BYE-LAW.

RIVER SHANNON.

WHEREAS, by a Bye-Law, bearing date the Fifth day of February, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-six, the use of Nets, of any kind whatsoever, was prohibited in that part of the River Shannon situated between Wellesley Bridge in the City of Limerick, and the Railway Bridge lately erected across the River Shannon, between the Townland of Monabraher on the West, and the Townland of Corbally, on the East side of the River Shannon :

Now, in pursuance of the powers and authorities in Us vested by the "Fisheries (Ireland) Act, 1869," We do hereby repeal and rescind the above recited Bye-Law, and the same is hereby repealed and rescinded accordingly.
