

Hedgerows Ireland is concerned that not enough focus is being placed on the role of older hedgerows for their roles in biodiversity and carbon sequestration

More accurate ways to measure carbon in hedgerows are emerging

At best they are taken for granted on farms and at worst they are cut back so brutally that the birds, bees and bugs that thrived in and on them lose their sources of food and shelter. But could the ubiquitous hedgerows on farms across Ireland be revalued for their carbon sequestration potential?

Hedgerows cover about 4 per cent of the Irish landscape or 689,000sq km if you use a broad definition of woody boundaries including lines of trees. Yet up until very recently they have been neglected for all the ecosystem services they can provide - from the alleviation of flooding to habitats for small mammals, birds and insects and as a potentially valuable store for carbon on Irish farms.

Shockingly, only about a third of hedgerows in Ireland are in good condition. Historically, many hedgerows were removed by farmers enlarging fields; however, changes to the Common Agricultural Policy (Cap) basic farm payments in 2009 required farmers to replant the same amount of hedges to compensate for any removed. "The biggest problem with the management of hedgerows on Irish farms is tidiness. People view farmers as bad

farmers if they don't cut their hedges," says Catherine Keena, countryside management specialist with Teagasc.

Keena runs Teagasc Hedgerow Week in December which offers advice to farmers on how to maintain their hedgerows.

"Hedgerows should never be cut 'short, back and sides'. Hedges need to be kept dense at the base and the top kept as high as possible with flowering thorns left to grow to their natural height every 300 metres or so," Keena explains. So-called escaped hedges (for example, a line of trees on a boundary) should never be topped, according to Keena, whose main focus is the management of hedgerows for biodiversity.

But now, with much greater focus on the need for farmers to reduce their greenhouse gas emissions as part of Ireland's Climate Action Plan, there is a scramble to identify ways that farmers can – or already do – sequester carbon on their land to allow for a more balanced picture of carbon emissions versus carbon storage in land use.

Satellites and drones

Teagasc has used satellites and drones to map the overall footprint of hedgerows in Ireland but closer observations on the height, width and density is required to get a more accurate picture of the carbon sequestration of hedgerows.

In 2022, the Ordnance Survey of Ireland (OSI) will publish the first national land cover and habitat map for Ireland which will provide a definitive baseline for hedgerow cover in Ireland. Meanwhile, the Teagasc farm carbon project is doing field work to establish the carbon storage and sequestration rates of different hedgerow types while also looking at the different constituents of each hedgerow (above- and below-ground biomass, leaf litter and soil organic carbon). The hedgerows are also surveyed by drone to create 3D models to calculate the biomass carbon stock based on volume. The aim is that the farm carbon project will then allow calculation of carbon stock in hedgerows at farm level.

"We are developing the methodology to allow us to assess the carbon stocks in hedgerows over time," explains Lilian O'Sullivan, principal investigator on the farm carbon project, the results of which are due in September 2022.

By the end of 2022 it is expected that the combined work of Teagasc and the OSI will provide accurate baseline data for carbon stored in hedgerows so the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) can include it in Ireland's annual greenhouse gas inventory for the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change.

Currently, estimates of carbon storage in forestry, croplands grasslands and wetlands (with hedgerows included as landscape features within crop land and grassland categories) are reported in Ireland's greenhouse gas emissions inventory in Land Use and Land Use Change and Forestry. However, emissions and removals of greenhouse gases associated with land-based activities are not included in the national total emissions figure, according to the EPA. Researchers have already shown that hedgerows that are wider, thicker and taller sequester more carbon. Older hedgerows are also more valuable for carbon storage and biodiversity than newly-planted ones, which take between 30 and 40 years to store as much carbon as older hedgerows.

The environmental non–governmental organisation Hedgerows Ireland is concerned that not enough focus is being placed on the role of older hedgerows on farms for their roles in biodiversity and carbon sequestration.

"Small changes in hedge-cutting techniques and regimes could double or treble carbon sequestration, according to the latest research. Allowing hedges to grow to two or three metres instead of the prevalent fashion for 1.5 metres would make a big difference and further changes such as three-year rotation of cutting regimes or side cutting only would multiply the benefits," says Alan Moore from Hedgerows Ireland.

Moore also believes that farmers won't change their approach to managing hedgerows unless these changes are stipulated in the new Cap. In particular, Hedgerows Ireland recommends the wording for proposed new eco schemes in the Pillar 1 basic farm payment (called the basic income support for sustainability) in the new Cap should include a basic requirement that hedgerows are left a minimum of two metres high and either side cut only or not cut for the duration of the scheme.

Moore suggests that more advanced measures for hedgerow quality (species diversity, carbon stored in soil and biomass, etc) should be integrated in the Pillar 2 agri–environmental schemes of the new Cap.

"The unnecessary over-management of hedges is benefitting nobody and wasting valuable resources. Bigger, taller hedges need not look messy or unkempt. When skilfully managed, they can enhance the look of the farm and massively benefit wildlife," Moore adds.

Habitats

Ireland's submission on the Cap are due to be sent to the European Commission for scrutiny by <u>January 1st</u>. The Department of Agriculture, Food and the Marine says "protection and enhancement of habitats including hedgerows is covered in many areas of the Cap strategic plan".

"It is proposed . . . that a minimum of 4 per cent of each farm must be devoted to ecologically beneficial features such as hedgerows and other nature and biodiversity-rich features. This will place a direct economic value on

retaining and, where necessary, creating these features," it adds.

A flagship multi-annual agri-environmental climate measure is also proposed so certain types of farmers will be rewarded for the quality of hedgerows and treelines.

Whatever measures to improve hedgerow management are eventually decided on in the Cap will no doubt be even more important once the EU certification scheme for carbon farming is introduced by the end of 2022.

Only then will farmers across Europe have clearer opportunities to embark on so-called carbon farming in a way that could transform farming practices both for farmers and for the environment.

When looking for guidance around forestry, he was encouraged to grow Sitka Spruce and other non-native pines instead of the oak, beech and larch trees they went ahead with I didn't appreciate it so much at the time, but it took considerable courage of conviction to do what they did and I am enormously proud of them for it As you can imagine though, grants are not significant and do not offer a sufficient income We are surely missing a trick here?

I realised growing up that soil quality in the north-West of Ireland is not renowned for growing crops but it does produce good grass. This inevitably leads to beef and milk production I learned that (certainly in this part of Ireland), farm sizes are very small and incomes too low I learned that farmers care deeply about their land, the waterways and their animals

It is vital that we support farmers to farm in an ethical and sustainable way. We know that the vast majority of farmers act in responsible ways and act as custodians of our lands. They care deeply about animal welfare and the environment. Moreover, many farmers actually want a sector that is both environmentally sustainable and which provides an income worthy of the quality products they work so hard to produce

Today, too many farmers are farming and working a second job and this is unacceptable given the quality of the offerings from our Irish farms. We must work with and for farmers to move towards a model that is sustainable in all senses of the word. We must work with farmers to ensure sustainable incomes and sustainable practices are at the forefront of policy making going forward

CAP funding offers policy makers the greatest opportunity yet to do just that We must ensure subsidies are prioritised for low carbon and sustainable agriculture practices. Incentives and choices that help us move towards that goal have to and must form part of any new agricultural policy

Ireland has the third highest emissions rates in the EU and our failure to take actions to cut emissions not only hurts our climate and nature, but our pockets too Green News reported recently that our failure to meet Climate targets means Ireland will have to pay \in 150 million in carbon offset credits plus \in 125 million in fines. These are significant amounts and they will continue to be imposed upon us until we act. Governments have signed us up, claimed the credit for this publicly and yet failed utterly to anything much to reach our goals. Our planet cannot wait for politicians afraid to make difficult decisions. Personal responsibility alone won't fix this. System change is clearly necessary and all we have left. The time to act has long since passed and so it must begin now

Sustainable farming objectives, the UN Sustainable Development Goals, the principles of a Just Transition and actions that will go towards the ending of World Hunger should all form fundamental pillars of any new agricultural policy

Farmers must be encouraged to rear animals in humane ways. We have to actively work towards a targeted reduction in herd numbers, which can be done using CAP funding to offer farmers incentives to diversify their offering. Methods for help reduce methane emissions should also be explored and implemented, such as using

Over grazing, excessive drainage and loss of habitats must be discouraged while the restoration of peat bogs and natural forests emboldened A Just Transition must form part of any policy change so that workers, farmers and communities are not left behind Successive Governments have had years and years to prepare for this moment and have let us all down Farmers fear paying the price They must be supported in any sustainable farming practice changes and feel confident that such support will be

Diversification is an important step This could include increasing the proportion of land given over to native forests Rewilding of lands is also absolutely vital Farmers should be incentivised and provided the choice to give back some or all of their land to nature in order to restore local, natural ecosystems. It should make financial sense to opt for native tree planting over mom-native fast growing pines. Such forests create a biodiversity desert beneath their Darin tree coverage. Native trees foster and reclaim native ecosystems underneath their leaves

Farmers must also be supported in ensuring our rivers are free flowing and free from pollutants Widely accepted practices that result in the run-off of slurry, silt, fertilisers and other chemicals into our rivers and streams must be discouraged and discontinued. We must acknowledge there is a huge issue around this and create solutions/incentives to end such practices and alternatives considered

It is widely accepted that there is a shift towards plant-based farming. Policy changes towards sustainable farming must take account of the quality of land and farming norms and culture across the county. It may be more difficult to diversify farming practices in Leitrim and Cavan than it is in Waterford or North Dublin. Local solutions must be provided for local problems

Resources, funding, training and other supports must be made available if this is to succeed A one size fits all approach will not work no matter Adar aspect of agricultural policy is being considered Funding should be provided for the extra administration that this might incur We must use technology and knowledge to create efficiency, better land use and cultivate sustainable farming practices and provide even better quality products



There are several examples described in Isabella Tree's work of how rewilded land upstream means that towns normally pulverised my flood water are, from then on, safe; it should protect us against some of the worry of drought, which we are increasingly facing, and give some species a chance to survive — I'm sure you will have seen the harrowing report about how Ireland is the 13th worst country in the world for biodiversity loss; we have almost nothing left.







My main concern is with the eco schemes and the lack of science and research being used in the proposals for these schemes as well as the lack of options for tillage farmers in the scheme.

Break crop in tillage.

The proposal to have a break crop on 25% of arable land goes against good crop rotation practices to prevent disease and pests with most break crops. Many break crops require as much as six years break. The response that farmers would grow two break crops is not practical on most tillage farms as the majority of tillage farms are working at a small scale. 25% also takes up a large amount of land reducing the area of a cash crop which can be grown. If we want more land in low emissions farming sectors like tillage we need to give farmers the power to make good business decisions.

Also the lack of inclusion of temporary grass, beet, maize and potatoes is also a missed opportunity.

As an example, maize is grown by many tillage farmers for livestock farmers and this often results in slurry being imported from the livestock farm to the tillage farm bringing nutrients, carbon and a break crop to help with soul structure to the ground.

GPS spreaders and sprayers.

While this measure makes sense is limiting to a small number of large scale farmers and therefore limiting its potential impact.

Navigation guidance would widen the measure out to much more farmers and therefore has a greater impact on reductions as farmers would be driving to the right distances and not overlapping.

Most farmers have a fertiliser spreader and contracting out this work can lead to less efficient use of fertilisers as it is put out at the one time rather than the most optimum time.

Nitrogen.

The inclusion of a chemical nitrogen reduction to 240kg N/ha on a stocking rate of 171 to 210kg N/ha will not result in this sector reaching nitrogen reduction targets by 2025 or 2030.

Space for nature.

Protein crops, catch crops and wild bird cover should be included in the space for nature.
