Notice of Intention to Designate Porcupine Shelf 002267 & Southern Canyons 002278 as Special Areas of Conservation

Dear Sir or Madam.

The European Union Habitats Directive (92/43/EEC) requires Member States to protect habitats and wildlife areas of European interest. The Directive was transposed into Irish law by the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations, 2011 (S.I. No. 477 of 2011). These Regulations enable the Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage to designate the most important nature conservation areas as Special Areas of Conservation (SACs) and to afford them legal protection. The Minister will shortly publish a proposal to designate the above-mentioned sites as Special Areas of Conservation. Details of these proposals will be published in the National press and broadcast on National radio.

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Southern Canyons (Site code: 002278)

as a Special Area of Conservation

(1). Location of the Southern Canyons candidate SAC (cSAC)

The Southern Canyons cSAC lies approximately 280 kilometre due south of Counties Kerry and Cork.

(2). Why the Southern Canyons is of special scientific interest

This large site contains a series of branched canyon systems, characterised by extensive areas of hard ground, interspersed with soft sediment. Multi-beam echo-sounder data has revealed the terrain features of the canyons at the target site, in exceptional detail. The recorded fauna is highly diverse, particularly amongst the dead coral framework, and contains a wide range of deep-water species. This site contains the Whittard Canyon system which has been described as comparable in scale and drama to the Grand Canyon in the USA.

The site is a candidate Special Area of Conservation (cSAC) selected for the following habitat listed on Annex I of the E.U. Habitats Directive (numbers in brackets are Natura 2000 codes):

[1170] Reefs

An extensive offshore survey of this site was completed in 2019 using the RV Celtic Explorer and the Holland I ROV. This survey was completed by a team of internationally recognised deep sea ecologists. A total of 50 dives were completed during this leg of the survey. The canyon systems cutting into the continental shelf were formed by sediment erosion events that scoured deep canyons with flanking escarpments. The thalwegs of these canyons exit thousands of meters deep into the abyssal plains below. The SAC boundaries have been designed to encompass this unique habitat, which is exceptional in a European context.

The ecology of the Southern Canyons is complex. There are areas of hard rocky substrate and areas of muddy or sandy sediment. Along the top of the canyon systems, sediment is the dominant substrate. In the canyons, depending on slope, it grades away to bedrock. Bottom currents also play a strong role in the type of fauna observed. Marine snow flushes through the canyons providing a rich food resource for various invertebrates and vertebrates.





This material forms from degradation and flocculation of phytoplankton and excreta in the productive shelf waters. In areas where muddy sediments dominate, there was evidence of pteropod mollusc burrows and occasional emergent sea fans (*Distichoptilum*) and soft corals (*Anthomastus*). An extensive field of sea pens, including *Pennatula* sp. and *Kophobelemnon* sp., interspersed with bamboo coral *Acanella* (both fir tree and bush-like forms) also occurs. In coarse sand, which can form quite prominent sand ridge features due to the action of bottom currents, the fauna include *Swiftia*, *Desmophyllum*, large barnacles, sea pens, and ophiuroids. Where there was sufficient anchoring, fauna consists of clumps of live *Desmophyllum* and occasionally *Madrepora*. Octocorals or soft corals included a lot of clavulariids and *Acanthogorgia*. The echinoid *Cidaris* is abundant over sand with some prominent anemones and occasional errant hermit crabs and galatheid crabs. The numerous fish species include elasmobranchs, grenadiers, orange roughy and eels.

(3). Safeguarding Special Areas of Conservation

In order to protect ecologically important sites, certain potentially harmful works are restricted within SAC's. - (a) has or is entitled to an interest in or over the area comprising the site or
- (b) has or is entitled to an interest in or over an area outside the site whose interest may potentially be affected by the Direction.

STAGE ONE - INTERNAL REVIEW

The appellant will be informed of the outcome of the internal review and will be given the option of having their objection referred to the Designated Areas Appeals Advisory Board. The Board is comprised of an independent chairperson and equal representation of marine users' groups and conservationists. In deciding Stage Two objections, the Minister will be advised by this Board.

The Board must confine itself to consideration of the scientific arguments only relating to the specific area. In this regard, a scientific report from a suitably qualified expert is required. Some grant assistance is available towards an appellant's costs for the expert engaged in the production of a scientific report. A list which details some independent experts who can provide assistance in drawing up the scientific evidence on which it is intended to base the appeal will be provided. An appellant is free to engage the services of an expert other than those listed on the panel.

(5). Objecting to the Direction relating to Activities Requiring Consent (ARCs)

Persons with an interest in the cSAC may also separately object to any of the Activities Requiring Consent (ARCs) included in the Direction made by the Minister. Any objections must be in writing and sent to the same address or email as above.

An objection may only be considered on the basis that the activity either individually or in combination with other activities, plans or projects, will not have a significant effect on, or adversely affect the integrity of the cSAC or will not lead to the deterioration of natural habitats or the habitats of species for which the site is designated. Any objections must be lodged within three months of the date of this notification; therefore, the final date for receipt of an objection is 17 February 2023.

(6). Making a claim for compensation

In accordance with Regulation 41 of the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011 (S.I. No. 477 of 2011), marine users may be eligible to compensation of an amount equal to the loss suffered by them by the depreciation of an interest in the marine area in which they have an interest arising from a decision by the Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage to refuse consent to carry out an activity under Regulation 30. Applications for compensation can only be considered where an application for such consent has been refused by the Minister and a decision has resulted in the discontinuance or curtailment of a use to which the land had been lawfully put in the period of five years immediately preceding the refusal of consent by the Minister.



NOTICE OF INTENTION TO DESIGNATE

Porcupine Shelf (Site code: 002267)

as a Special Area of Conservation

(1). Location of the Porcupine Shelf candidate SAC (cSAC)

Porcupine Shelf cSAC overlays the continental shelf margin extending from an area approximately due west of Clew Bay, Co Mayo, northwards, to a line extending west from Malin Head, Co Donegal.

(2). Why the Porcupine Shelf is of special scientific interest

The site is approximately 340 kilometres long and about 50 kilometres wide. Almost the entirety of this site is deeper than 400 m and extends down to in excess of 2500 m. This site is contiguous with the North West Porcupine Bank SAC 2330.

The site is a candidate Special Area of Conservation (cSAC) selected for the following habitat listed on Annex I of the E.U. Habitats Directive (numbers in brackets are Natura 2000 codes):

[1170] Reefs

An extensive offshore survey of this site was completed in 2017 using the ILV Granuaile and the Holland I ROV. This survey was completed by a team of internationally recognised deep sea ecologists. A total of 50 dives were completed during this leg of the survey. The survey identified biologically sensitive Annex I reef-forming, cold-water coral species (Desmophyllum pertusum [syn. Lophelia pertusa] and Madrepora oculata) at numerous locations. Vulnerable marine ecosystems were recorded on almost every dive. This site also recorded a third species of cold-water coral, Solenosmilia variabilis, forming reefs at depths previously unrecorded (>1600 m).

The ecology of the Porcupine Shelf is dependent on the substrate, like all benthic environments. The shelf is incised by a large number of canyons with extensive coral gardens on cobbles and boulders, and on pinnacles and cliffs. There is high heterogeneity from the southern to the northern portion, with exceptionally large areas of high quality reef habitat all along its length. Areas of boulders host bamboo corals including *Acanella*, the black corals *Leiopathes* sp., *Stauropathes* sp. *Bathypathes* sp. and *Parantipathes* sp., and the gorgonian coral *Paramuricea*, along with very large sponge specimens. Brisingids (mobile and stalked crinoid echinoderms), hydrozoans, cup corals, the soft coral *Pseudoanthomastus* and



hormathid anemones are present sporadically. Some of the less conspicuous fauna include shrimp, hermit crabs, glass sponges including *Aphrocallistes* and encrusting sponges. Soft sediments have evident xenophyophores, black corals including *Bathypathes*, sea pens (*Umbellula* sp. and *Anthoptilium* sp.), and sponges. In boulder areas, a wide diversity of species has been found to occur, including ophiuroids, hormanthid anemones, the soft coral *Anthomastus* sp., hydroids, pycnogonids, *Galatheid* crabs and echinoids. The very distinctive pigtail coral, *Radicipes c.f. gracilis* was also recorded. Sheer and cliff faces are colonised by hydroid coral *Stylasteridae* sp., encrusting sponges and serpulid worms and patches of *Desmophyllum* coral. Large numbers of orange roughy, grenadiers and sharks, including many juveniles, were observed here. The upper slopes of mounds host many juvenile *Synaphobranchus kaupii* eels and *Apristus* sp. sharks and may be an important nursery ground for these species.


