OYSTER FISHERIES.

32 & 33 Vic., c. 92, and the Acts incorporated therewith.

BYE-LAW.

WHEREAS, on the application of certain persons interested in the Oyster Fishery in Wexford Harbour, the Inspectors of Irish Fisheries did, on the Fourteenth day of August, 1873, call a Meeting of the persons possessed of, or interested in such Oyster Fishery, after giving Notice of such Meeting in the manner prescribed by the Statute in that case made and provided, and did at such Meeting hear and receive all such pertinent evidence as was offered to them on the subject of said Fishery, and did examine and enquire into the same on Oath. Now in pursuance of the powers and authorities vested in us in such case, we, the said Inspectors of Irish Fisheries, do hereby decide upon, fix, and appoint the term of Three Years from the date hereof, within which it shall not be lawful to dredge for, take, catch, or destroy any Oyster or Oyster Brood in the said Wexford Harbour, within or to the westward of a line drawn from Raven Point to Rosslare Point, all in the County of Wexford. And any person offending against this Bye-Law shall for each offence forfeit and pay a sum of Two Pounds.
