BYE-LAW.

BANDON RIVER, COUNTY CORK.

WHEREAS by a Bye-Law bearing date the 4th day of presents, 1866, made by the Special Commissioners for Irish Fisheres, and approved of by His Excellency the Lord Lieutenant in Counce at the 17th day of January, 1868, the us of all Nets (except Landing Nets as auxiliary to angling with Rod and Line) for the Capture of Salmon or Trout was prohibited for the space. Three Years in any part of the Bandon River, in the County of Cork, or its Tributaries, above a line drawn across the said River, at right angles with the River's Course from the Northern point of the Quay at the Mouth of the Creek between the Townlands of Rockhorse and Kilmacsimon, to a point on the opposite Shore, in the Towland of Lahern.

And whereas We, the Inspectors of Irish Fisheries, deem it expedient, for the more effectual improvement of the Salmon Fisheries of the said River, that the aforesaid prohibition, which will expire on the 4th day of December, 1869, should be renewed for a further period of Three Years, Now We, the said Inspectors of Irish Fisheries, by virtue of the authority in this behalf vested in us by the above-mentioned Acts, do make and ordain this present Bye-Law, and do hereby prohibit for the space of Three Years from the 4th day of December, 1869, the use of Nets (except Landing Nets as auxiliary to angling with Rod and Line) for the Capture of Salmon or Trout in any part of the said Bandon River or its Tributaries, above a line drawn across the said River, at right angles with the River's Course from the Northern point of the Quay at the Mouth of the Creek between the Townlands of

Townland of Lahern.

Any person offending against this Bye-Law shall forfeit and pay for each offence a Sum of Five Pounds, and any Net used as aforesaid in committing such offence shall be forfeited.
