32 & 33 Vic., c. 92, and the Acts incorporated therewith.

SKIBBEREEN DISTRICT.

ROURY RIVER,

County Cork.

WHEREAS, by the "Fisheries (Ireland) Act, 1869," it is amongst other things enacted that the Inspectors of Irish Fisheries shall make local and other inquiry into the expediency and necessity of altering, amending, or repealing any definition of the boundaries of the Mouth or Estuary of any River heretofore made; and, if on such inquiry they shall be satisfied of such expediency or necessity, it shall be lawful for them, subject to the approval of the Lord Lieutenant in Council, and an appeal to him in Council, to alter, amend, or repeal any such definition. And whereas the Special Commissioners of Irish Fisheries did, on the 25th day of April, 1865, make the definition of the boundaries of the Mouth of the RIVER ROURY, in the County of Count by a straight line drawn in a North-Easterly dir in from the Easternmost point at High-water Mark of Point and Spring Tides in the Townland of Ballinaclog Parish of Ross, Barony of East Car-BERY (West Division), and County of Cork, to a point on the opposite Shore in the Townland of Downeen, aforesaid Parish, Barony and County:

Now we, the pectors of Irish Fisheries, acting under the powers and the powers and chorities given to us by the said recited Act, having recal and other inquiry into the expediency of altering the Mouth of the said definition of the boundaries of the Mouth of the said Roury River, in the County repeal the said definition, and the same is hereby repealed accordingly.
