BYE-LAW.

CLEW BAY,

County Mayo.

WHEREAS by a Bye-Law bearing date the First day of April, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-five, it

"That for the sole purpose of replenishing and supply"ing Licensed Oyster Beds and other Oyster Beds, the
"exclusive property of any person or persons within Clew
"Bay alone, in the County of Mayo, and for no other pur"pose whatever, it may be lawful for any person to Dredge
"for and take Oysters from any natural Public Bed in
"the said Clew Bay, lying below the level of the lowest
"water of Spring Tides, between the First and Fifteenth
"April and the Twentieth June and First October in each
"year, such periods being respectively included within
"the Close Time at present fixed for the Oyster Fisheries
"within the said Clew Bay, &c., &c."

Now, We, the Inspectors of Irish Fisheries, in pursuance of the powers and authorities in us vested by the Fisheries (Ireland) Act, 1869, do hereby repeal and rescind the above recited Bye-Law, and the same is repealed and

rescinded accordingly.
