BY-LAW

By the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland.

The Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act, 1899, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and being of opinion that in that part of the No. 5 or Cork District which comprises all Rivers and their Lakes and Tributaries that flow into the Sea between Barry's Head (east of Oyster Haven) and Galley Head, all in the County of Cork, the practice of removing from the fresh waters Salmon and Trout and the Fry thereof not killed or taken by lawful means is detrimental to the fisheries of the said part of said District, and being also of opinion that the following restriction is necessary and expedient for the more effectual government, management, protection and improvement of the fisheries of the said part of said District, DO MAKE AND ORDAIN THE FOLLOWING BY-LAW :—

No person shall remove or cause to be removed by any means from any part of the fresh waters of the said part of said District any Salmon or Trout or the Fry thereof not killed or taken by lawful means, or any Salmon or Trout or the Fry thereof found dead from any cause whatsoever, PROVIDED ALWAYS that the provisions of this By-Law shall not apply to any Officer of the Board of Conservators of Fisheries for the said District, acting under the instructions of the said Board, or to any owner of a Fishery or his Agent acting under the written authority of the said Board, or to any Officer or Constable of the Royal Irish Constabulary or to any Sanitary Officer, in so far as the removal or causing to be removed from said waters of any diseased Salmon or Trout or Fry thereof, or of any Salmon or Trout or Fry thereof found dead from any cause whatsoever is concerned.

Each and every person offending against this By-Law shall, for each offence, forfeit and pay a sum not exceeding FIVE POUNDS.
