32 & 33 Vic., c. 92, and the Acts incorporated therewith.

No. 61, or Skibbereen District.

CLOSE SEASON.

WE, the Inspectors of Irish Fisheries, acting in execution of the Fisheries (Ireland) Act, 1869, and the Acts incorporated therewith, in pursuance of the powers and authorities in us vested in that behalf by said Acts, do hereby decide that the respective periods authorized and directed as the Close Time for Salmon and Trout in the District No. 61, defined and known as "The Skibbereen District," which extends from the Galley Head, to Mizen Head, in the County of Cork, and includes the whole of the Sea along the coast between these points, and around any islands or rocks situate off the same, with the whole of the Tideways along said Coast and Rivers, and the whole of the Tidal and Upper or Freshwater portions of the several Rivers and their Tributaries, flowing into the said Coast Letween said points, situated in the County of Cork, shall cease.

- 1. And We do hereby further decide that the Close Time, during which no Fish of the Salmon or Trout kind shall be fished for, killed, destroyed, or taken by any Person or by any means whatsoever (save by Single Rods and Lines as hereinafter provided) in or from the Sea, or in or from any Estuary, or on the Sea Coast, or in or from the Tideway of any River or Lake, or the part thereof where the Tide ebbs and flows, or in or from any part of any River or Lake above the Tideway or portion thereof where the Tide ebbs and flows, in the said Skibbereen District, shall be between the 1st day of October in each Year and the 30th day of April in the Year following, both the said Days inclusive.
- 2. And We do hereby further decide that the Close Time, during which no Fish of the Salmon or Trout kind shall be fished for, killed, destroyed, or taken by any Person by Single Rods and Lines in the said Skibbereen District, shall be between the 1st day of November in each Year and the 16th day of March in the Year following, both the said Days inclusive.
