



# **Fiscal Monitor**Incorporating the Exchequer Statement

February 2021

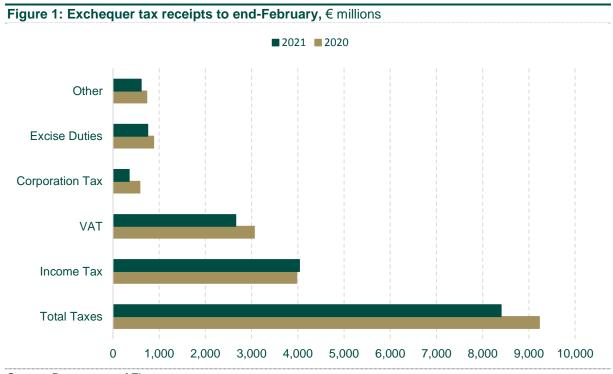


While the ISSCoP applies to the Fiscal Monitor it does not cover the profiles nor the commentary about the profiles.

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### **Summary**

- An Exchequer deficit of €721 million was recorded in February. This compares to a surplus
  of €1,001 million recorded in February last year. The €1,722 million year-on-year deterioration
  is driven by a combination of increased expenditure and a fall in tax receipts.
- On a 12-month rolling basis a better indicator of the trend the Exchequer recorded a
  deficit of €14,038 million.
- Tax receipts for the month of February amounted to €3,013 million, down by some €309 million, or 9.3%, on February 2020.
- Cumulatively, tax receipts for the first two months of the year stood at €8,401 million, down by €828 million, or 9.0%, on the same period last year.
- Total gross voted expenditure to end-February amounted to €12,377 million. This is €2,110 million, or 20.5%, higher than the same period in 2020 and €356 million ahead of profile.

#### Section 1: Revenue

Tax revenues of €3,013 million were recorded in February, a decrease of €309 million, or 9.3%, on February 2020. Much of this decline is due to the absence of large one-off corporation tax payments received last year, although there were also modest declines across most tax heads. Cumulatively, tax receipts of €8,401 million are down by €828 million, or 9.0% on the same period last year.

February is a non-VAT due month, meaning the clearest indicator of the pandemic impact on tax receipts is absent in the returns. However, insofar as trends can be observed the pattern seems broadly the same as in recent months, with declines across many tax heads but a remarkable resilience in income tax preventing the aggregate performance from a more severe fall.

Non-tax revenues and capital resources of €2,605 million brought gross Exchequer revenue to €14,400 million, representing an annual increase of €1,949 million, or 15.7%. However, €1.4 billion relates to the repayment to the Exchequer of an intra-month loan to the Social Insurance Fund.

#### 1.1 Direct Taxes

**Income tax** receipts of €1,751 million were collected in February, down by just €29 million or 1.6% on February last year. The February 2020 performance was itself some 12% ahead of the previous year, meaning this resilience is particularly impressive. Cumulative income tax receipts of €4,034 million are slightly ahead of their strong 2020 performance by €56 million, or 1.4%.

February is not a significant month for **corporation tax**, and receipts of €293 million were collected in the month, down €174 million on February 2020. The decline is due to some large one-off receipts received in February last year which did not reoccur, as well as a deduction of €69 million in payments made under the Covid Restrictions Support Scheme.¹ Cumulatively, corporation tax receipts stand at €350 million to end-February, down by €232 million on the same period last year.

#### 1.2 Indirect Taxes

February is a non **VAT**-due month, and accordingly, relatively modest receipts of €298 million were collected, down by €57 million, or 16.1%, on February last year. Cumulatively, VAT receipts of €2,657 million are €400 million, or 13.1%, below the same period last year, reflecting the substantial decline seen in January.

**Excise duty** receipts of €341 million were collected in February, down by €28 million, or 7.6% on the same month last year. Cumulative excise receipts of €750 million are down by €131 million, or 14.8% on the year.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>1</sup> The Fiscal Monitor reflects Exchequer receipts i.e. funds that have been received by the Exchequer and are available for expenditure or deficit reduction. The tax data in this document does not reflect net receipts accounted for by Revenue, which although obviously related, are different from Exchequer returns. Reporting Revenue figures may falsely exaggerate Exchequer receipts and create an inconsistency with the Exchequer Statement.

#### 1.3 Capital Taxes

**Stamp duty** receipts to end-February stood at €207 million, down by €71 million on the same period last year. **Capital gains tax** receipts to end-February stood at €55 million, down by €97 million compared to end-February 2020. As noted last month, this relates to a technical adjustment whereby Revenue reallocated some €99 million in CGT funds. **Capital acquisitions tax** receipts of €39 million for the first two months of the year are ahead of the same period last year by €10 million, or 33.4%.

#### 1.4 Other Taxes

**Motor tax** receipts of €161 million were collected to end-February, down slightly by €9 million, or 5.4% on 2020. **Customs** receipts of €68 million were collected to end-February, up €16 million on last year.

#### 1.5 Non-Tax Revenue

**Non-tax revenue** to end-February amounted to €157 million, up by €92 million on the same period last year. The year-on-year increase is primarily due to the timing of carbon auction receipts.

#### 1.6 Capital Receipts

**Capital receipts** to end-February amounted to €2,449 million, up by €1,463 million on the same period last year. The increase is primarily due to the repayment to the Exchequer of an in-month loan to the Social Insurance Fund and is net neutral overall, with the loan also reflected in capital expenditure.

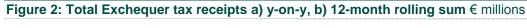
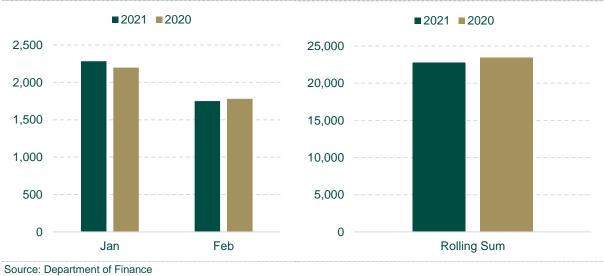




Figure 3: Income Tax receipts a) y-on-y, b) 12-month rolling sum , € millions



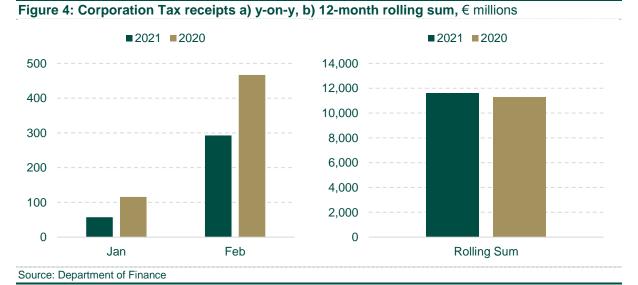


Figure 5: VAT receipts a) y-on-y, b) 12-month rolling sum, € millions

Figure 6: Excise Duty receipts a) y-on-y, b) 12-month rolling sum, € millions

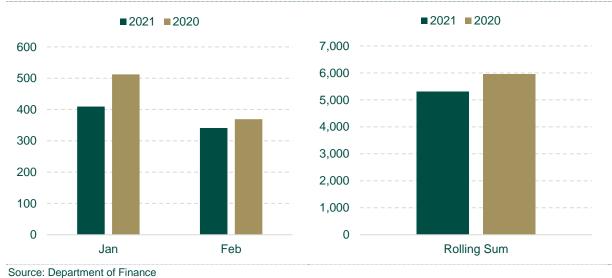
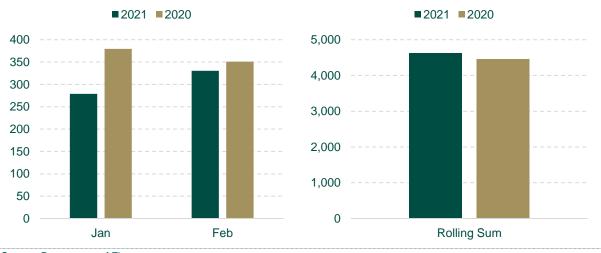


Figure 7: Other tax receipts a) y-on-y, b) 12-month rolling sum, € millions

## **Section 2: Expenditure**

Exchequer expenditure to end-February totalled €15,121 million, consisting of gross voted and non-voted expenditure of €12,377 million and €2,744 million respectively.

#### 2.1 Gross Voted Expenditure

**Total gross voted expenditure** to end-February amounted to €12,377 million, which was €2,110 million, or 20.5%, ahead on the same period in 2020 and €356 million ahead of profile. **Gross voted current expenditure** of €11,801 million is €2,099 million or 21.6% ahead on the same period last year and €439 million ahead of profile. **Gross voted capital expenditure** of €575 million is €11 million or 1.9% ahead of the same period in 2020 and €82 million, or 12.5%, below profile.

#### 2.2 Net Voted Expenditure

**Total net voted expenditure** to end-February 2021 amounted to €8,983 million, which was €889 million, or 11.0%, ahead of the same period in 2020 and €313 million below profile. **Net voted current expenditure** of €8,412 million was €880 million, or 11.7%, ahead year-on-year and €257 million below profile. **Net voted capital expenditure** of €571 million was €9 million, or 1.6%, ahead year-on-year and €56 million below profile.

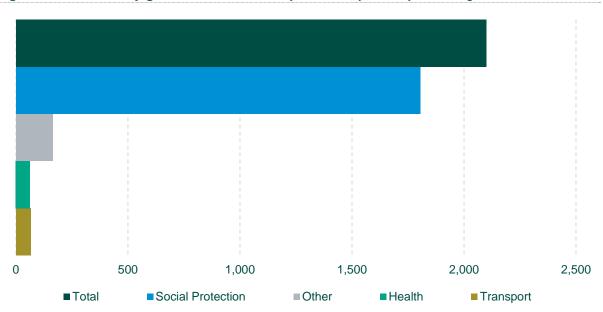


Figure 8: end-February gross voted current expenditure, year-on-year change

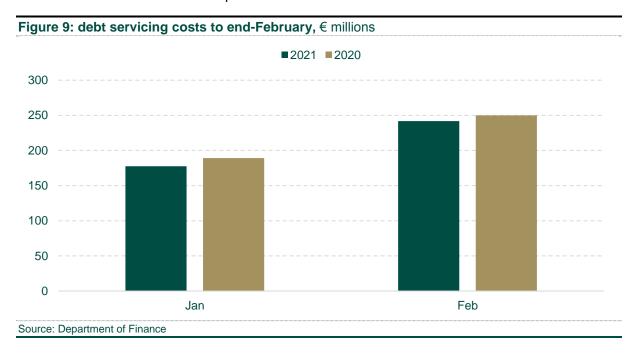

#### 2.3 Non-Voted Expenditure

**Non-voted current expenditure**, excluding debt servicing costs, stood at €918 million to end-February, up by €175 million, or 23.5% on the same period last year. This primarily reflects an increase in the EU Budget contribution.

#### 2.4 Debt Servicing Costs

Exchequer **debt servicing** costs to end-February stood at €419 million, down on last year by €20 million or 4.5% and in line with expectations.

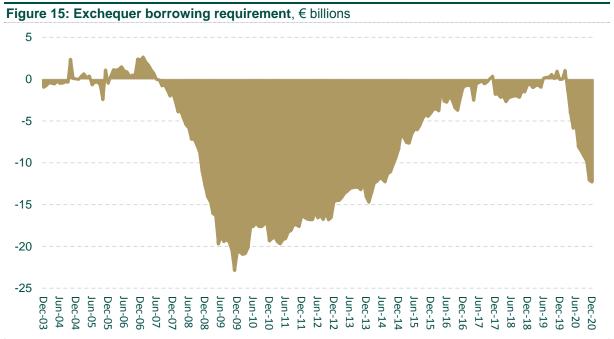

#### 3.6 Exchequer Borrowing Requirement 2003-2020

From 2003 to 2007, the Exchequer account was broadly in balance, that is, outgoings were broadly in-line with revenue. From 2008 onwards, tax revenues decreased sharply, and a substantial deficit opened up on the Exchequer account. The underlying Exchequer Borrowing Requirement (EBR) increased significantly, peaking at over €20 billion (on a 12-month rolling sum basis) at end-2009 (these figures exclude the impact of banking support provided through the Exchequer).

The Exchequer account recorded an annual surplus of €99 million in 2018, the first underlying surplus since 2006, and a successive annual surplus in 2019 of €647 million. A deficit of €12 billion was recorded in 2020, primarily due to increased expenditure as a result of the Covid-19 pandemic.
