BYE-LAW.

No. 3, or Waterford District.

RIVER NORE

AND ITS TRIBUTARIES.

The use of all Nets (save and except Landing Nets as auxiliary to Angling with Rod and Line) for the capture of Salmon or Trout is hereby prohibited in any part of the Upper or Fresh Water portions of the River Nore and its Tributaries in the Counties of Carlow, Kilkenny, and Queen's County, and in the City of Kilkenny; save and except in the Several Fishery next above the Tidal Flow. Any person offending against this Bye-Law shall forfeit and

shall be forfeited.
