1 Introduction

The Minister of State for the Circular Economy, Ossian Smyth, T.D. is introducing an environmental levy on single-use disposable cups for hot beverages to incentivise people to choose to re-use and to help reduce single-use waste.

In order to provide an opportunity for all interested parties to make their views on this matter known, the Minister launched a public consultation process¹ on the draft regulations and sought views from all stakeholders. The consultation comprised three strands:

Public consultation

This strand of the consultation was targeted at members of the public and consumers of takeaway beverages. Submissions in relation to this Strand were received anonymously through an online survey.

Retailer consultation

This strand of the consultation was targeted at businesses or traders who will be required to implement the regulations. This includes cafes, retailers or other traders who sell takeaway drinks. Submissions in relation to this Strand were received anonymously through an online survey.

Other stakeholder engagement

This strand of the consultation was targeted at all other stakeholders. This includes any individual or entity not covered under Strands 1 or 2, businesses operating in the cup manufacturing, distribution or related industries, public sector bodies, NGO's, business and citizen representative bodies and all other interested parties. Submissions in relation to this Strand were received in writing by email or by post.

The consultation process ran for 6 weeks from 14th October to 25th November 2022.

The purpose of this paper is to provide summary details on the level of responses received. The Department will now consider all responses received and will publish a full consultation report on its website in due course, along with copies of all written submissions received. All personal data will be redacted prior to publishing.
