BYE-LAW.

LOUGH OF BELFAST.

WHEREAS by Bye-Law, duly made and published, and bearing date the Sixteenth day of February, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-seven, the use of Trawl Nets was prohibited, at all times, within that part of the Lough of Belfast comprised within a straight line drawn from the Castle of Carrickfergus, in the County of the Town of Carrickfergus, to Rockport, in the County of Down.

Now, in pursuance of the powers and authorities in us vested, We do hereby repeal and rescind the above recited Bye-Law, and the same is hereby repealed and rescinded accordingly.
