I write in relation to the LEADER Programme 2023-2027 and the cut to €180 million in the next CAP programme.

in and I am also a member of the LCDC / LAG committee which oversees the LEADER programme in the county.

I have seen the great benefits of the LEADER programme to the rural communities and businesses in my constituency of the Kells MD which is the most rural part of Meath and covers 36% of the geographical area of the county.

There are businesses and community facilities in rural areas which would not be in place today if it was not for the LEADER programme.

While it is pointed outed there is a still a €250m LEADER programme in place due to the government subsidy of €70m over two years until the new CAP programme commences however the issue is that this if over seven years rather and five years so on an annual basis it is a significant reduction the LEADER funding.

One of the concerns which I most have is regarding the application process and the large level of administration and time which community groups must put into the application. I am aware of several community groups and community activists who are now reluctant to go through the process again. However, one of the saving graces for these groups in recent years has been the support of the staff which oversee the programme in the county. They are invaluable support to groups and businesses when seeking LEADER funding. As part of this reduced budget for LEADER some of the staff which assist with the programme will no longer be able to remain in place as the funding will not be there to support their salaries.

This will further reduce the impact of the LEADER programme and its benefits.

In summary I am requesting that at the very least the LEADER programme be reinstated to its previous budget of €250m over five years. However, as we emerge from Covid and as rural businesses and communities innovate as agriculture and rural ways of life evolve in the changing economy, I believe we should at this point in time be increasing the budget further beyond the €250m.

Thank you for taking the time to consider this my submission and on behalf of my rural community I request LEADER funding be maintained and expanded further.



Listry Community Council clg has benefitted greatly from LEADER funding over many years for projects which have enhanced our rural community through the provision of facilities and infrastructure such as

Community Centre Community Astro Turf pitch Computers for courses for Rural Men and disadvantaged groups

Grants have also been received towards the maintenance and upkeep of our community facilities.

The LEADER budget for 2009-2013 was €425 million. This was reduced to €250 million for the period 2016-2020. This reduced budget was very noticeable and negatively impacted many rural communities and Community Councils such as Listry Community Council. Some development plans were scrapped or at best deferred.

Covid 19 has had a very serious impact on the fundraising capacity in most communities and many community, cultural and climate change projects will never materialise without the ongoing support of LEADER funding. Based on experiences of many LEADER funding applicants during the 2016-2020 we are very pessimistic about the success of applications during the 2023-2027 period give that the proposed budget for the period is €180 million. It is difficult enough to keep interest in Community Councils and for us active tangible projects attracts community involvement. Without projects many Community Councils will disappear to the detriment of rural and disadvantaged areas.

Liatris Community Council clg has enjoyed a very supportive relationship with South Kerry Development Partnership clg. Every effort was made by SKDP clg support workers to work productively with Community Councils to ensure a positive and beneficial outcome to LEADER Grant applications. Most communities in South Kerry will testify to this. Long may this productive cooperation continue but unfortunately given the proposed drastic cut to the 2023-2027 budget many projects will not materialize during this period. The second members of Listry Community Council clg call on Government to

I write as someone who runs a business in the rural area of Dublin, and who also acts as a marketing consultant and business adviser to businesses around Ireland in the rural area. In fact many businesses with whom I work, who are either non for profits, small rural businesses diversifying, and community/social enterprises have benefited from Leader in a very positive way over the years. I believe that I am well placed to have a very key personal view on this as follows: • I am Chair of the Rural Task Force in DLR. • I am outgoing President and director/board member of DLR Chamber which is the biggest
	 representative body in DLR My company has assisted many local businesses in getting Leader Funding which was and is invaluable from a capital and support perspective in driving their initiatives forward I am a travel and tourism expert and have that expertise outside of Ireland as well – I know what has been, and can be achieved by good use of Leader. So the fact that Leader Funding appears to be effectively reduced is simply not good enough.
	At a time where business has been decimated by Covid, rural businesses must diversify, and when our population is growing, and where we

can encourage support of rural businesses as we improve quality of life, sustain employment, and encourage diversification.
This is simply not good enough. And we must do more as Ireland, to ensure that Leader Funding is not reduced for the period of 2023 onwards.
My points are as follows:
 The budget for Leader for 2023-2027 has already been cut due to late implemention of previous Leader.
• A further cut of this budget to €180 million now proposed is simply not on. Effectively this is a 40% reduction, with a growing population. And at a key time. This is a huge proposed cut. And is not acceptable.
• I believe that we should be looking at around €400 million for The Leader Programme for the coming years, to work in rural Ireland, Rural Tourism, Rural Sustainability and Rural Employment in order to drive and sustain enterprise within our businesses and communities.
 We must have a sustainable budget for Ireland, driven by each local Development Company from this.
• The co-funding element must also be looked at. Under EU regulations up to 80% is permissible. Yet we are now looking at a proposed 56.72%. This shows no concept of what has gone on, last 2 years, and what is needed to grow our rural economy and kick-start it again.
Ireland must protect its share of Leader Funding. And we must have adequate funding, certainly up around the €400 million mark, to deliver a real difference over this crucial 2023- 2027 period.
