BY-LAWS.

Trawling off part of the Coast of the County of Down.

By the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland.

The Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act, 1899, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby repeal the By-Law dated 3rd December, 1851, which prohibited the use of Trawl Nets off the Coast of the County of Down, within a straight line from Hellyhunter Rock, off Cranfield Point, to St. John's Point.

And in lieu thereof do make and ordain the following By-Law:—

It is hereby prohibited to use any Trawl Net within or landwards of imaginary straight lines from the Chapel (near Miners' Town) at Rossglass Bay, to Roaring Rock, and thence to the nearest point of the mainland.

NOTICE.

Copies of the above proposed By-Laws have been lodged with the Clerk of the Peace for the County of Down; and with Clerks of Petty Sessions for the Districts of Killeel, Newcastle, Castlewellan, Seaforde, Downpatrick, and Ardglass (County Down).

And all persons concerned are hereby required to take NOTICE that the said By-Laws will, at the expiration of ONE CALENDAR MONTH from the posting hereof, be lodged for approval and sanction with the LORD LIEUTENANT in COUNCIL, to whom any person who considers himself aggrieved thereby is entitled to appeal.

Pending such approval and sanction these proposed By-Laws have no legal authority or validity; and any person infringing the existing By-Law in the meantime will be liable to prosecution.
