## BYE-LAW.

NO. 6<sup>1</sup>, OR SKIBBEREEN DISTRICT.

## RIVER ILEN, *County of Cork.*

WE, the Inspectors of Irish Fisheries, acting under the authority of the above-named Acts, do make and ordain this Bye-Law, by which it is permitted, and it is hereby permitted, to use Nets for the capture of Salmon or Trout with Meshes of one-and-a-quarter inches from knot to knot (to be measured along the side of the square, or five inches to be measured all round each such Mesh, such measurements being taken in the clear when the Net is wet), in the River Ilen, in the County of Cork.
