BY-LAW

By the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland.

Bye-law No 48

The Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act, 1899, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, DO MAKE AND ORDAIN THE FOLLOWING BY-LAW:—

It is hereby prohibited to use any net (except a landing net used solely as auxiliary to fishing legally with rod and line) for the capture of salmon or trout or with the intent to take salmon or trout in that part of the River Blackwater above or upstream of the western boundaries of the townlands of Glen More and Glencairn (in the Barony of Coshmore and Coshbride, County Waterford), and in the tributaries which enter the said part of the said River.

Each and every person offending against the above By-Law shall, for each offence, forfeit and pay a sum of FIVE POUNDS, and every net used contrary thereto shall be forfeited.
