But they never mentioned this either publicly or privately to companies and tax audits never raised the matter.</li> <li>Revenue's claim that some companies have been "non-compliant" is untrue. Inspectors in different tax districts made different determinations on the VAT status, often for the same products. Companies complied with the determinations in their own tax district.</li> <li>To impose a tax that will unfairly discriminate people who want to take responsibility for their health – particularly the elderly, disabled and those in poverty – is clearly unjust.</li> <li>The imposition of VAT on food supplements will inevitably lead to an increased dependence on the already over-burdened health system, as people find themselves unable to afford the products.</li> </ul>	
The imposition of VAT on food supplements doesn't make sense, either financially (given the revenue it will raise) or from a health perspective. The government should be encouraging and enabling citizens to help themselves stay as healthy as possible. A zero VAT rate on food supplements is in the interests of the nation as a whole!
