BY-LAW.

Herring Fishing off County Donegal Coast.

By the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction
for Ireland.

The Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act, 1899, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby make and ordain this By-Law, by which it is prohibited, and it is hereby prohibited, to have any drift net for the capture of herrings on board any fishing vessel, during the month of April in each year, within three miles of any part of the Coast which extends from the Bloody Foreland to Malin Head, both in the County of Donegal.

Any person offending against this By-Law shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum not exceeding Five Pounds, and all Nets used contrary to this By-Law shall be forfeited.
