BY-LAW.

No. 14, OR LETTERKENNY DISTRICT:

No. 151, OR LONDONDERRY DISTRICT

No. 152, OR COLERAINE DISTRICT:

AND

No. 16, OR BALLYCASTLE DISTRICT.

By the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland.

WHEREAS by the By-Laws dated 3rd October, 1912, it is prohibited to use for the capture of Salmon or Trout in the Tidal Waters of the No. 14, or Letterkenny District, the No. 15¹, or Londonderry District, the No. 15², or Coleraine District, and the No. 16, or Ballycastle District, any Drift Net of greater length than 1,500 yards, or any number of Drift Nets joined together in such a way that their total length shall be greater than 1,500 yards.

AND WHEREAS the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland are of opinion that the practice of keeping on board boats in the said Tidal Waters of the said Districts of Drift Nets of a greater length than may be legally used in the said Tidal Waters is detrimental to the fisheries of the said Districts and are also of opinion that the following restriction is necessary and expedient for the more effectual government, management, protection and improvement of the fisheries of the said Districts.

NOW the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act, 1899, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do make and ordain the following By-Law:—

It is hereby prohibited to have on board any boat, cot or curragh in the Tidal Waters of the said No. 14, or Letterkenny District, No. 15¹, or Londonderry District, No. 15², or Coleraine District, and No. 16, or Ballycastle District, any Drift Net of greater length than 1,500 yards, or any number of Drift Nets which if joined together would in their total length be greater than 1,500 yards, for the capture of Salmon or Trout.

Each and every person offending against the above By-Law shall, for each offence, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding FIVE POUNDS.
