BY-LAWS.

Trawling—Kenmare Bay.

By the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland.

The Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act, 1899, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf:—

I. Do hereby REPEAL the By-Law of the 7th day of June, 1894, which was as follows:—

The method of Fishing known as Trawling is hereby prohibited in that part of Kenmare Bay situated between the following imaginary lines, during the months of September, October, November and December in each year:—

- a. A straight line from the Western Point of Rossdohan Island to the Western Point of the entrance to Kilmakilloge Harbour.
- b. A straight line from Lackeen Point to Boat Cove, on the opposite shore.
- II. AND IN LIEU THEREOF do hereby enact the following

The method of Fishing known as Trawling is hereby prohibited during the months of January, October, November and December in each year, in Kenmare Bay, between the following imaginary lines, namely:—

- a. A straight line from Lackeen Point to Boat Cove, both in the County of Kerry.
- b. A straight line from Illaunroe, in the County of Kerry, to Kilcatherine Point, in the County of Cork.

Note.—By the 9th Section of the 5th and 6th Viotoria, Cap. 106, it is enacted that every person who shall use any Trawl Net at any season or any place when or where he use of the same shall have been prohibited by any By-Law, shall forfeit every such Net o used, and shall for every such offence also forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £20.
