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


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

I am aware that farmers must utilise all of their land and when not in use they can rent land to other farmers.

Going forward, allowing farmers to "rewild" some of these lands is an important step in contributing to positive climate action and change. In cooperation with other neighbouring farmers, connecting fields or "corridors" through out Ireland can be set up.

These corridors would have hedgerow fencing instead of the standard posts and wires. Left to rewild, these corridors would begin to attract a much higher amount of biodiversity.

We must remember that 80% of our biodiversity means we are speaking of worms, insects, fungi and other such biodiversity. This means the soil can not be treated with faux fertiliser, any longer.

Clover is an excellent plant to retain water for summertime droughts and Clover is also an excellent plant to retain "methane gases" in its roots, so farmers with Cattle on their land, should be encouraged to border each field with the Clover plant, to be used as a counter balance plant to retain methane gases. There is also another plant(name?), in the offaly bogs, that can be used for the same purpose, but Clover would have the cheapest and quickest response time in this situation.

These are 3 or 4 small simple steps that can be taken, but will give enormous cheap and quick results for farmers to comply with regulations and to improve climate statistics for Ireland.

So please Let Farmers REWILD their land. The expertise is there, at ground level to help farmers, if we were allowed by government regulations,







I would like to make a submission on farm payments under the next phase of the **Common Agricultural Policy (2023 - 2027)**.

Firstly, I think it is widely understood that the system of direct payments that has applied in the past has very negatively impacted nature and wildlife around the country. In the area of the country that I am from, I have seen first-hand the ditches/hedge-rows being bulldozed into heaps, and the bogs drained. Incentivising farmers to farm every scrap of land and the system of GAEC (Good Agricultural and Environmental Condition) rules has driven this behaviour.

The Dáil declared a Biodiversity Emergency in 2019 – in view of this, the language in the GAEC is monumentally out of touch (e.g "Is applicant failing to take appropriate measures to prevent the encroachment of invading hardwood species onto land? (Invading hardwood species included scrub, briars, gorse etc.)"

The decline of nature and wildlife in our countryside is well documented. For my part, I can only say that and that the farmland hares, frogs, finches and lapwings that were there in my childhood are not there anymore.

I urge that the following be adopted:

Subsidy Payments - farmers to be given the option of rewilding, rather than farming, their land while continuing to receive farm subsidies at the same levels. This would require scrapping of the GAEC (Good Agricultural and Environmental Condition) as it currently stands. Payments under Pillar 1 should be allowed for land which is not farmed. Allowing a proportion of land to revert to meadow, scrub, woodland or wetland has carbon sink and biodiversity benefits.

Agri-environment Schemes - Research tells us (https://research.ie/assets/uploads/2018/05/NBER-FINAL-COPY.pdf) that Pillar 2 Agri-environment Schemes (REPS, AEOS, GLAS etc) intended to deliver biodiversity benefits have not delivered results. The vast majority of state spending under the heading of biodiversity flows through this channel and it is not acceptable that taxpayer money is spent without producing results. We urge that any payments under future schemes be (1) outcome-based with clear success metrics at farm level; (2) results are audited by people with ecological expertise.

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

Given we are living through an accelerating biodiversity crisis in Ireland, there is both an urgency and necessity to reward farmers for restoring natural habitat and enabling nature to thrive through rewilding efforts. This is particularly pertinent for peatlands, flood plains and native woodlands currently used for commercial purposes.

However, the financial subsidies for restoring or rewilding must be at the same level as if the land was used solely for commercial farming for this to have a meaningful impact.

Encouraging farmers to provide natural habitats for wildlife would greatly help our dwindling wildlife populations to recover. Furthermore, it would broaden the scope of farmers responsibilities, encouraging them to become true stewards of the land for all species. It would also improve soil quality, increase carbon sequestration potential, and reduce fertiliser and waste run off into nearby waterways.

This is a singular opportunity for a policy change to have a transformation effect and help reverse biodiversity collapse in Ireland.

I am making a submission on behalf of Transition Kerry to this CAP Strategic Plan on the following points, to ensure that the following Rewilding Principles be fully integrated into the overall CAP Strategic Plan. I am also attaching the document in PDF format.

- 1. That **Biodiversity/Biological Diversity** must be central to all schemes, funding streams and knowledge transfer programmes. *Biodiversity is the very Life Support of this planet and can no longer be taken for granted or ignored or exploited for profit at the cost of the Earth's health, which we all depend on.*
- 2. That the CAP Strategic Plan makes a statement of acknowledgement that we are currently in the <u>United Nations Decade of Ecosystem Restoration</u> and that the CAP is fully committed to making all structural decision and changes necessary to honour this commitment.
- 3. **Protection of existing habitats**, eg. hedgerows, woodlands, streams, rivers, wetlands, bogs, springs and other waters sources, etc.
- 4. **Appropriate maintenance of existing habitats**, with retraining of contractors as to how to lay and cut hedges correctly. This needs to involve bringing in expertise from organisations such as <u>The Hedge Laying Association of Ireland</u>
- 5. **Restoration of ecosystems** on the farm, including planting of native hedges, woodlands, thickets, allowing areas to become wetlands.
- 6. **Ecosystem Services and Natural Capital:** That the proper protection of Biodiversity be recognised as a fundamental system that provides essential ecosystem services and that farmers be recompensed for how they run their farm in line with these core principles. That the values of natural ecosystems are taken into account in the running of the farm, engaging with organisations such as Natural Capital Ireland and Home Tree to learn how to work with farmers in this area.
- 7. **Ecological Corridors** must be an integral part of the farm, to enable plants and animals to move around safely. This ensure both species and genetic diversity. Ecological corridors also carry out many functions, including: flood defences, carbon sequestration, filtering air to improves air quality, protection of soil through the prevention of soil erosion and landslides, etc.
- 8. **That Rewilding be central** to all schemes, funding streams and knowledge transfer programmes, with an understanding that Rewilding can take various forms, as stated below:
- 9. **Rewilding that is intentional,** where land is managed and planted for biodiversity, eg. planting of small pockets of woodlands, such as the approach being used by An Choill Bheag developed by LEAF Ireland in schools https://leafireland.org/themes/an-choill-bheag/. This should also include the planting working hazel coppices, planting willow coppices, etc.
- 10. **Rewilding that allows nature to do the work** must also be considered where parts of the farmland are allowed to become their own natural ecosystem, currently often

- labelled as 'scrub or wetlands, etc'. This is where areas are allowed to go through their natural succession, from brambles/gorse to self-seeded willow, birch, alder, etc. Or drains are removed or blocked to enable the lands to become a full wetland or fen. The value that these services must be fully understood and integrated in to farming training programmes.
- 11. **Support for farmers and landowners**: It makes absolutely no sense that farmers and landowners are currently being pushed to increase their herds and remove their hedgerows/scrub when this is completely the wrong direction to go in. There are many examples of other ways forward, proposed by groups such as Transition Farming and <u>Talamh Beo</u>. These organisations must be listened to if we are to really makes changes in the CAP system.





We welcome the opportunity to make a submission on farm payments under the next phase of the **Common Agricultural Policy (2023 - 2027)**. CAP is taxpayer money, consequently it is vital that everyone has an input into how the billions will be spent. It is essential that the billions of taxpayer money support our fragile ecology and biodiversity and we move away from subsidising environmentally devastating practices encouraged by CAP presently.

Firstly, we think it is widely understood that the system of direct payments that has applied in the past has very negatively impacted nature and wildlife around the country. The mechanism for this has been the system of incentives/penalties and GAEC (Good Agricultural and Environmental Condition) rules which incentivise farmers to farm every scrap of land (leading to ecologically destructive practices like bull-dozing ditches/hedgerows and draining bogs).

The decline of farmland wildlife in our countryside is well documented (e.g. National Report to the Convention on Biological Diversity, National Biodiversity Strategy etc ("pressures associated with agriculture have had major impacts on land-based habitats and species, with over 70% of the number of habitats of EU interest reported to be negatively impacted by agriculture....the breeding distributions of bird species that are associated with farmland, such as the Curlew, Lapwing and Yellowhammer have declined substantially over recent decades, with Curlew on the brink of extinction according to survey work in 2015 and 2016.")

The Dáil declared a Biodiversity Emergency in 2019 – in view of this, the language in the GAEC is monumentally out of touch (e.g "Is applicant failing to take appropriate measures to prevent the encroachment of invading hardwood species onto land? (Invading hardwood species included scrub, briars, gorse etc.)"

Given what we all know now about the Climate and Biodiversity emergency that our planet faces, there is an onus on anyone with influence to do what they can to improve the situation. We urge that the following be adopted:

Subsidy Payments - farmers to be given the option of rewilding, rather than farming, their land while continuing to receive farm subsidies at the same levels. This would require scrapping of the GAEC (Good Agricultural and Environmental Condition) as it currently stands. Payments under Pillar 1 should be allowed for land which is not farmed. Allowing a proportion of land to revert to meadow, scrub, woodland or wetland has carbon sink and biodiversity benefits.

Agri-environment Schemes - Research tells us (https://research.ie/assets/uploads/2018/05/NBER-FINAL-COPY.pdf) that Pillar 2 Agri-environment Schemes (REPS, AEOS, GLAS etc) intended to deliver biodiversity benefits have not delivered results. The vast majority of state spending under the heading of biodiversity flows through this channel and it is not acceptable that taxpayer money is spent without producing results. We urge that any payments under future schemes be (1) outcome-based with clear success metrics at farm level; (2) results are audited by people with ecological expertise.

Reference: Public Consultation on the Environmental Assessment of the Draft CAP Plan 2023 - 2027

Here are some observations on the proposed reduction in the average slaughter age of prime cattle for 27 months to 24 months.

In my opinion this proposal will have a hugely negative effect on the suckler herd in Ireland which has two key features, i.e. it is mainly concentrated in the West and North of the country on ground that is generally unsuitable for dairying and those involved are generally farming on small holdings in a more sustainable and environmentally friendly way.

The proposed reduction in slaughter age may be possible in some circumstances for breeds such as Herefords and Angus as they mature more quickly, but the offspring of most suckler herds i.e. Charolais, Limousin and Simmental take longer to finish and mature more slowly.

The push to lower the slaughter age of these breeds with have a few unintended consequences,

- Animals will have to be forced to an early maturity with huge quantities of meal ration, which in itself, will reduce the profitability of the enterprise.
- Destroying the image of naturally grass-fed cattle that beef farmers and Bord Bia has spent decades and millions promoting.
- Accelerating the recent decline in the suckler herd and a further shift to the dairy herd,
 which all acknowledge has been the main contributor to the rapid rise in all emissions,
 whether it be nitrates, methane or carbon. It makes no sense to suggest proposals which
 will further squeeze the suckler herd and encourage the switch to the dairy herd and its
 rapid expansion which is the real accelerator of the growth in all three main emissions.
- Putting in place a notional age limit for slaughter, plays further into the hands of beef
 processors. It should be noted that the existing two-tier pricing system of under/over 30
 months was initially introduced as part of a BSE mitigation measure, 25 years later it has
 no current scientific validity or requirement, it has been hijacked by the beef processors
 as a supply control (and pricing) measure. The same will happen if there is a further
 reduction in the target age for slaughter and the beef processors will take full advantage.

My own farming system is that I'm in the lucky position to farm in an extensive (some would call it "old fashioned") way.

These animals are kept permanently outdoors at a very low stocking rate (as evidenced by an organic nitrogen rate per hectare of 21 kg/ha in 2020.

No meal is fed to the animals and no fertilizer is put on the land, which is in permanent multi-species grass, full of native flora and fauna.

The introduction of a lower slaughter age for these continental cattle would not make my system sustainable and push a narrative towards a more "factory farm" intensive system and all the associated environmental side effects, thus destroying the image of naturally grass-fed cattle grazing in fields.

Finally, there is one obvious solution which would help achieve a reduction in methane, nitrate and carbon emissions without having to push for a reduction in the overall age of slaughtered cattle. It is my opinion that a cull of the male calves of the intensive dairy herds, mainly Holstein and Jersey Cross bull calves, should be considered. These bull calves are surplus to the dairy producer and are considered uneconomic to rear and very difficult to bring to maturity without huge concentrate supplement. The removal of a target percentage of these male dairy breed calves with the reduction in overall methane, carbon and nitrate emissions over there curtailed expected life. It must be noted that these male calves are essentially uneconomic to rare as demonstrated by various Teagasc trials and programmes.

It would make more sense economically and environmentally to give a payment of perhaps €100 to cull these male calves, than to give €100 to beef finishers to try to force an early slaughter of maturing continental cattle, the offspring of the national suckler herd.

Thank you for the opportunity to make the above observations in this submission and I can confidently say that by and large, the observations reflect the views of a large number of suckler and beef finishing farmers that I have spoken with over recent months.

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Prior to 2006 Farmers received SFP based on the milk and meat they supplied to Processors. This was the basis for calculation of the current BPS Scheme.In 2006

I believe that this issue should be addressed and that those Farmers who were forced to Lease due to the absence of Land Rental agreements should have their Payment restored to the amount they obtained on the land they farmed prior to Renting/Leasing.
