#### **Modelling Update**

- The Chair gave a presentation to update the group on the performance of the models regarding the recent Omicron wave and put forward a number of proposals on how they could be improved.
- It was agreed the models performed well but likely underestimated infections and significantly overestimated admissions to critical care. It was proposed that the focus over the next few weeks should be on refining the CHUP model and re-running the SEIR models with a reduced number of scenarios.
- The group discussed the utility of carrying out a seroprevalence study to establish the level of
  population-based immunity which would be used to improve future projections. It was agreed
  that this would be beneficial, but members were conscious that recovery from one variant
  may not confer a person with immunity to another variant and that this would have to be
  taken into consideration.
- The group considered the issue of long covid.
- The group discussed the under-ascertainment of cases and work being carried out to estimate the extent to which it occurs.

### **HPSC Update/ Epidemiology Progress Update**

- Secondments within the HPSC have been extended to allow for work to continue. Regarding
  the establishment of the modelling and statistics unit within the HPSC, the additional funding
  to the HPSC for this purpose was not granted by the HSE.
- There is a meeting planned for Friday 14th January between IEMAG, CMP and HPSC to discuss these collaboration further.
- There was no update on the geospatial work over Christmas. LEA data was suspended over the holiday period but has now recommenced.

#### **Data Engineering Group Update**

• The group is working on a case study based around close contacts which will integrate data from CIDR, CCT and CoVax. The aim is to develop a data asset and a white paper for future information needs. Going forward, fortnightly meetings involving all stakeholders will be held to discuss governance matters. The groups is currently working to ensure data owners have clear sight of how it is to be integrated and analysed.

# AOB

The group discussed the importance of the timely establishment of a dedicated modelling unit
withing the HPSC in order to allow for a successful transition of work from the IEMAG to the
new unit. Members were concerned that the learnings acquired since the IEMAG was stood
up would be lost if this unit is not established before the IEMAG stands down.
