BYE-LAW.

No. 12, or SLIGO DISTRICT.

LOUGH DOON

COUNTY LEITRIM.

WE, the Inspectors of Irish Fisheries acting under the authority of the above-named Acts, do make and ordain this Bye-Law, by which it is permitted, and it is here by permitted, to use Nets for the Capture of Fish with Meshes of half-an-inch from knot to knot (to be measured along the side of the square, or two inches to be measured all round each such Mesh, such measurements being taken in the clear when the Net is wet), in Lough Doon, in the County of Leitrim.
