## BYE-LAW.

### No. 6<sup>2</sup>, or Bantry District.

### COUNTY CORK.

*By Bye-law No 487*

THE use of all Nets (except Landing Nets as auxiliary to Angling with Rod and Line,) for the capture of Salmon or Trout is hereby prohibited in the Freshwater portions of the Rivers Snave or Coomhola, Mealagh or Dunnemark, Ouvane or Ballylickey, and Carrigboy, all in the County of Cork. Any Person offending against this Bye-Law shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum of Five Pounds, and all Nets used contrary to this Bye-Law shall be forfeited.
