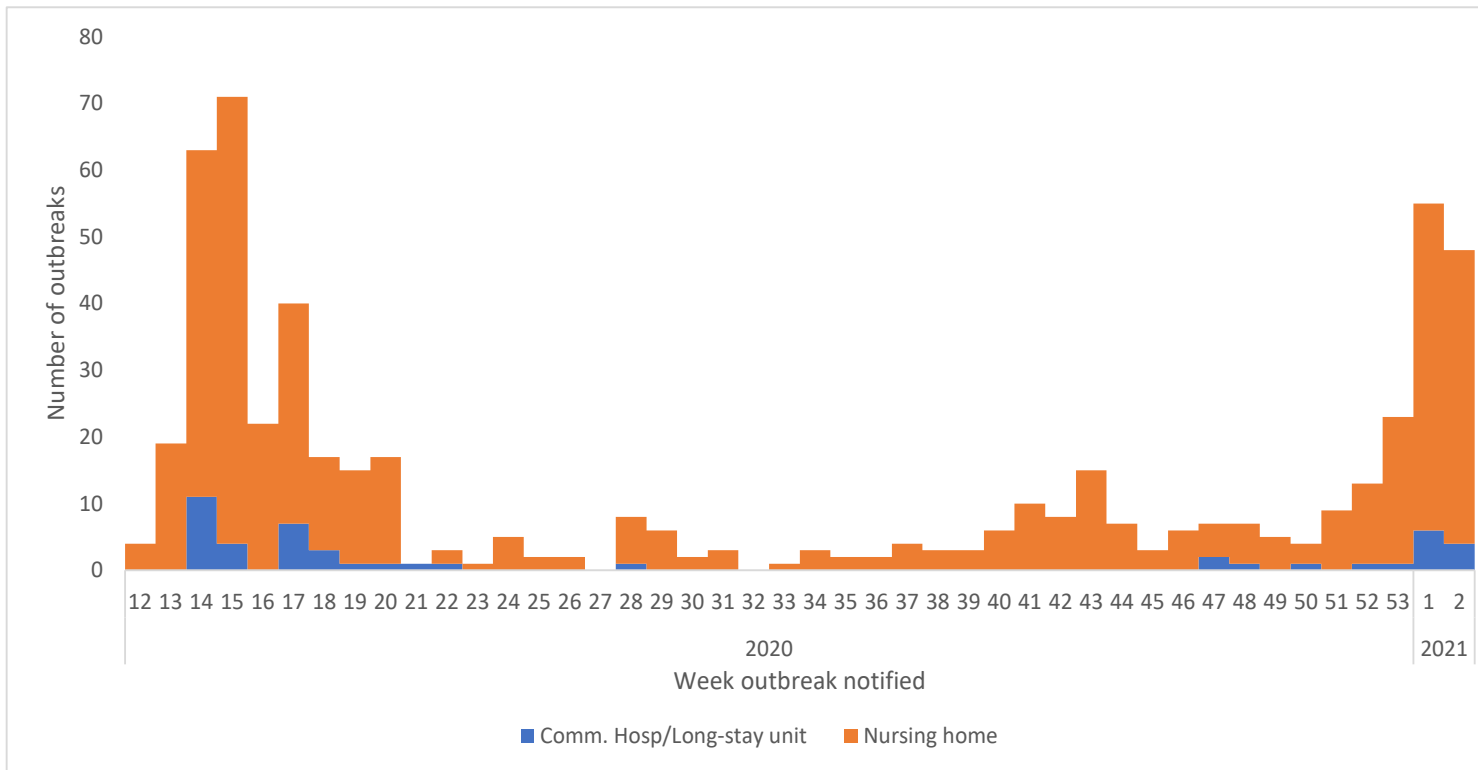

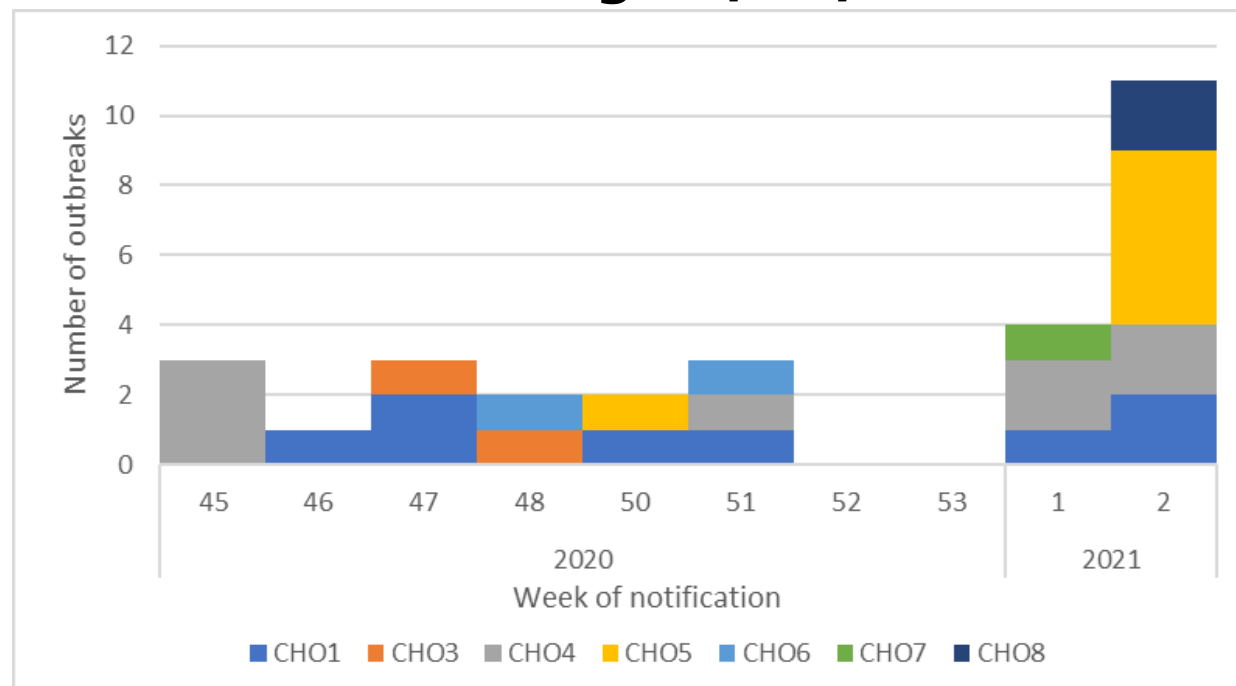
Focus on 164 'OPEN' Nursing Homes and Community Hospital/Long Stay Units to midnight January 16th 2021

- 2726 associated cases (819 HCW/staff cases, 1079 client cases, 814 cases HCW status unknown, of which 380 were <65 years)
- 10 outbreaks include only HCW/staff cases, 87 include both HCW/staff cases and client cases, 3 outbreaks includes client cases only, for 37 outbreaks the mix of cases is unclear, and for 27* outbreaks, there were no linked cases
- 48 new outbreaks since last week's report – 400 linked cases
 - One new outbreak – 55 linked cases
 - Four new outbreaks > 30 linked cases each
- 73 previously notified 'open' outbreaks – 1008 additional cases since last week's report
- 43 previously notified 'open' outbreaks – no additional cases since last week's report

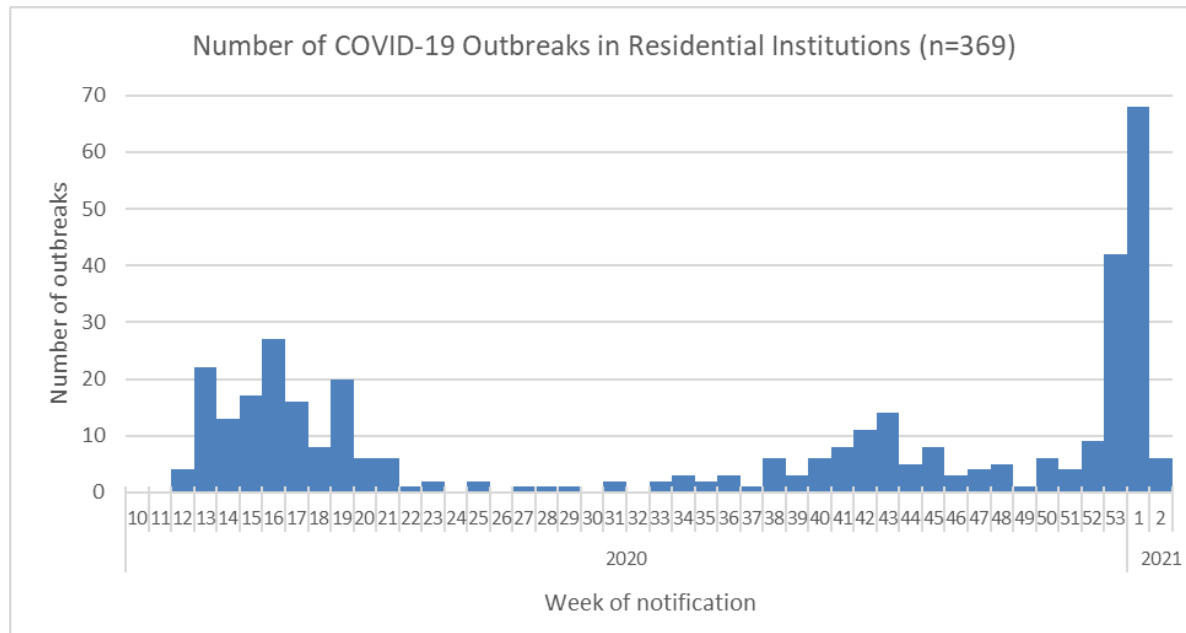

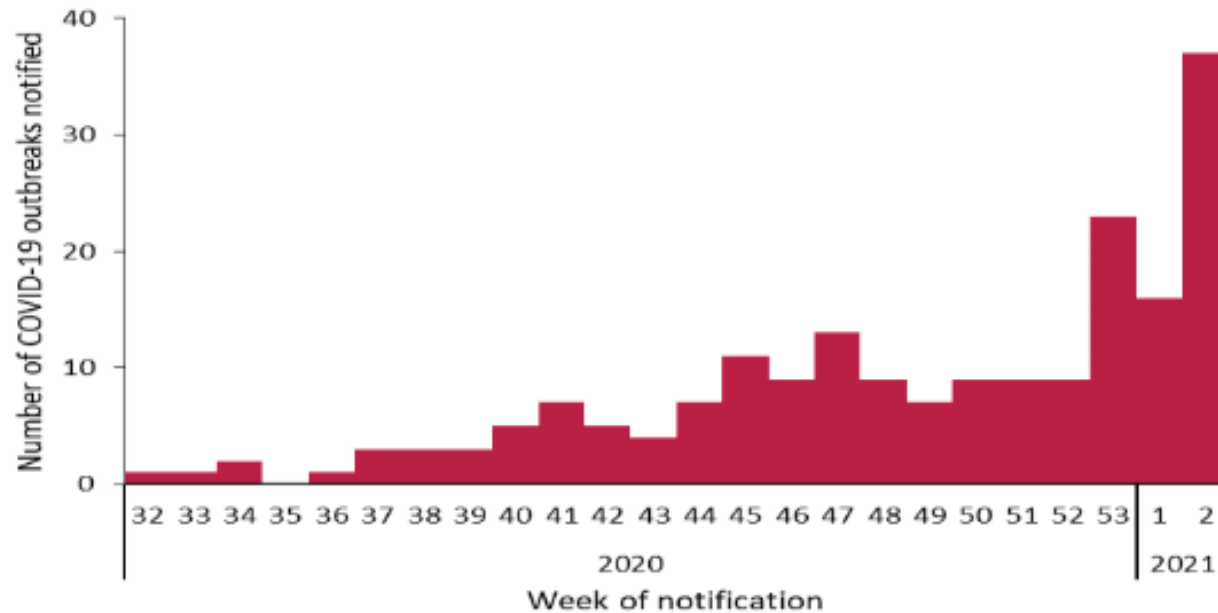

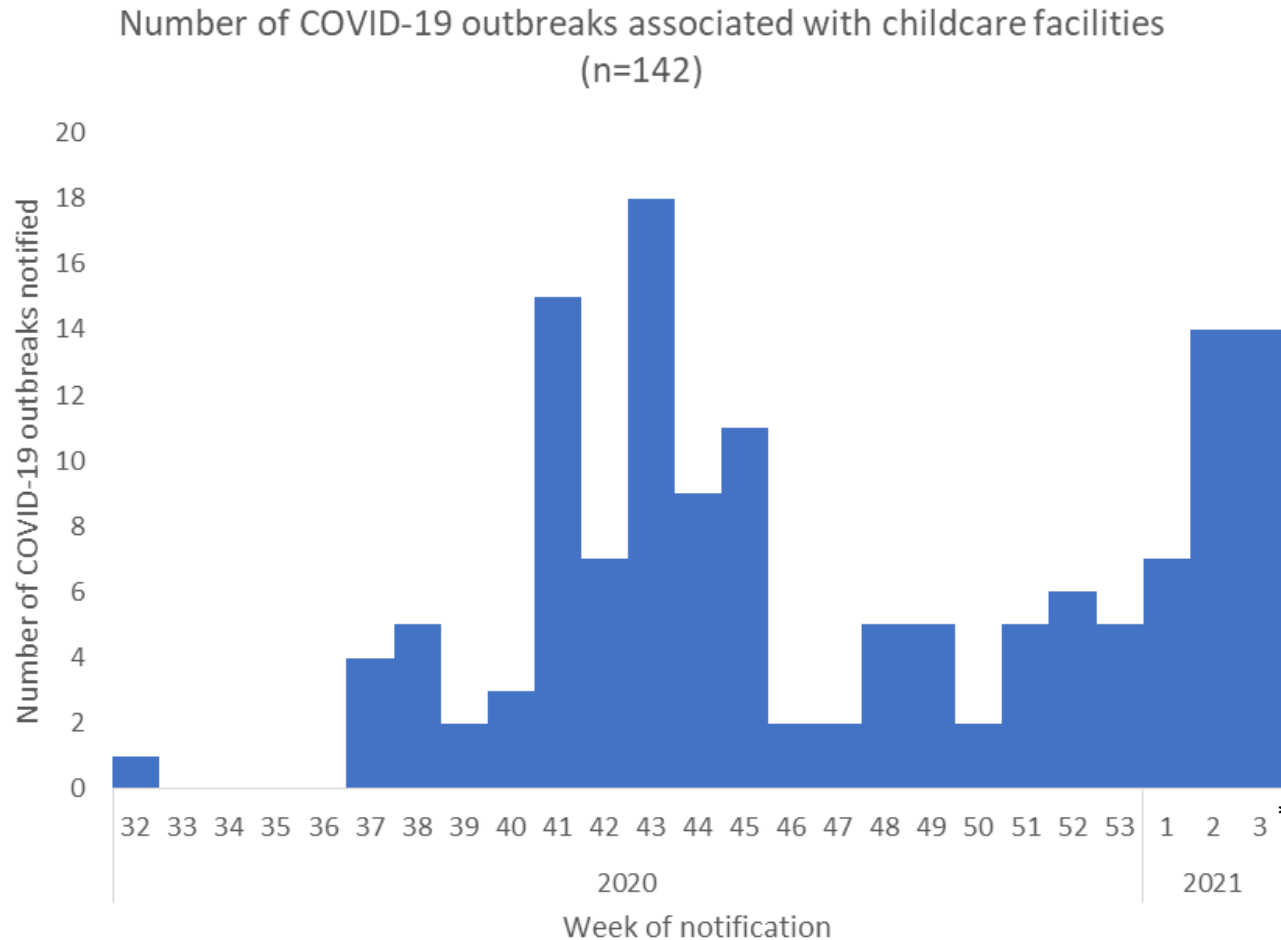

- The most notable outbreak, with 10 linked cases among a mixture of children and adults, occurred in CHO9
- 2 outbreaks were closed since last week

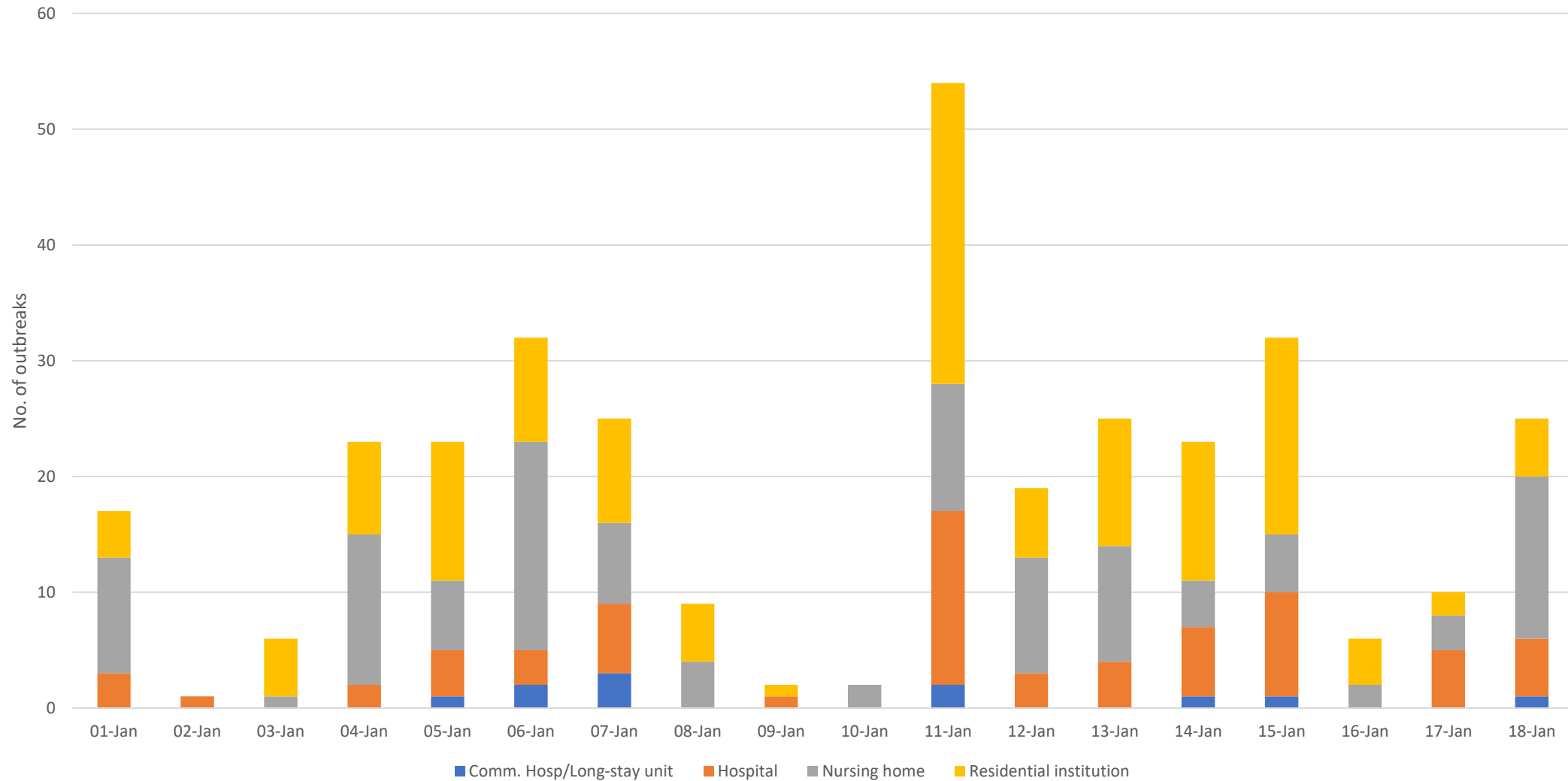

Epidemic curve of cases linked to outbreaks associated with childcare facility outbreaks to midnight 18th January 2021 (n=635) by age group and epi date



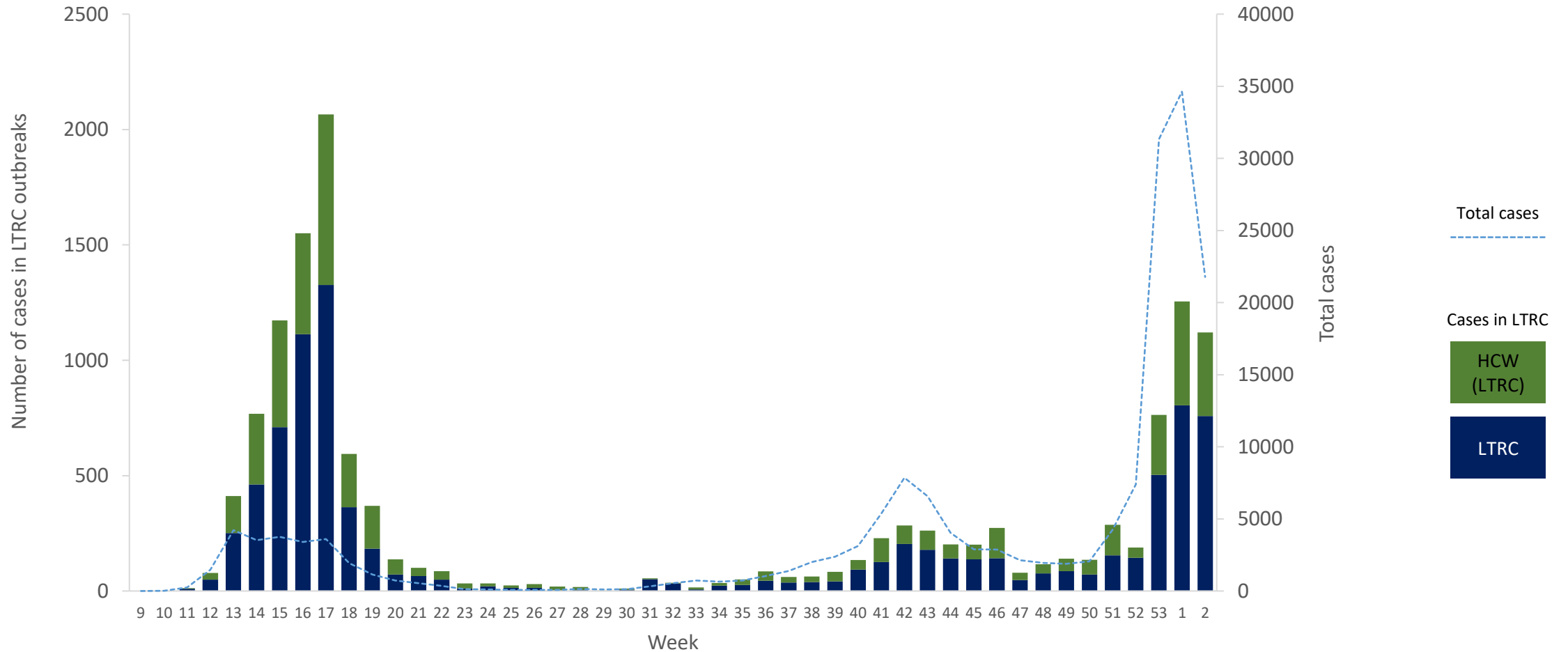

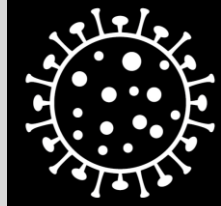
The number of cases in LTRC was less in the second wave compared to the first; however, the number of cases linked to outbreaks in LTRC, following the unprecedented levels of infection in the community, is now very high, similar to the numbers seen in April and May 2020. These numbers are an underestimate, as some cases under investigation will be linked, in the coming days, to outbreaks in LTRC



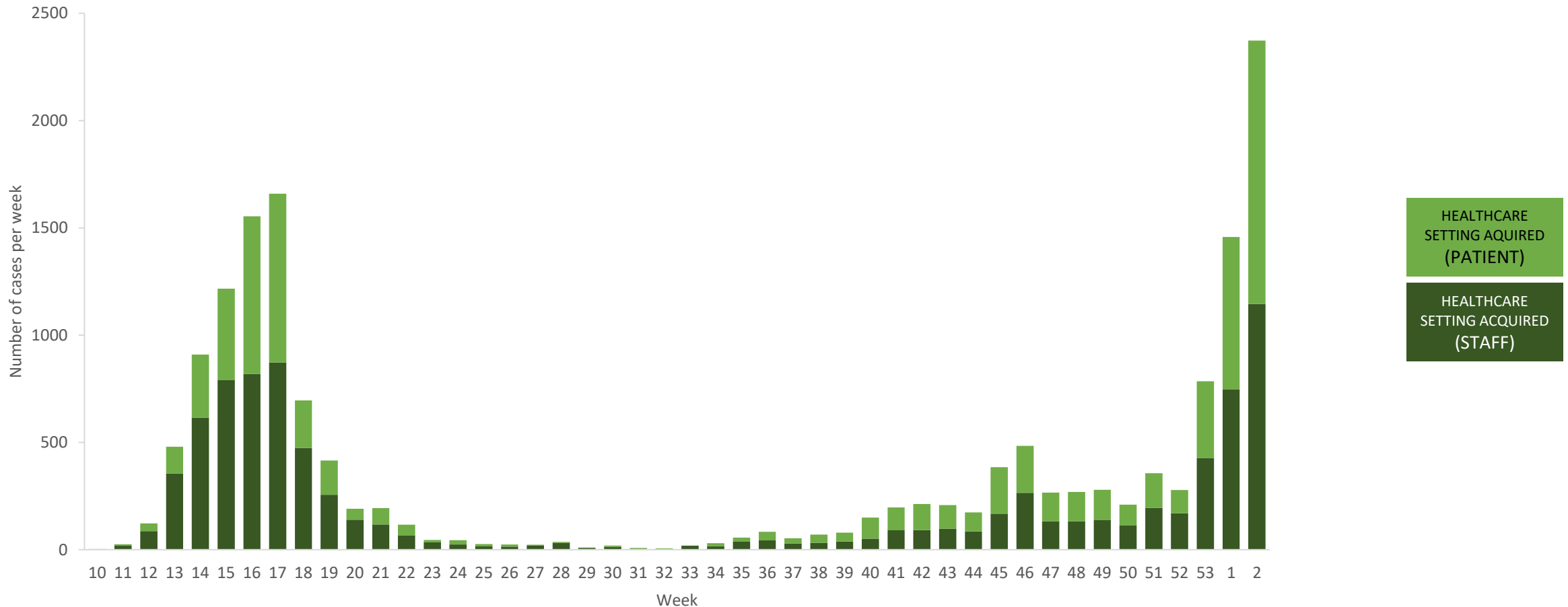
Weekly cases by setting. LTRC: cases amongst residents of long-term residential settings where outbreaks have occurred.

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Test & Trace Update

Testing and contact tracing NPHET update

Testing



Over the past seven days, 13th-19th Jan, there has been approximately 139,595 swabs taken for COVID-19 testing.

Of these:

- 73,688 (53%) of these were taken in the community
- 32,723 (23%) swabs were taken in acute settings.
- 33,184 (24%) swabs taken were taken as part of the Serial Testing programmes of staff in residential care facilities and staff in food production facilities.

Contact Tracing

From 13th-19th Jan, a total of 22,636 calls were made in the Contact Tracing Centres. Over the past seven days, the average number of close contacts per case was 2.8, compared to 3 in the previous week.

Turnaround Times (13th– 19th Jan)

End-to-end turnaround time

- The median end-to-end turnaround time, from referral to SMS, for **not detected** tests in the community setting was **1.4 days**.
- The median turnaround time for time, from referral to communication of a **detected result** by SMS, in community settings was **1.6 days**.
- The median end-to-end turnaround time, from referral to the end of contact tracing, for **detected cases** in the community setting was **1.8 days**.



Overall Swab to laboratory result communicated – Medians: 28 hours in Acute , 30 hours in Serial Testing, 27 hours in Community

Referral to appointment

In the community, the median time from referral to appointment was 0.2 days.

95.7% of GP referrals are provided with a COVID-19 test appointment within 24 hours.

Contact Tracing:

The mean time and median time to complete all calls are 4.2 hours and 2.1 hours, respectively.

CMP close contact update (week ending 17th Jan)



- The number of close contacts during week ending 17th Jan was 37,541, a decrease of 55% compared to the previous week (83,514)
- In total, 36,074 (96%) of these contacts had been informed of their close contact status by time of CMP report preparation.
- The number of complex contact setting contacts decreased by 9% to 6,648

Growth Rate

Retrospective analysis of Irish specimens dating from prior to the notification of the VOC by the UK authorities on the 21st December 2020 indicates that the VOC was first detected in Ireland in early November (week 45 in the surveillance year). In that week, a single VOC was identified (retrospectively) in 52 specimens tested.

The NVRL has since tested (based on S-Gene Target Failure) in excess of 1,500 PCR-positive SARS-CoV-2 specimens for the VOC (B.1.1.7). The VOC has been detected in approximately 300 of these specimens and has been identified in all regions of the country.

Retrospective analysis of Irish specimens dating from prior to the notification of the VOC by the UK authorities on the 21st December 2020 indicates that the VOC was first detected in Ireland in early November (week 45 in the surveillance year). In that week, a single VOC was identified (retrospectively) in 52 specimens tested. Further detections were identified retrospectively and prospectively as follows;

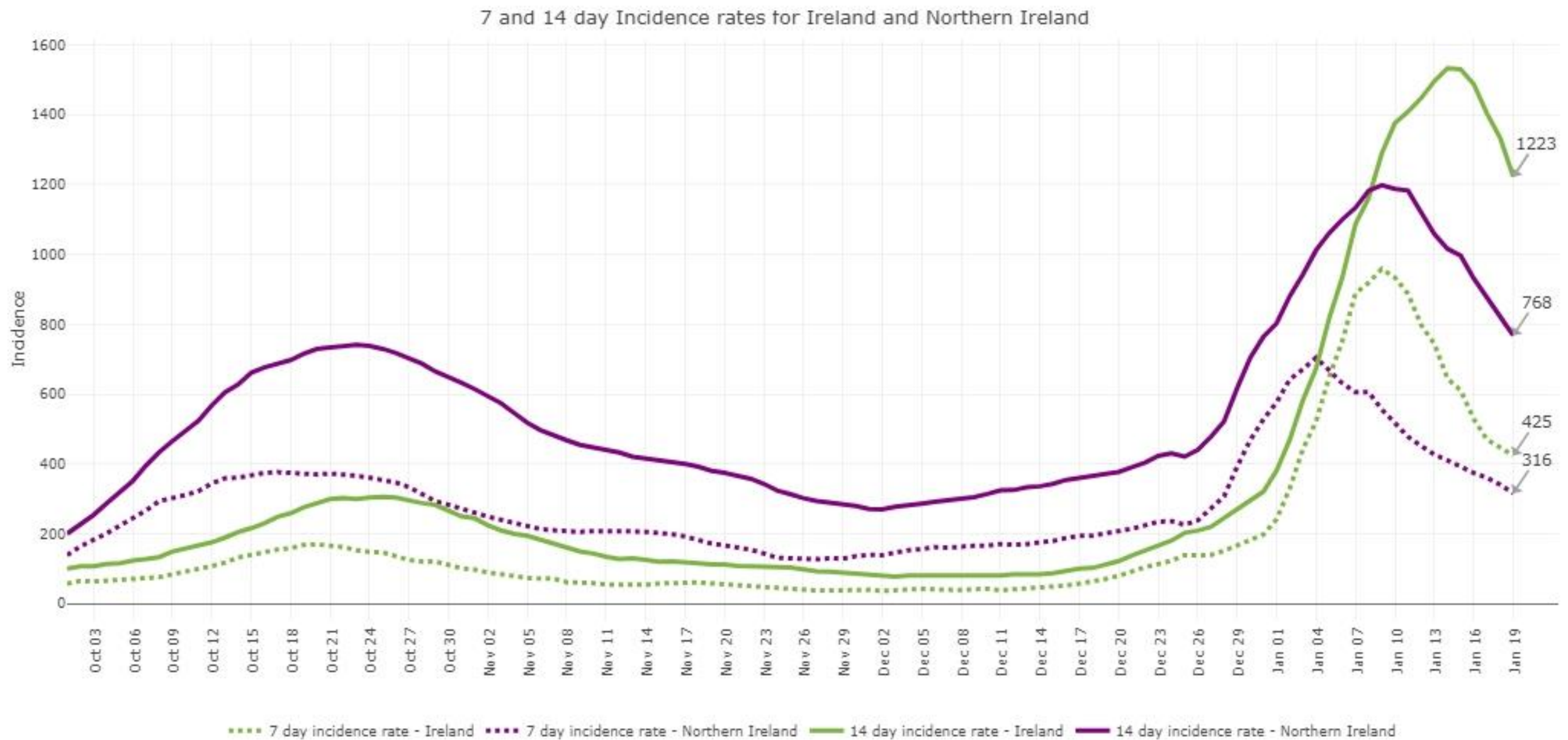
Whole Genome Sequencing of VOC



The NVRL has reported that it has completed whole genome sequencing of 80 suspected variants of concern taken since December 21st, 2020.

Based on these analyses:

- The presence of both UK (B.1.1.7) (n=77 cases identified out of 77 samples sequenced) and South African (501.V2) SARS-CoV-2 lineages (n=3 cases identified) has been confirmed by whole-genome sequencing in the Republic of Ireland.
- VOC associated with Brazil have not been detected in Ireland to date but targeted testing continues.

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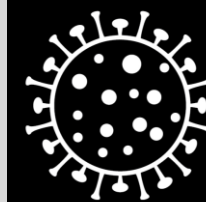

Reproduction number is below 1.0. The estimates based on confirmed cases (below) are 0.1-0.2 lower than estimates based on confirmed cases by date of specimen collection. R is thus estimated at 0.5 – 0.8

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Situation analysis 20 January 2021



- **Incidence** is falling but remains **very high** (10-15 times that in early December)
- Cases (5-day average) **2557 cases per day**; 14-day incidence **1223 per 100,000**
 - Incidence very high across **all age groups, exceptionally high in those aged 85 and older**
 - Incidence in those 65 and older continues to increase and a cause for concern
 - Incidence in those aged 18 and younger remains at or below population average
- We, collectively, have achieved suppression of transmission
 - Rate of decline -7 to -10%, halving time 7-10 days
 - **R estimated at 0.5-0.8**
- **Numbers in hospital starting to decrease, and numbers in ICU have plateaued**
 - These are tracking close to optimistic model predictions – there will be a very slow decrease in numbers in hospital
- **Rapidly increasing incidence in long-term care settings and vulnerable groups**
- **Mortality increasing**: there will be a large number of deaths in the coming weeks
- This remains a signal to maintain our efforts: we have a long way to go, and we **must maintain suppression** to protect each other from serious illness, and to protect our health services and healthcare workers.

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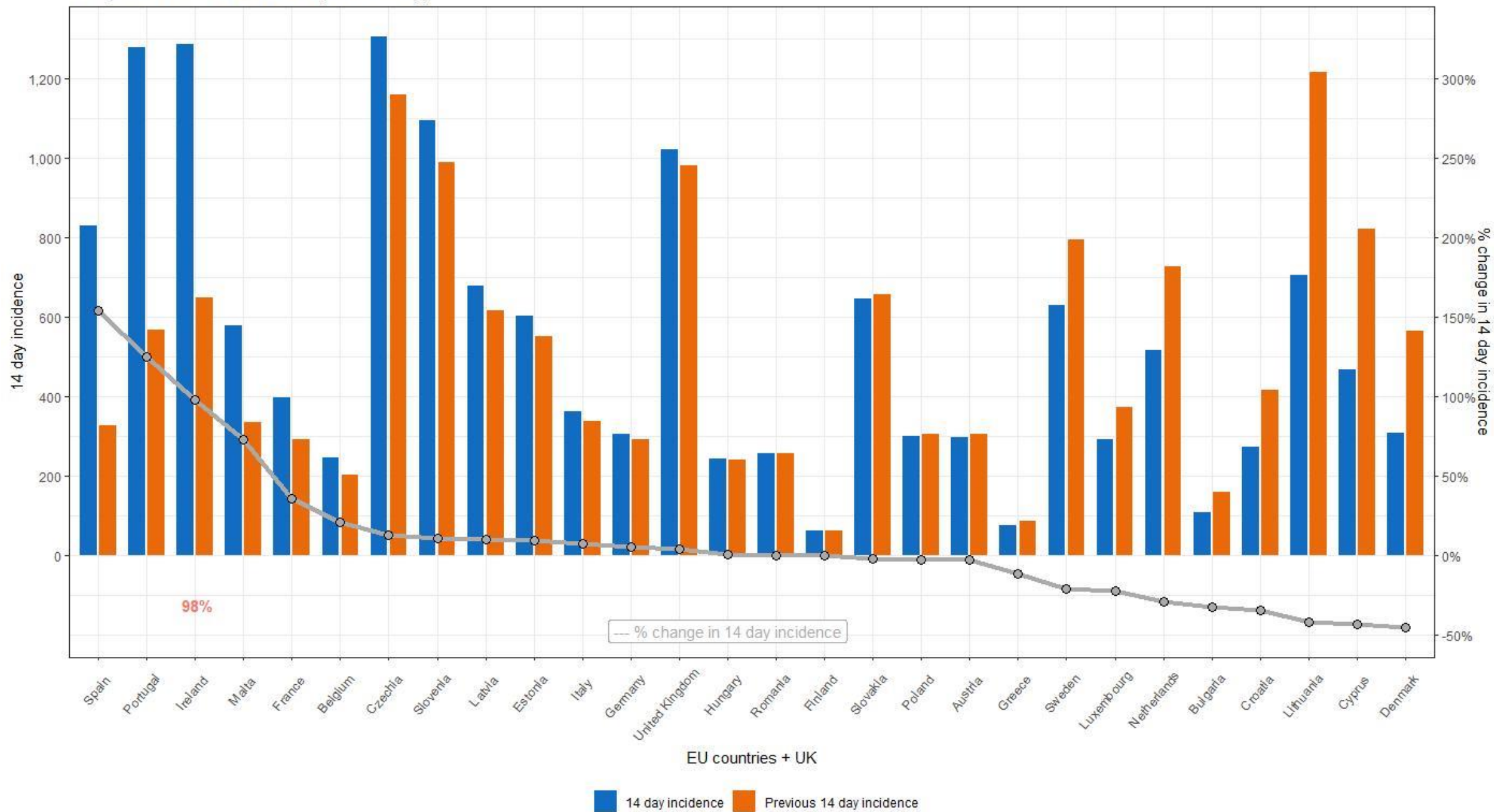

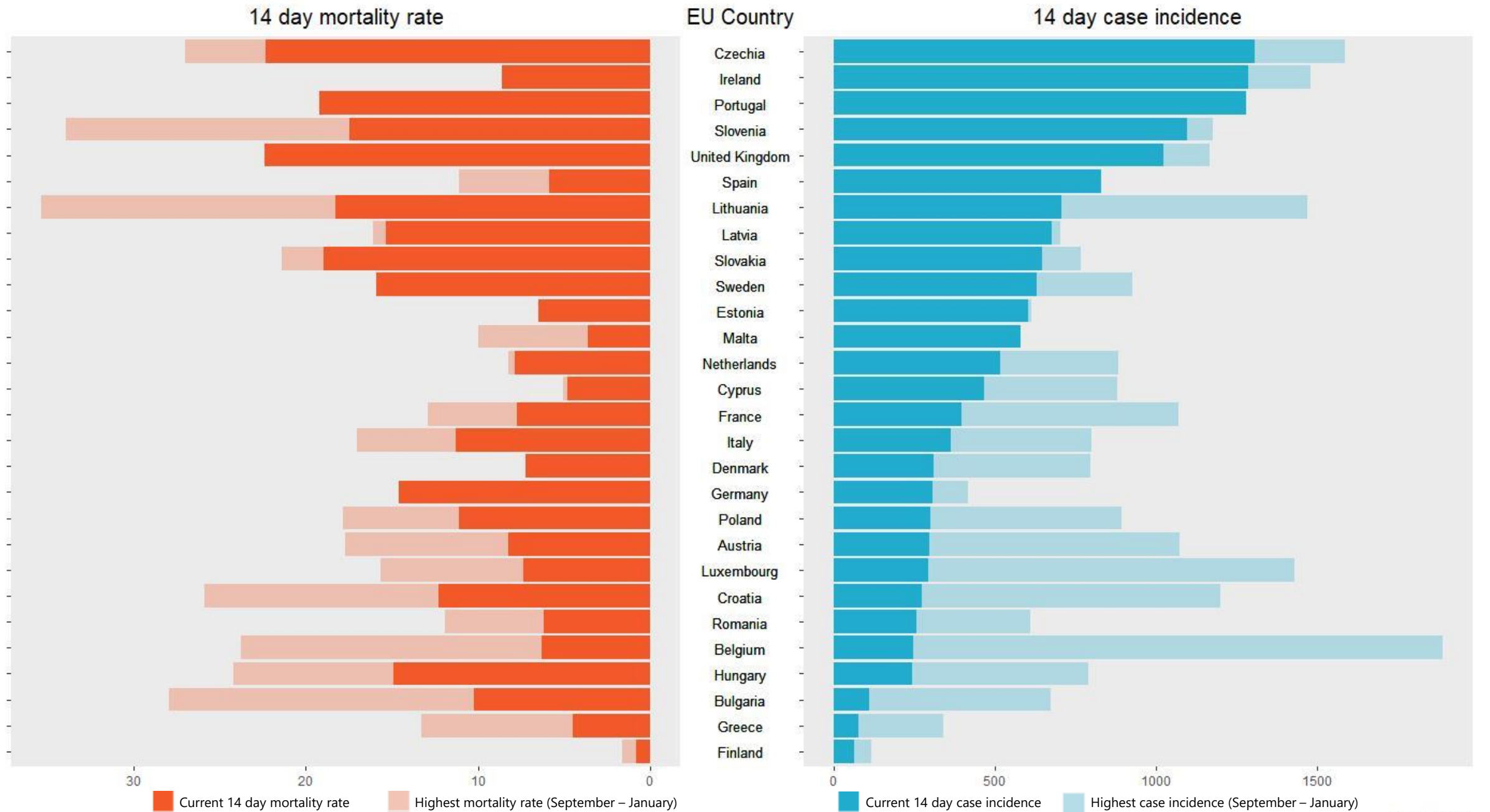

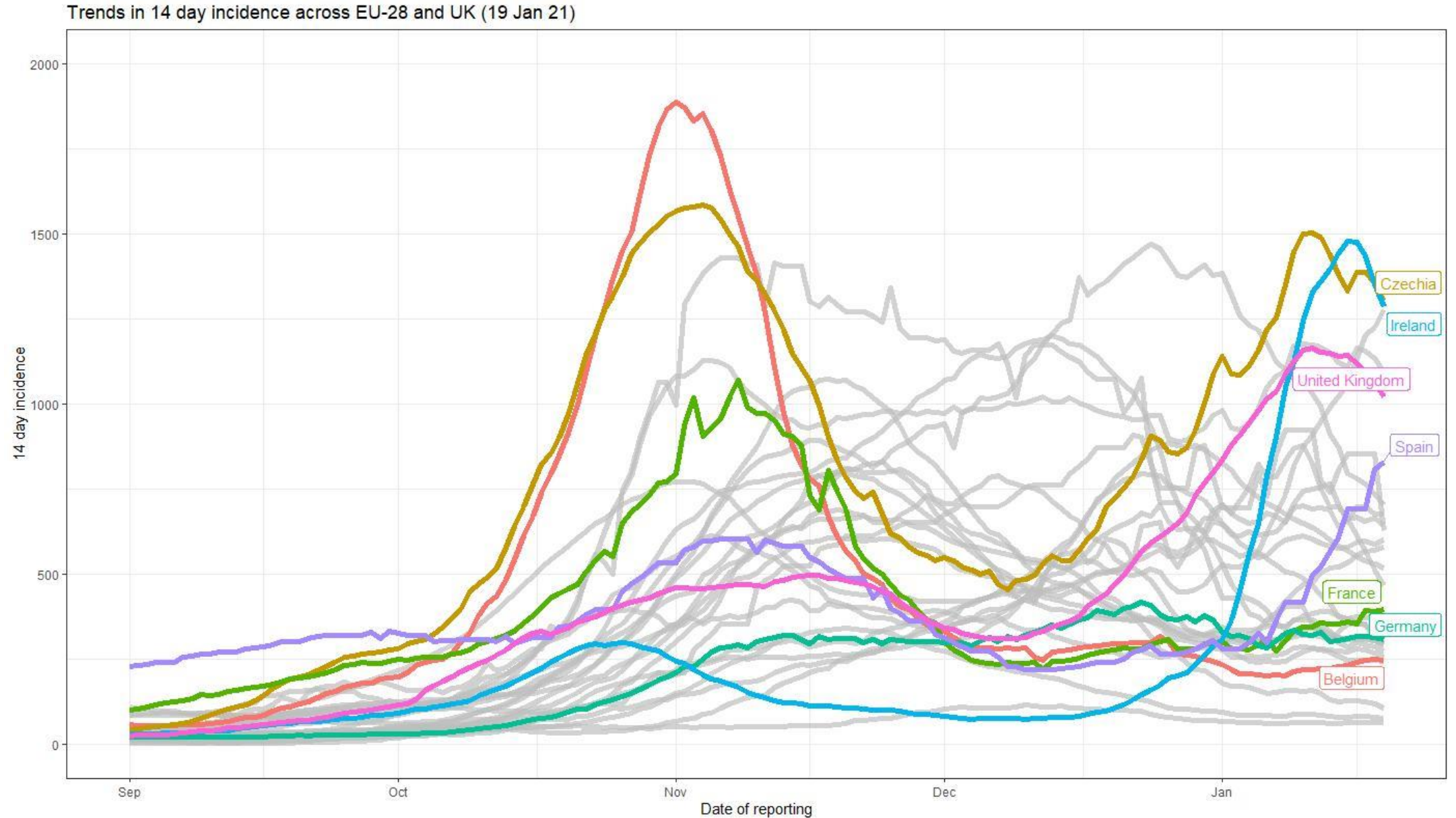

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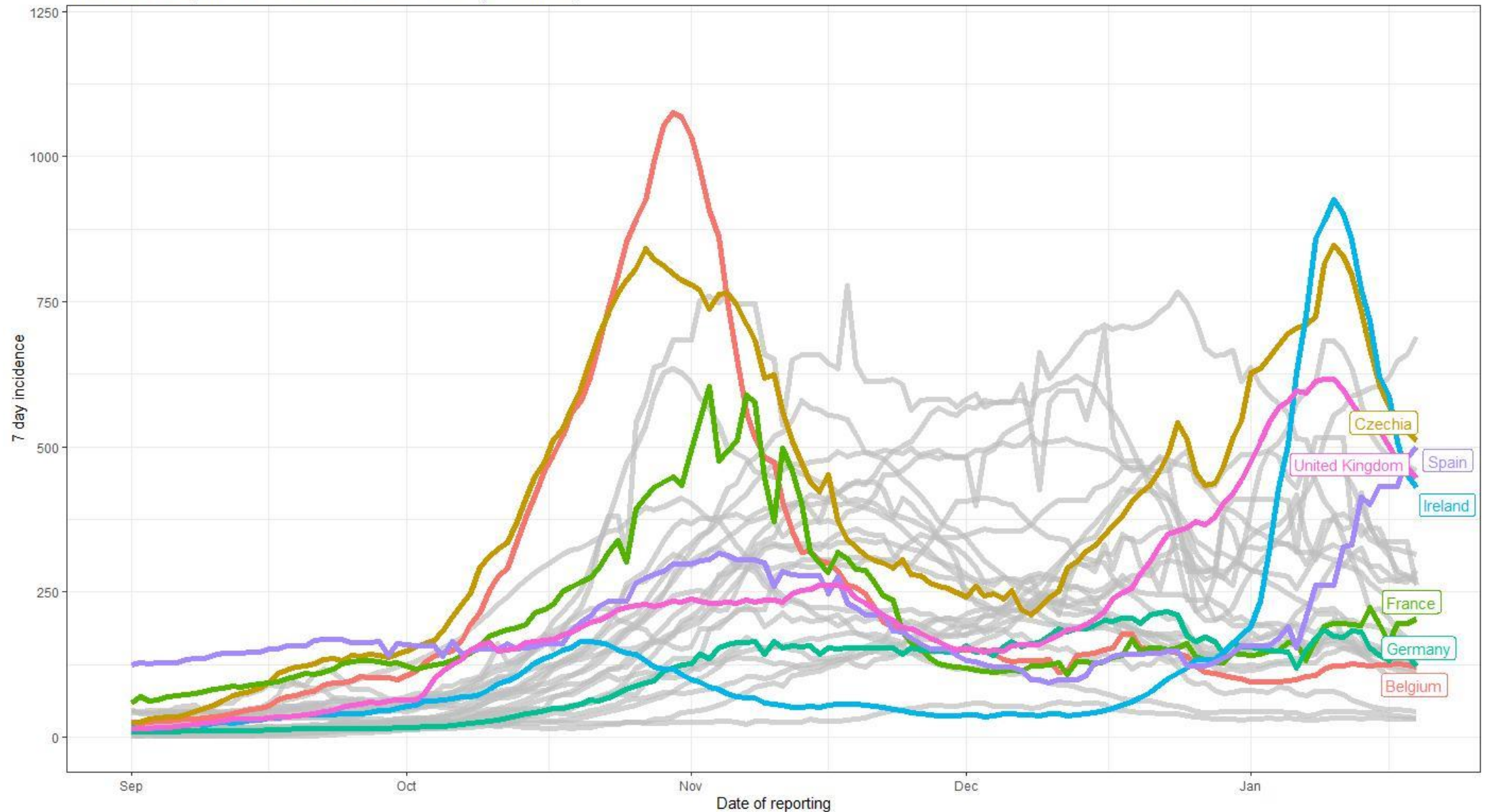
European trends since start September (14 day incidence)

Trends in 7 day incidence across EU-28 and UK (19 Jan 21)

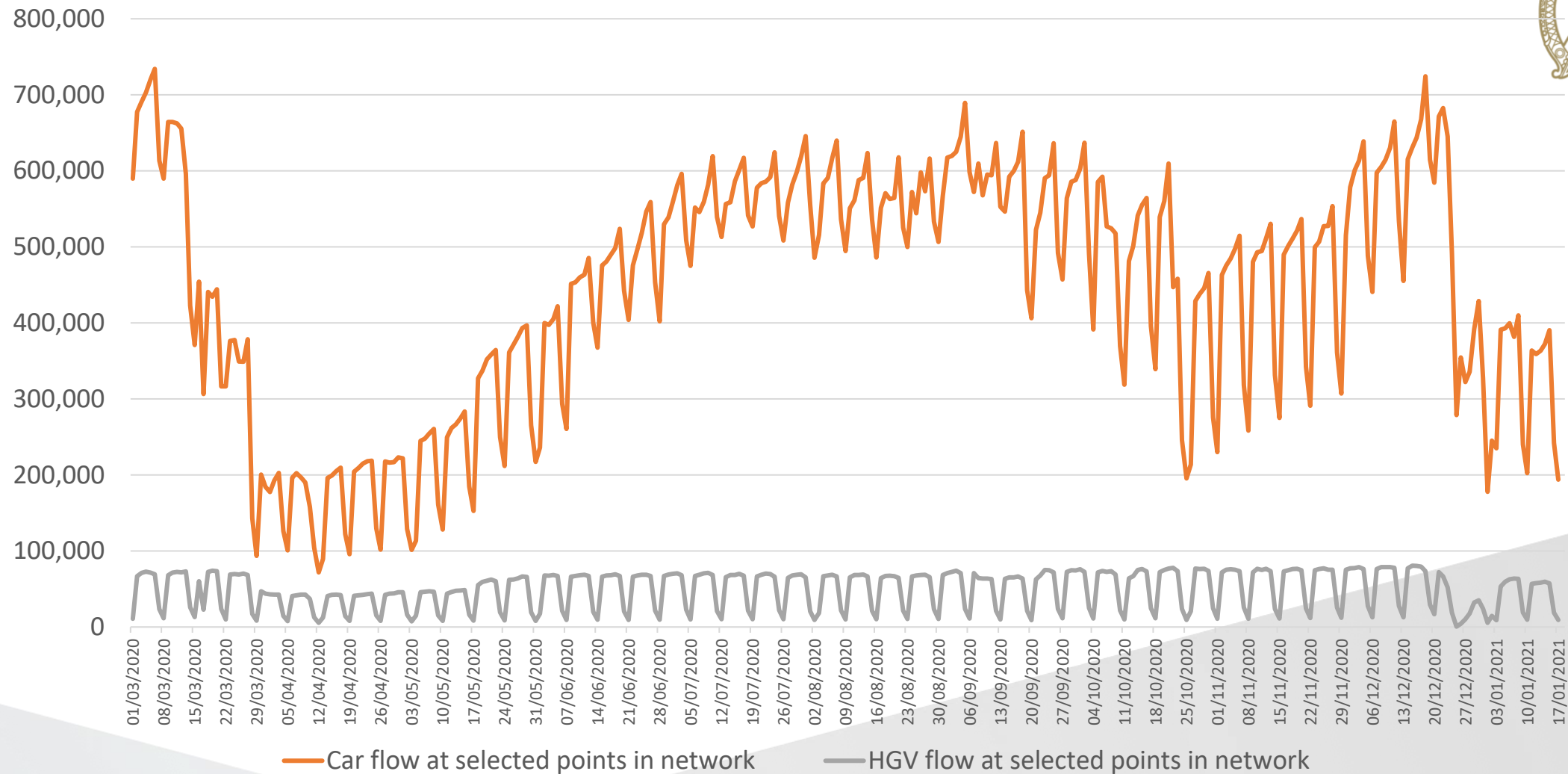


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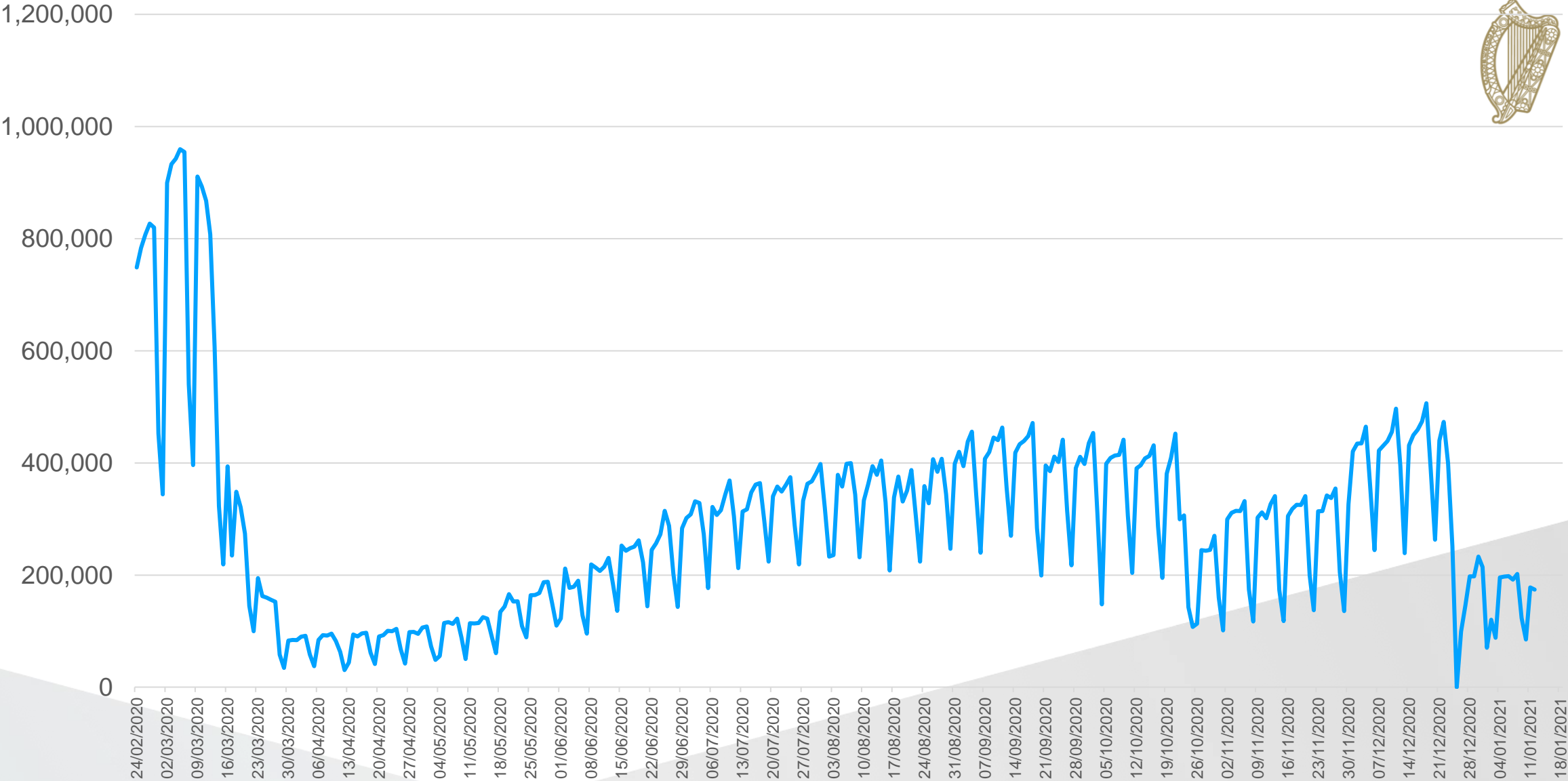

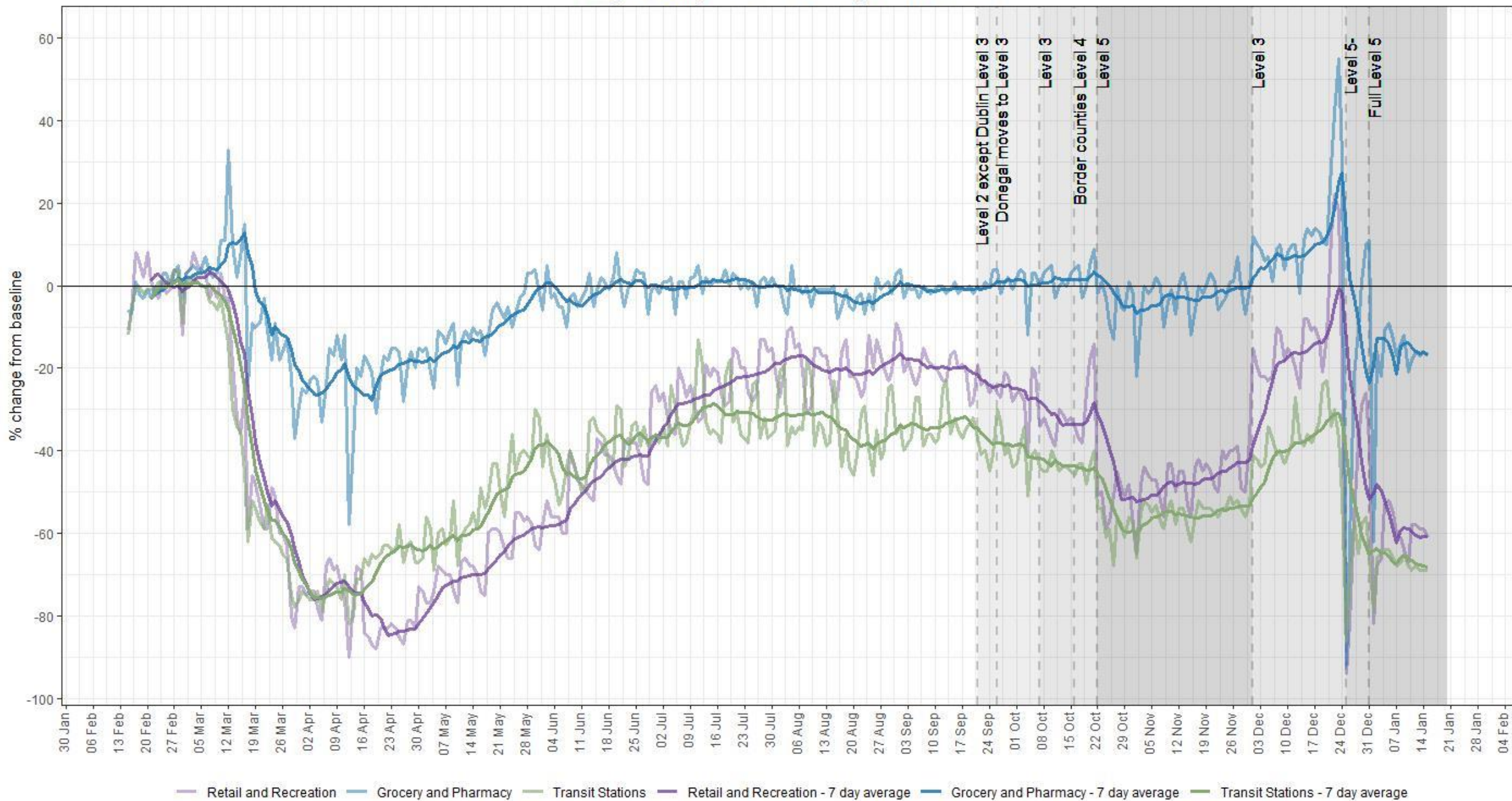
Daily Traffic Flow

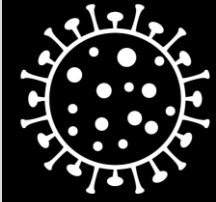

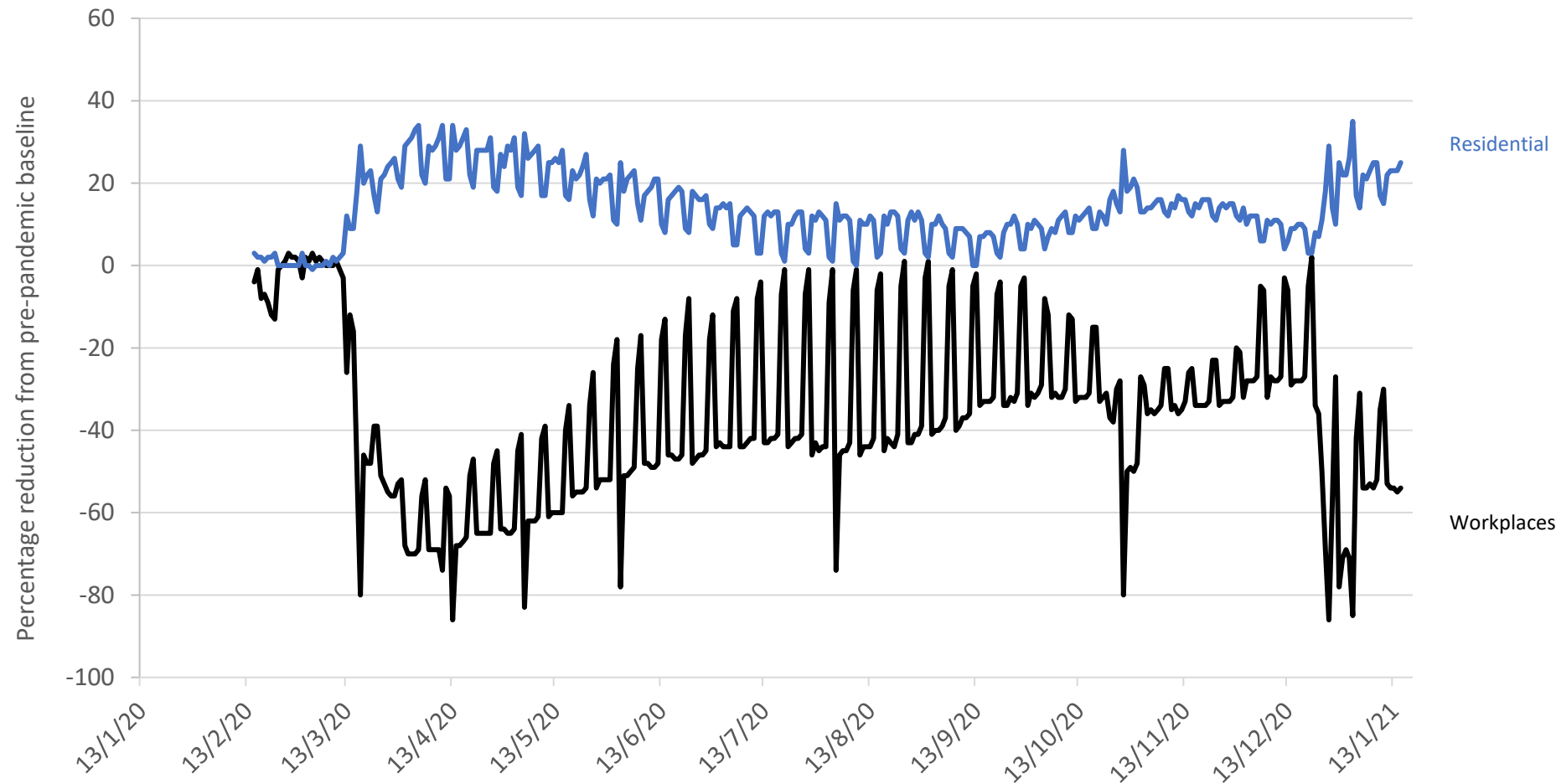

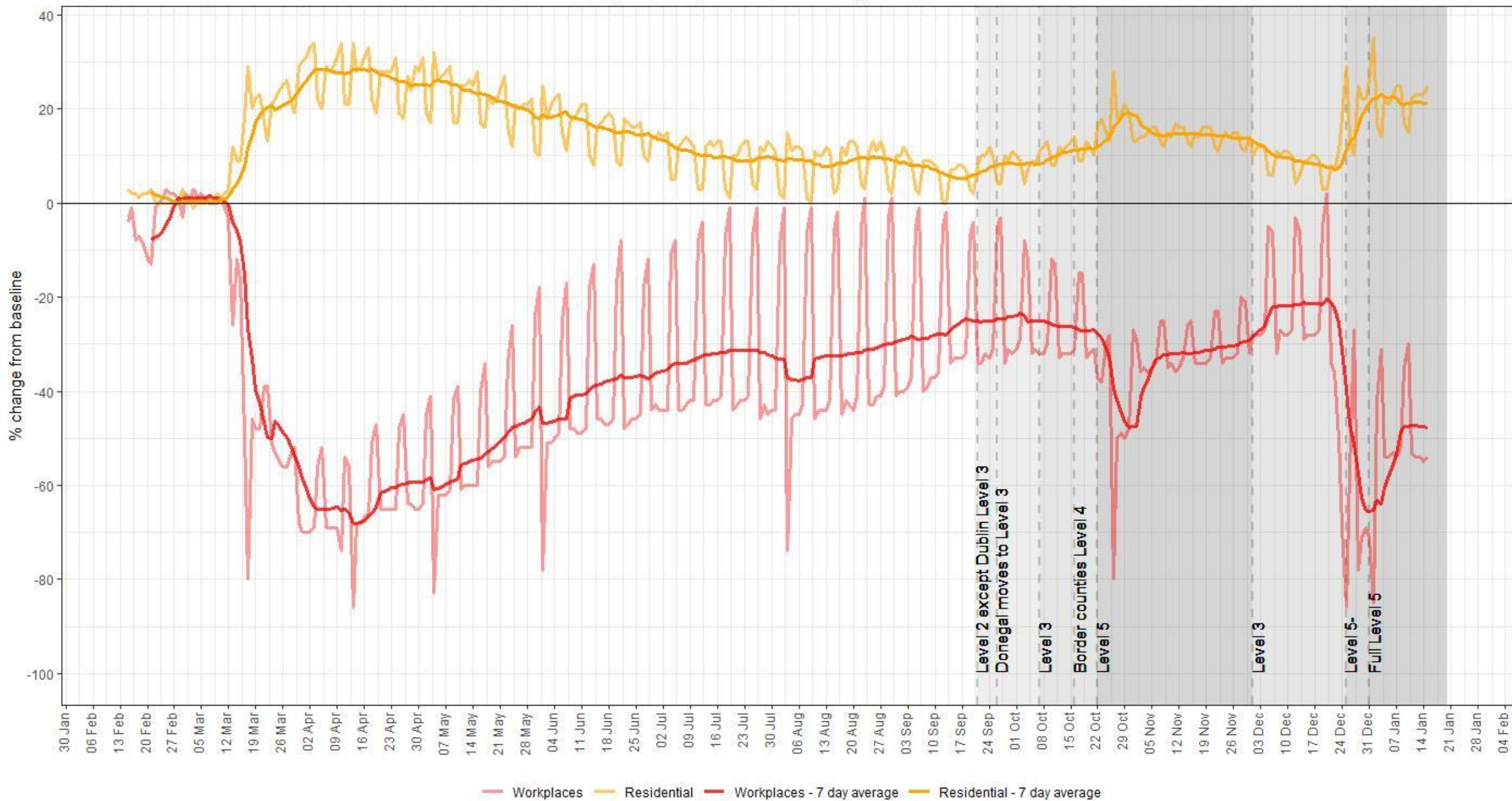
