BYE-LAW.

BALLINA DISTRICT.

WE, the Inspectors of Irish Fisheries, acting under the authority of the above-named Acts, do make and ordain this Bye-Law, by which it is prohibited, and it is hereby prohibited, to capture Trout in the River Moy and its Tributaries, situated in the Counties of Sligo and Mayo, by means of Rods and Lines, during the Months of April and May in each year: Provided always that nothing herein contained shall be construed to affect Angling for Trout during said Months of April and May in any part of Loughs Conn and Cullin.

Any Person offending against this Bye-Law shall forfeit and pay for each offence a sum of Three Pounds, and every Rod, Line, or Hook, used in committing such offence shall be forfeited.
