

Interfaith Service at the Remembrance Wall, Glasnevin Cemetery

3rd April, 2016

This service involved participation by all the main faith organisations where all those who died during the 1916 Rising – Irish Volunteers, Irish Citizen Army, British Army, Dublin Metropolitan Police, Royal Irish Constabulary, as well as civilians, including children, were remembered. The Taoiseach laid a wreath and local school children unveiled the Remembrance Wall where the names of all those who died are inscribed.

A Glasnevin Trust Initiative, the Necrology Wall was inspired by the compelling International Memorial of Notre Dame de Lorette in France. This “Ring of Remembrance”, was inaugurated by the leaders of France, the United Kingdom and Germany. It records in alphabetical order without any distinction of nationality, rank or religion the names of soldiers from all sides who lost their lives in the battlefields of Northern France during World War 1.
