BYE-LAW.

STRANGFORD LOUGH.

DUNDALK DISTRICT.

We, the Inspectors of Irish Fisheries acting under the authority of the above-named Acts, do make and ordain this Bye-Law by which it is prohibited and it is hereby prohibited to use for the Capture of Fish Nets of the description commonly called and known as Poke Nets in Strangford Lough, inside or Northward of a line drawn across said Lough from Mullog Point on the Western side to Bally-quintin Point on the Eastern side of the said Lough, both in the County of Down, between the last day of January and the 1st day of November in each year.

Any Person offending against this Bye-Law shall forfeit and pay for each Offence a sum of Three Pounds, and any Net used contrary to this Bye-Law will be forfeited.
