EASTERN FISHERIES REGION (RIVER SLANEY) (ANGLING)

BYE-LAW NO. C.S.272, 2000

I, Frank Fahey, Minister for the Marine and Natural Resources, in exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 9 (as amended) by section 3 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act, 1962 (No. 31 of 1962), and section 50 of the Fisheries Act, 1980 (No. 1 of 1980)), of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act, 1959 (No. 14 of 1959), and section 33 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act, 1962, and the Fisheries (Transfer of Departmental Administration and Ministerial Functions) Order, 1977 (S.I. No. 30 of 1977) (as adapted by the Marine (Alteration of Name of Department and Title of Minister) Order, 1997 (S.I. No. 301 of 1997)), hereby make the following Bye-law:

- 1. This Bye-law may be cited as the Eastern Fisheries Region (River Slaney) (Angling) Bye-law No. C.S. 272, 2000.
- 2. This Bye-law shall come into operation on the 26th day of February, 2000.
- 3. Angling for salmon or trout with rod and line is hereby prohibited in the River Slaney and its tributaries during the period commencing on the 26th day of February, 2000 and ending on the 9th day of March, 2000.
- 4. In this Bye-law, "salmon" and "trout" shall have the meanings assigned to them by section 3 of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act, 1959 (No.14 of 1959), as amended.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This is not part of the Bye-law and does not purport to be a legal interpretation).

This Bye-law extends the close season for angling for salmon and trout in the River Slaney and its tributaries until and including 9th March, 2000.

FOOTNOTE

Section 11 of the Fisheries (Consolidation) Act, 1959 provides that any person aggrieved by this Bye-law may within 28 days after its publication in the Irish Oifigiuil, appeal against same to the High Court.
