## No. 17<sup>1</sup>, OR DROGHEDA DISTRICT. BY-LAWS

By the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland.

The Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act, 1899, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, and being of opinion that the following restrictions are necessary and expedient for the more effectual government, management, protection, and improvement of the fisheries of the District defined and known as the No. 17<sup>1</sup>, or Drogheda District, DO MAKE AND ORDAIN THE FOLLOWING BY-LAWS:—

1. It is hereby prohibited to use any Drift Net for the capture of Salmon or Trout in the Tidal Waters of the No. 17<sup>1</sup> or Drogheda District between imaginary lines drawn east (true) from the points at which the said District is defined to north and south respectively.

2. It is hereby prohibited to have any Drift Net for the capture of Salmon or Trout on board any boat in the Tidal Waters of the No. 17<sup>1</sup>, or Drogheda District, between imaginary lines drawn east (true) from the points at which the said District is defined to north and south respectively.

Each and every person offending against either of the above By-Laws shall, for each offence, forfeit and pay a sum of FIVE POUNDS, and all Nets used contrary thereto shall be forfeited.
