BY-LAW.

TRAMMEL NETS.

COAST OF THE COUNTY OF WICKLOW.

By the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland.

The Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act, 1899, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and being of opinion that Trammel Nets for the capture of Sea Fish may be used between sunrise and sunset without injury to the fisheries in the area hereinafter described, do hereby make and ordain the following By-Law:—

It is hereby PERMITTED to use Trammel Nets, any such Net not to exceed six feet in depth measured from the foot rope to the cork rope when mounted and ready for use, for the capture of Sea Fish between sunrise and sunset within two geographical miles seaward of low water mark along that part of the Coast of the County of Wicklow which is situate between Bray Head and an imaginary straight line running due east from Kilcoole Railway Station.
