BY-LAW.

WEXFORD DISTRICT. No. 2, or


River Slaney and Tributaries.

WHEREAS an application was made to Us, the Inspectors of Irish Fisheries, to prohibit all Net Fishing at the Mouth of the River Slaney as injurious to the free passage of Salmon. And Whereas We held an inquiry into said application in the Month of November, 1899.

And Whereas it seems to Us, the said Inspectors of Irish Fisheries, to be expedient for the more effectual government, management, protection, and improvement of the Salmon Fisheries of the said River Slaney to make the following By-Law.

Now, We, the said Inspectors of Irish Fisheries, acting under the powers and authorities given to us, do make and ordain the following By-Law:-

It is hereby prohibited to use any Net at or near that part of the Mouth of the River Slaney comprised within the space bounded by imaginary lines drawn from the Coast Guard Watch House on the Townland of Rosslarefort to Dellock Bank; from Bullock Bank to Raven Point; from Raven Point to Molly's Buoy; from Molly's Buoy to McGuire's Buoy; thence to Cull Buoy; and thence to the Wharf on the aforesaid Townland of Rosslarefort—the space within which such use of any net is prohibited being marked blue on the following map or plan.
