CLOSE SEASON.

WE, The Inspectors of Irish Fisheries, acting in execution of the Fisheries (Ireland) Act, 1869, and the Acts incorporated therewith, in pursuance of the powers and authorities in us vested in that behalf by said Acts, do hereby decide that the period authorized and directed as the Close Time during which it should not be lawful to capture Salmon and Trout, by means of Single Rods and Lines only, in the River Bann, in the District No. 15², heretofore defined and known as "The Coleraine District," which extends from the Sea Point of the Townland Boundary between the Townlands of Downhill and Drumagully, in the County of Londonderry, to the Point of Portrush, in the County of Antrim, and situated in the Counties of Antrim, Armagh, Tyrone, Monaghan, Londonderry, and Down, shall cease.

1. And we do hereby further decide that the Close Time during which it shall not be lawful to kill, destroy, or take Salmon or Trout, by means of Single Rods and Lines only, in the River Bann, in the said Coleraine District, shall be between the 1st November in each Year and the last day of February in the Year following, both said days inclusive.
