BYE-LAW.

SEA COAST BETWEEN DUNAFF HEAD AND DUNMORE HEAD, CO. DONEGAL.

The use of Nets commonly called and known as Draw or Wade Nets for the capture of White Sea Fish is hereby prohibited on that part of the Sea Coast and in the Tidal parts of all Rivers flowing into the Sea between Dunaff Head and Dunmore Head, and around the Shores of Inishtrahull, all in the County of Donegal.

Any person offending against this Bye-Law shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum of Three Pounds; and all such Nets, so used contrary to this Bye-Law, will be forfeited.
