32 & 33 Vic., c. 92, and the Acts incorporated therewith.

No. 172, or DUNDALK DISTRICT.

CLOSE SEASON.

WE, the Inspectors of Irish Fisheries, acting in execution of the Fisheries (Ireland) Act, 1869, and the Acts incorporated therewith, in pursuance of the powers and authorities in Us vested in that behalf by said Acts, do hereby decide that the respective periods authorized and directed as the Close Time for Salmon and Trout with single Rods and Lines in the District No. 172, heretofore defined and known as "The Dundalk District," which "extends from Clogher Head, in the County of Louth, northwards, to Donaghadee, in the County of Down, and includes all that part of the Country the Waters of which flow into the Coast between those points," situated in the Counties of Louth, Monaghan, Down, Armagh, Meath, and Cavan, shall cease.

- 1. And We do hereby further decide that the Close Time, during which no Fish of the Salmon or Trout kind shall be killed, destroyed, or taken by any Person by single Rods and Lines in the said Dundalk District (save in the Annagassan and Glyde and Dee Rivers, and their Tributaries), shall be between the 12th day of October in each Year and the last day of February in the Year following, both the said days inclusive.
- 2. And We do hereby further decide that the Close Time during which no Fish of the Salmon or Trout kind shall be killed, destroyed, or taken by any Person by single Rods and Lines in or from any part of the Annagassan and Glyde and Dee Rivers, and their Tributaries, shall be between the 1st day of October in each Year and the last day of January in the Year following, both the said days inclusive.
