# Spending Review 2021 – Overview, Aims & Objectives



### Overview

- Expenditure on General Practice Fees & Allowances is one of the largest items of expenditure with the HSE's Primary Care Reimbursement Service.
- Expenditure was almost €800m in 2020 an increase of almost 50% over the 2018-2020 period.

### **Aims and Objectives**

• This note seeks to analyse in greater detail the policy and other drivers behind this increase as well as articulate the extent to which Covid-19 drove this increase.

# Spending Review 2021 – Key Findings



## **Key Policy Relevant Findings**

- The paper finds that the Covid-19 pandemic has driven a significant proportion of the expenditure in 2020.
- Further, the paper finds that some of fees have a questionable rationale from an Exchequer point of view most notably in cases of additional payments are made in respect of triages for those patients already covered under the GMS.
- It is recommended that all temporary emergency fees are time-bound through legislation and subject to regular review.
