During the day, Anna Pang works in the motor tax department in the Council in Dundalk. and in the evenings she spends her time raising money and assembling Chemo Packs for cancer patients.

For the last four years Anna is

has been part of a team of three, however for her fifth year carrying out the project, it is just

her and her mother.

With four products in the packages which are sensitive inclusive for those undergoing chemo, Anna puts a chemo friendly deodorant containing no aluminium and is rec-ommended by oncologists, a soothing mouth gel helping with mouth ulcers and sores. A lip balm comes is included a chemo patients are prone to dry lips. The last product is a soothing soap which helps with dry skin all over.
A small gift is added into the

bag, that usually being a game to take the patients minds off their treatment, or socks to keep their feet warm.

Children from churches and preschools get involved by drawing a picture for patients and is added into the bags.

Anna got the idea to run this almost five years ago when she saw nurses in the UK putting

similar packages together.
"I thought, that's a lovely idea, let's jump on board with that," Anna said, explaining she wanted to get involved as everyone is affected in some
