## BY-LAWS.

### RIVER MOY AND TRIBUTARIES— ANGLING FOR TROUT.

By the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction  
for Ireland.

WHEREAS, a public inquiry was held at Ballina on the 15th day of October, 1903, into the operation of a By-Law dated 11th February, 1871, which was approved of by the Lord Lieutenant and Privy Council of Ireland on the 11th day of April, 1872, [and which prohibited the capture of Trout in the River Moy and its Tributaries, situated in the Counties of Sligo and Mayo, by means of Rods and Lines, during the Months of April and May in each year: provided that nothing therein contained was to be construed to affect Angling for Trout during said Months of April and May in any part of Loughs Conn and Cullin], with the object of repealing the same, or of making such By-Laws, Rules or Regulations as might be deemed expedient in lieu thereof.

And Whereas, having considered the evidence taken at said inquiry, the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland are of opinion that it is expedient to repeal said By-Law of the 11th day of February, 1871; and to make another By-Law in lieu thereof.

Now, the Department, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act, 1899, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby repeal the said By-Law of the 11th day of February, 1871; and do make and ordain the following By-Law in lieu thereof:—

It is hereby prohibited to capture Trout by means of Rods and Lines, during the Months of April and May in each year, in all parts of the River Moy and its Tributaries which are accessible to Salmon, save in all Lakes on the course of the said River and its Tributaries.

Any Person offending against this By-Law shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum of Three Pounds, and every Rod, Line or Hook used in committing such offence shall be forfeited.
