RIVER FEALE.

BY-LAW

By the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland.

The Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act, 1899, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, DO MAKE AND ORDAIN THE FOLLOWING BY-LAW:—

It is hereby prohibited to capture, or attempt to capture, fish in that part of the River Feale which is situated within a distance of fifty yards downstream from the crest of the Mill Dam across the said River in the Townlands of Curraghatoosane and Island-macloughry, near the Town of Listowel.

Each and every person offending against the above By-Law shall, for each offence, forfeit and pay a sum of FIVE POUNDS; and every engine used contrary thereto shall be forfeited.

In witness whereof the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland have hereunto set their official seal this Eighteenth day of November, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Nineteen.
