- 2. The beef and beef offal come from cattle that were not:
  - a. suspect or confirmed BSE cases;
  - b. reared with a confirmed BSE case during their first year of life;
  - c. born in the same herd as a confirmed BSE case during the year preceding and following the birth of the said confirmed BSE case.
- 3. The beef and beef offal come from cattle that were found free from any clinical evidence of animal infectious disease and are approved for human consumption as a result of ante- and post-mortem veterinary inspections conducted by the competent authority of Ireland or the exporting countries.
- 4. The beef and beef offal were handled in a hygienic manner in order to prevent contamination with any causative agent of animal infectious disease until shipment to Japan.
- 5. The beef and beef offal were only handled in facilities approved for exportation to Japan.
- 6. The beef and beef offal were handled, packed and stored in clean and sanitary conditions in line with the Irish and EU sanitary regulations and considered as equivalent to Japanese sanitary requirements.
- 7. The beef and beef offal meet the Export Verification Program (EVP) requirements.
