Part 1: Proposal Details (Attach additional documents as required)

1.1 Description of proposed works/activity.

Magheraroarty is a small village on the North-West Coast of Co. Donegal, accessed by the R257 as shown in Drawing No. 001 – Site Location Plan included in Appendix 1. Magheraroarty harbour is located South West of the 3km beach known as Dooey Strand. The harbour is used daily by the Tory Island ferry and is also home to a small number of commercial vivier crabbers as well as some seasonal shellfish vessels and leisure craft. Over the winter months sand continues to be transported along Dooey Strand and deposited along the berthing face of the pier. This sand is removed annually during the equinoctial Spring Tides in March/April and deposited back on Dooey Strand as beach nourishment. Donegal Co. Council now wish to apply for a foreshore licence to carry out this activity for a further 5 years. The amount of material to be removed from the berthing face of the pier annually and deposited back on Dooey Strand is in the region 10,000 up to a maximum of 20,000 tonnes. This work is carried out during low tide over a 5 – 6 day period coinciding with the Spring tide in March/April each year to give best access to the entire berthing area. The ongoing maintenance dredging is required to maintain navigable depths of -2.5m Chart Datum within the harbour particularly for the Tory Island Ferry service. The area to be dredged is indicated on Drawing No.002a in Appendix 2 and covers an area of approximately 6,200m² (0.62ha)

The continued beach nourishment scheme will replace material eroding from Dooey Strand which is being transported along the shoreline by natural currents and long shore drift and deposited within the confines of the harbour.

The sand will be excavated by 360° tracked excavators working at low tide and loaded on articulated dumpers to be brought to the intertidal beach nourishment site where it will be spread evenly also using a 360° low bearing tracked excavator. Previous campaigns have demonstrated that the deposited sand on the foreshore is generally levelled by tidal action with the material naturally dispersing on the incoming and outgoing tide. The work is restricted by tide therefore there is no unsightly build up of sediment along Dooey Strand during the 5-6 day period of the works. Access to this section of the works (deposition site) is restricted to leisure users (walkers etc.) during the course of the works to ensure the safety of the public.

This work is carried out during low tide over a 5-6 day period coinciding with the Spring tide in March/April each year to give best access to the entire berthing area. In 2021 the works will be carried out from 27^{th} March -1^{st} April working between the hours of 10:00am and 3:00pm each day. The works will be carried out in a similar period in subsequent years coinciding with the Spring equinoctial tides.

	We are in constant communication with users and in particular the ferry operator in regard to navigational safety. We also consult with the Marine Survey Office. A bathymetric survey has recently been undertaken to establish the presence of a channel/ridge or high points beyond the pier.

	The Tory Island ferry operates a regular service from Magheraroarty pier and there are 2 No. commercial vivier fishing vessels as well as various seasonal fishing vessels and leisure craft.

	The proposed works will facilitate all marine activity and there will only be minor disruptions during the course of the works.
