Thus in the SDCC area the PPN is dominated by Tallaght /Lucan? Clondalkin. Issues facing areas like Knocklyon, Rathfarnham, Templeogue or neglected because they do not have enough Votes at PPN meetings.

The PPN is ineffective because the Councillors see it as competing with them and the Council see it as a nuisance being another body that is interfering with their work. THe PPN should be more involved with community developments and should be a voice that the Council listen to.

The PPN Resource worker for each area needs to be better funded so they can give the time ,energy and ability to be actively supporting all the PPN bodies in their area.

The relationship is one of pretense. The council pays lip service to listening to the PPN but does not take their advice into account. On many occasions at meetings, the PPN volunteer is more informed than the Councillors or the Council officials.
