BY-LAW.

No. 9¹, OR GALWAY DISTRICT.

By the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland.

The Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act, 1899, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do make and ordain the following By-Law:—

It is hereby prohibited to have in possession between sunrise and sunset for the purpose of taking fish or with the intent to take fish at any season of the year, in or on the Banks of the upper or fresh water portions of all Rivers and their Tributaries in the No. 9¹, or Galway District, any Pole, Otter, Spear, Lyster, Strokehaul, Gaff, or any part or portion of a Gaff (except a Gaff for the purpose of being used solely as auxiliary to fishing legally with rod and line).

Each and every person offending against the above By-Law shall, for each offence, forfeit and pay a sum of TWO POUNDS.
