BYE-LAW.

No. 1, or DUBLIN DISTRICT.

WE, the Inspectors of Irish Fisheries, acting under the authority of the above-named Acts, do make and ordain this Bye-Law, by which it is permitted, and it is hereby permitted, to use Nets for the capture of Salmon or Trout, with Meshes of one-inch from knot to knot (to be measured along the side of the square, or four inches to be measured all round each such Mesh, such measurements being taken in the clear when the Net is wet), in that part of the Dublin District situated between Dalkey Island, in the County of Dublin, on the North, and Wicklow Head, in the County of Wicklow, on the South.
