



Introduction

Food Vision 2030 is Ireland's stakeholder-led ten-year strategy for the agri-food industry. Its ambition is that Ireland will become a world leader in Sustainable Food Systems (SFS) over the next decade, sustainable economically, environmentally and socially.



Missions and Goals

Mission 1: A Climate Smart, Environmentally Sustainable Agri-Food Sector.

Goals: A climate-neutral food system by 2050, with verifiable progress achieved by 2030, encompassing emissions reductions, carbon sequestration, air, biodiversity and water quality.

Mission 2: Viable and Resilient Primary Producers with Enhanced Wellbeing. Goals: Competitive, productive primary producers with improved economic and social sustainability.

Mission 3: Food which is Safe, Nutritious and Appealing, Trusted and Valued at Home and Abroad.


Goals: Coherence of policies for food, health and nutrition; Enhancement of consumer trust through providing evidence of safe and ethical food production; Creation of value-add, through insight and innovation, supporting the food sector and continuing to develop market opportunities at home and abroad.

Mission 4: An Innovative, Competitive & Resilient Agri-Food Sector, Driven by Technology & Talent.

Goals: An innovation, knowledge and technology driven sector; with improved competitiveness and resilience along the food chain; and the attraction and nurturing of diverse talent.
