BY-LAW.

By the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland.

The Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act 1899, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby make and ordain the following By-Law:—

The use of any Trawl Net is hereby prohibited during the months of January, February, June, July, August, September, October, November, and December, in Killeany Bay, Inishmore or North Arran Island, inside or landwards of a straight line running from Straw Island Lighthouse to Carrickfadda Point on the north western side of said Bay, and in all waters within the distance of one nautical mile from the said Carrickfadda Point.



In witness whereof the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland have hereunto set their official seal this Twenty-third day of June, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Thirteen.

NOTE (a).—By the By-Law dated 1st October, 1896, Trawling is prohibited during the months of March, April, and May in each year, in the above area.

NOTE (b). PENALTIES.—By the 9th Section of the 5th and 6th Victoria, Cap. 106, it is enacted that every person who shall use any Trawl Net at any season or any place when or where the use of the same shall have been prohibited by any By-Law, shall forfeit every such Net so used, and shall for every such offence also forfeit and pay any sum not exceeding £20.
