BYE-LAW.

GLANDORE HARBOUR.

WHEREAS, by a Bye-Law, bearing date the Eleventh day of September, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixtyone, "the use of Trawl Nets was prohibited between the First day of May and the First day of October in each year, within that part of the Harbour of Glandore lying to the northward of a straight line from the Telegraph or Signal Tower at 'Foilnashark' or 'Filenashawk,' on the north-eastern point of the entrance to the Harbour, and Sheela Point on the western shore, all in the County of Cork:"

Now, in pursuance of the powers and authorities in Us vested by the "Fisheries (Ireland) Act, 1869," We do hereby repeal and rescind the above recited Bye-Law, and the same is hereby repealed and rescinded accordingly.
