DRIIFT NETS.

BYE-LAWS, RULES, AND REGULATIONS.

WE, the Inspectors of Irish Fisheries, in pursuance of the powers and authorities in us vested by the above-named Acts, do hereby repeal and rescind the Bye-Law dated 2nd November, 1870, regulating Drift Net Fishing, and in lieu thereof do make and ordain the following **Bye-Laws, Rules, and Regulations** to be observed by all persons engaged in **Fishing for or taking Salmon or Trout in the Lismore District** :—

- Articles 1 & 2 rescinded by Bye-Law No 512 of 1945.*
- 1st. That no drift nets of greater length than 200 yards shall be used for the capture of Salmon and Trout in the Rivers or Estuaries flowing into the sea between Helvick Head and Ballycotton, or in the sea between those points:
 - 2nd. That no two or more drift nets when fishing shall be attached together in any way:
 - 3rd. That drift nets shall not be used at a less distance from each other than 50 yards in that portion of the River Blackwater situated within one mile of the mouth of the River as at present defined, each drift net shot and drifting to be kept at a distance of not less than 50 yards from the one preceding it on the tide and already drifting.

Any person offending against these **Bye-Laws, Rules, and Regulations** shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum of **Five Pounds**, and all nets used contrary to these **Bye-Laws, Rules, &c.**, shall be forfeited.
