SOUTHERN FISHERIES REGION (RIVER NORE AND KINGS RIVER)

BYE-LAW NO. C.S. 280, 2004

I, John Browne, Minister of State at the Department of Communications, Marine and Natural Resources, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 9 (as amended by section 3 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962 (No. 31 of 1962)) of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act 1959 (No. 14 of 1959), section 33 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1962, the Fisheries (Transfer of Departmental Administration and Ministerial Functions) Order 1977 (S.I. No. 30 of 1977) (as adapted by the Marine (Alteration of Name of Department and Title of Minister) Order 2002 (S.I. No. 307 of 2002)) and the Communications, Marine and Natural Resources (Delegation of Ministerial Functions) Order 2002 (S.I. No. 374 of 2002), hereby make the following Bye-law:

- 1. This Bye-law may be cited as the Southern Fisheries Region (River Nore and Kings River) Bye-law No. C.S. 280, 2004.
- 2. This Bye-law shall come into operation on the day of its making.
- 3. Notwithstanding anything contained in article 6 of the No. 3 or Waterford District Close season Bye-law No. 105, 1952, the annual close season for angling for trout with rod and line in that part of the River Nore from the confluence of the Kings River downstream to Mount Juliet Boundary and in that part of the Kings River from Innisnag Bridge to the confluence of the River Nore and including both banks of both Rivers shall commence in the year 2004 on the 4 October 2004.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This is not part of the Bye-law and does not purport to be a legal interpretation).

This Bye-law defers the commencement date in 2004 of the annual close season for angling for trout with rod and line in that part of the River Nore from the confluence of the Kings River downstream to Mount Juliet Boundary and in that part of the Kings River from Innisnag Bridge to the confluence of the River Nore and including both banks of both Rivers to 4 October 2004.

FOOTNOTE

Section 11 of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act, 1959 provides that any person aggrieved by this Bye-law may within 28 days after its publication in the Iris Oifigiuil, appeal against same to the High Court.
